SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT AND LEGISLATIVE UPDATE 7D. Dr. Lynch reported that the administration is still waiting to see what the state does in terms of the budget. The staff is working right now to close out the past year and get ready for 2005-06.

Dr. Lynch thanked everyone on the staff and board for their hard work and support for what has been a difficult time in dealing with the budget.

UPDATE/CAHSEE 7E.

Mrs. Bulkin reported on the outstanding results on the CAHSEE exam for the district. One of the criteria for graduation is for a student to pass the California High School Exit Exam in English Language Arts and Math.

Congratulations are in order for the district's 10th grade students as they received a passing rate of 94.5%. Grade 10 English Language Learners scored a 28% in English Lanugage Art and a 45% passing rate in Math. Redesignated Fluent English Proficient 10th graders received an 89% passing rate in Engligh Language Arts and a 94% in Math. The 10th grade Initially Fluent English Proficient received a 95% in English Language Arts and a 96% in Math. Special Education 10th grader's passing rates were 74% in English Language Arts and 75% in Math.

All students who received a non-passing score will be counseled and enrolled in an English Language Arts and/or Math CAHSEE support course and will take the test again in September, 2005.

Two subgroups that remain at risk that the administration will continue to monitor are EL and Special Education students. In August the district will receive the 2006 retake

results. The administration will immediately identify the non-passing students and give intensive academic support to those seniors next year.

Mrs. Bulkin wanted to thank the Board and the administration for their terrific support for the CAHSEE testing process.

UPDATE/SUMMER SCHOOL 7F.

Mr. Albert Martin, Director of Instructional Support, reported that summer school starts tomorrow. In the north end of the district, summer school will be at La Costa Canyon High School and Oak Crest Middle School. In the south end, it will be at Torrey Pines High School and Earl Warren Middle School. In the north end, there are 1,220 students enrolled and 825 enrolled in the south end of the district. There are 87 summer school teachers, 75% of which are our regular contract teachers in the district.

Classes offered for acceleration are Health, World History, P.E., Art and ESL. Classes offered for remediation are English, Math, Social Sciences, Science. Mr. Martin reported on the incoming Bridge program for 7th graders for math, which is offered at Earl Warren and Oak Crest. There are 60 students participating in this program.

DISCUSSION AGENDA/ACTION ITEMS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED 2005-06 ANNUAL BUDGET / GENERAL FUND AND SPECIAL FUNDS 21. Dr. Lynch reported that Mr. Hall will provide the Trustees with an overview of the budget. After the overview, the Board will discuss the layoff of classified employees and act on that prior to adopting the budget. The administration has faced the challenge all year regarding the budget. The state of California is supposed to have adopted a budget by this time and it hasn't.

Mr. Hall reported that it has been a very challenging six months for the staff. The staff was optimistic that the Governor's May Revise would be good for schools but it wasn't.

Mr. Hall reported that there are four sections to the agenda back-up: (1) the executive summary, (2) Power Point presentation, (3) Budget assumptions for the 2005-06 budget, and (4) the budget.

Mr. Hall reviewed the General Fund Revenue and Expenditures for the 2005-06 proposed budget. The expenditures over income for this budget are (\$6,453,842). The estimated beginning balance for 7/1/05 is \$11,072,556 and the projected ending balance for 6/30/05 is \$4,618,714.

Mr. Hall reviewed the reasons for the budget squeeze which include state budget cuts, low enrollment growth, the opening of Canyon Crest Academy, and salary costs.

Mr. Hall reviewed assumptions that were used in the preparation of the proposed budget for the income and

expenditure side of the budget. He also shared information showing that San Dieguito is very low in equalization funding, third lowest in the state, and the lowest funded in the County. Mr. Hall reported that certificated staffing adjustments have been made by using the classroom staffing at 2nd semester enrollment, Special Ed. staffing at capacity, 7th period math eliminated and staffing reductions which has amounted to a savings of \$1.9 million. Classified staffing adjustments have been made by transfers, layoffs and vacancies in the amount of \$1.5 million. Site budgets are being reduced by 25% for a savings of \$311,000. Encroachments from Special Education, transportation and routine restricted maintenance are estimated at \$5.3 million.

Expenditure budget assumptions include the STRS shift to school districts which for San Dieguito would be \$900,000. Mr. Hall stated that employee health benefits will increase by \$315,000.

The total amount of expenditure reductions amount to \$5.2 million, which still leaves a deficit of \$6 million.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION/ LAYOFF OF CLASSIFIED POSITIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2005-2006 20. Dr. Lynch commented that this entire budget process has been an extremely long and difficult process. The staff has been in negotiations with CSEA to negotiate the effects of layoffs and what this means. The administration has tried very hard to soften as many impacts as possible knowing that that is not completely possible, and has tried to focus on a reduction of workload to determine where the reductions would be made.

The leadership team and the principals have been tremendously cooperative and have helped to determine ways to see how the district can make it through this process and ways that would least impact people.

The process from here is that once action is taken, a letter goes to those people who will be laid off. The positions that have been recommended for layoff have been talked to and provided opportunities to look at other positions that are available in the district.

Mrs. Terry King stated that the managers have looked at all areas of operation and determined where we can reduce the level of service and reduce the amount of work that can be done.

By the time transfers are completed and a number of transfers have been made to positions that were vacant, the staff thinks that the number of people who will be without jobs would be about ten. Even those could take other positions that we have within the district if they choose to. They will have full lay-off rights. As soon as there is an opening in their area, they are immediately rehired and they have the opportunity to turn down that offer twice before they are taken off of the lay-off list. Mrs. King felt that they can probably find positions for almost everyone by the time they are done.

Motion by Mrs. Hergesheimer, second by Mrs. Friedman, to adopt the Resolution/Layoff of Classified Positions for fiscal year 2005-2006, effective June 24, 2005.

Ann Bush, Ellen Moeller, Adelle Uhlmeyer, Aurora Uhlmeyer, and David Uhlmeyer spoke to the Board regarding the layoff of classified positions at Sunset High School.

Mrs. Friedman requested information on student/teacher ratio at Sunset. Mrs. King explained that the ratio for most of the district schools of about 34/1. Historically, the administration has tried to keep the ratio at Sunset at 20 to 24/1. The highest enrollment for Sunset was 180 to 190. The overall enrollment at Sunset has declined over the last couple of years due to the Plato Lab at La Costa Canyon; it has dropped to about an average of 145. The student/ teacher ratio will be approximately 20/1 at Sunset next year. Sunset will have seven teachers and they are anticipating 140 students. If enrollment at Sunset should increase during the year, the administration would recommend increasing the staffing accordingly.

Mrs. Rich asked if the other aides in the district were funded through the general fund. Mrs. King stated that all other instructional assistants are funded through Special Ed., Title I, TIIG, and other special funding.

Mrs. Hergesheimer requested information about a statement made during the public comments dealing with the student groups at Sunset being staffed by the aides. Mrs. King reported that teachers and counselors staff the groups and will continue to do so.

Mrs. Dalessandro requested information on the Fresh Start program. Mrs. Cooper-Francisco reported that this is still a concept and that one of the places considered for housing the program is Sunset; however it could be housed at another site. The site has not been determined. If the Fresh Start program is housed at Sunset, staff will go with the program. They would not want to burden another school without the staffing with it.

Mrs. Rich stated that the problem is that we still have a \$6 million deficit even after all of this and it's only going to be more painful next year.

There was a discussion regarding equalization funding stating that we are the lowest in the state of California. The figure that the Governor uses for funding of school districts is \$10,000; San Dieguito is almost half of that amount and also we are \$1,100 below the top school per student.

We only survived because we had a cumulative reserve and we have eaten into our reserves. Dr. Lynch again thanked the staff for their exceptional effort they have put forth to bring a budget to the Trustees that can be legally adopted.

President Groth opened the public hearing at 5:34 p.m. There being no speakers, the public hearing was closed at 5:35 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Attached is the annual Agreement for Participation between the County Superintendent of Schools and the District for operation of the Regional Occupational Program courses and services to be offered in 2005-06. The program is open to district students, other students from across the county, and to adults in the community. Classes are offered both during school and in the evening.

There is a figure of \$60,000 budgeted for capital reserve. This represents a planned capital expenditure that allows the District to carry over dollars in excess of what is normally allowed by the County. The plan for this money, which needs Board approval, is as follows: SDA Auto Shop Lab - \$25,000.00; SDA Welding \$9,000.00; Wireless laptops \$26,000.00.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board approve the 2005-06 Agreement for Participation between the County Superintendent of Schools and the District for operation of the Regional Occupational Program courses and services to be offered in the 2005-06 school year, allow a capital budget reserve of \$60,000.00 to be expended as shown in the attachment, and authorize Peggy Lynch to sign all pertinent documents.

AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATION SAN DIEGO COUNTY REGIONAL OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM (ROP)

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this	day of	2005, by and between	the San
Diego County Superintendent of Schools, her	reinafter called the S	UPERINTENDENT and Sar	ı Dieguite
Union High School District, hereinafter called	d the DISTRICT for	a term from July 1, 2005 to	June 30,
2006.			

RECITAL

- A. Pursuant to Education Code Section 52300 and following, the SUPERINTENDENT has established and is maintaining a Regional Occupational Program within San Diego County for high school students, out-of-school youth and adults; and, pursuant to Education Code Section 52321, the SUPERINTENDENT is authorized to receive state apportionment revenue for ROP ADA: and,
- B. The SUPERINTENDENT pursuant to Education Code Section 52301, wishes to contract with the DISTRICT for operation of certain ROP activities; and,
- C. The SUPERINTENDENT maintains the ROP and consults with Superintendents of participating DISTRICTS concerning issues of mutual concern.
- D. WHEREAS, the DISTRICT wishes to participate in and cooperate with the SUPERINTENDENT in establishing and maintaining Regional Occupational Program activities; NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

Now therefore, the parties agree as follows:

A. The DISTRICT shall:

- 1. Administer, supervise, and conduct the courses and/or services as specified in Addendum A and in supporting course proposal documentation submitted by DISTRICT.
- 2. Pursuant to Education Code Section 52314, allow residents of San Diego County eligible to attend a high school or adult school to apply for admission to any ROP course.
- 3. With assistance of the SUPERINTENDENT, recruit and enroll students and maintain attendance as specified for each program/course in Addendum A.
- 4. Provide properly credentialed and qualified employees with payment for services to be based on district-established salary and benefit plans.
- 5. Provide the necessary facilities, equipment, instructional supplies, and services--including purchasing, utilities, custodial, and maintenance for each course and/or service at no cost to the SUPERINTENDENT unless provided for in Addendum A.
- 6. Provide instruction in job-seeking and job-keeping skills to every ROP student per the ROP Expected Student Learning Results adopted by the ROP Steering Committee.

- 7. Provide general safety instruction and instruction in the safe operation of equipment and safe handling of supplies and hazardous materials to every ROP student.
- 8. Certify through the execution of this agreement that the activities included within this agreement will not supplant the total current program of vocational education within the DISTRICT.
- 9. Submit reports and data as requested by the SUPERINTENDENT and the State Department of Education.
- 10. Provide liability insurance or self-insurance coverage for all courses and/or services as specified in Addendum A, including all equipment and vehicles owned by the SUPERINTENDENT which are used by the DISTRICT in maintaining ROP courses and services.

Provide workers' compensation insurance or self-insurance coverage for DISTRICT Employees supporting ROP courses and services as specified in Addendum A.

Provide to the SUPERINTENDENT certificates of insurance and/or self insurance covering liability and workers' compensation.

NOTE:

The San Diego County and Imperial County Schools Risk Management Joint Powers Authority (JPA) workers' compensation program extends to all ROP employees (not to DISTRICT employees) and to ROP students while students are performing off-campus work experience. The ROP's workers' compensation coverage <u>does not apply</u> to the district's classroom instructors (unless these employees qualify under their respective district's workers' compensation program) or to any student who does not otherwise qualify as an ROP student performing off-campus work experience.

The school district is responsible for workers' compensation and liability coverage for their employees. Such coverage should extend to activities occurring on school district premises or activities under the school district employees' direct control or supervision.

- 11. Provide instruction to every student as per ROP course of study approved by the SUPERINTENDENT and the State Department of Education.
- 12. Comply with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 which provides that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity hereunder.
- 13. Comply with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act which provides that no otherwise qualified disabled individual in the United Sates shall, solely by reason of the disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefit of, denied access to, or be subjected to discrimination for any programs, activity receiving federal financial assistance.

- 14. Provide assurance that facilities provided hereunder are accessible by handicapped persons or provide access to a similar alternative program.
- 15. Provide for all ROP teachers (full and part time) to be evaluated annually or biannually according to DISTRICT policy and procedures.

B. The SUPERINTENDENT shall:

- 1. Provide for the overall administration and operation of the ROP.
- 2. Pay to the DISTRICT an amount equal to the actual costs incurred by the DISTRICT in providing ROP courses and services, plus interprogram (indirect) charges, not to exceed 8% of instructional program costs, specified in Addendum A. Such payment to the DISTRICT shall be made according to General Provisions, Item 9. The DISTRICT shall not charge indirect expenses to capital expenditures in object codes 4400, 6000—64000 and object code 5600 items which for ROP reporting is restricted to leases and rents of equipment and facilities. The DISTRICT shall not charge indirect expenses to administrative services, identified on Addendum A, as direct administration, counseling and guidance and service center. Should courses generate less ADA than specified in Addendum A, reimbursement by the SUPERINTENDENT may be adjusted accordingly.
- 3. Provide appropriate inventory forms and tags for all capital property purchased by the DISTRICT with ROP funds.

C. General Provisions:

- 1. Addendum A is attached as a part of this agreement.
- 2. The DISTRICT may transfer funds within line items in budget categories 1000 through 6000 in an approved Addendum A program budget without prior approval of the SUPERINTENDENT.
 - The DISTRICT may increase an approved Addendum A program budget by a maximum of 20 percent by transferring funds from other program budgets and applying that increase to line items in budget categories 1000 through 6000 without prior approval of the SUPERINTENDENT. Increases in a program budget in excess of 20 percent must be approved in writing by the SUPERINTENDENT. The total budget in Addendum A may not increase without authorization from the SUPERINTENDENT.
- 3. In accordance with Education Code Section 1605, the SUPERINTENDENT holds title to all property acquired with ROP funds and has responsibility for approval of location and utilization thereof.
- 4. Use of equipment and/or facilities acquired by the DISTRICT with ROP funds is limited to ROP courses and services unless use for other purposes with specific conditions is authorized in writing by the SUPERINTENDENT
- 5. Tobacco-Free Facility: The county is a tobacco-free facility. Tobacco use (smoked or smokeless) is prohibited at all times on all areas of County Office Property.

- 6. Any of the courses or services specified in Addendum A may be terminated at any time upon mutual consent and may be terminated by the SUPERINTENDENT after consultation with the DISTRICT within three weeks following the opening session of the course if the attendance is below that necessary to provide at least 90 percent of the estimated ADA as specified in Addendum A. Should a course be terminated, the DISTRICT shall be reimbursed for actual cost of operating the course to date of termination. All of the remaining funds in Addendum A for each terminated course or service at date of termination shall be available for transfer to other courses or services without the approval of the SUPERINTENDENT subject to the limitations in item #2 above.
- Any agreement between the DISTRICT and other agencies entered into for the purpose of conducting any course or service specified in Addendum A must be approved in advance by the SUPERINTENDENT.
- 8. All funds derived from the sale of goods or services from an ROP course or service shall be abated to the ROP course or service.
- 9. Reimbursement to the DISTRICT for operating and capital expenditures as specified in Addendum A will be made in the following manner:

a. Advance Apportionments

The advance apportionment system is designed to reflect the actual cash disbursement practices of the ROP operation and minimize any harm or benefit to the DISTRICT's General Fund Programs. Throughout the fiscal year, regular monthly apportionments of ROP funds received by the SUPERINTENDENT shall be made to the DISTRICT. Apportionments consist of all sources of ROP revenue (including lottery funds) and will normally be paid within three working days of receipt from the State. For ROP ADA-apportioned revenue, the approximate monthly percentage of total apportionment received and disbursed per month is:

For ROP lottery revenue, apportionments are received quarterly, approximately 3.5 months after each fiscal year quarter.

b. Apportionment Adjustment

Apportionment adjustments due to starting balance considerations, excess growth ADA revenue, state apportionment modifications, etc., will normally be made by the SUPERINTENDENT in December. If additional adjustments are necessary, they will be made in the May/June period.

c. Audit Documents Required

The DISTRICT shall furnish by September 15 for the previous fiscal year the below-listed documents required for audit purposes:

- Certification of final expenditures for each approved Addendum A program/service/facility budget on the form provided by the SUPERINTENDENT.
 In addition, DISTRICT is to provide a copy of the final summary accounting record (DISTRICT Financial Accounting System) of expenditures for the individual program/courses organized per the California School Accounting Manual.
- 2. Invoices and Capital Property Inventory Record (Form 19) for each item of capital equipment purchased.
- 3. A copy of the DISTRICT Annual Financial Report (J-200).

Should the DISTRICT fail to comply with submitting audit documents required, current fiscal year monthly apportionments will be withheld by the SUPERINTENDENT until compliance is attained.

4. End of Year Balance Funds

All end of year balance funds exceeding 15% of the fiscal year expenditures will be returned to the SUPERINTENDENT, except where the DISTRICT notifies the Superintendent by June 1, of the fiscal year it intends to carryover an amount in excess of 15% for the purpose of future capital expenditures for facilities and/or equipment. The DISTRICT will provide for designation of special reserves in accordance with Education Code Sections 4280 through 4283 inclusive.

DISTRICTS must ensure that ROP Funds are included in the total of their district board adoptions for designated reserves if those funds exceed 15% of fiscal year expenditures. Failure to include these funds could expose the district to a loss of those funds through recapture provisions in the education code.

10. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions of the agreement, if at any time during the term of this agreement the state of California fails to appropriate or allocate anticipated funds to the SUPERINTENDENT for Regional Occupational Program for payments stipulated in Addendum A, the SUPERINTENDENT reserves the right to change the budget amounts in Addendum A at any time with 30 days notice to the DISTRICT.

If the DISTRICT is unable to continue current course offerings or to maintain program support levels because of this reduced funding, the DISTRICT, in its sole discretion, may terminate in all or in part course offerings and/or support services necessary to accommodate the reduced funding level.

11. Any of the courses specified in Addendum A may be terminated by the SUPERINTENDENT if the State of California fails to provide course approval.

SUBJECT: ADOPTION OF RESOLUTIONS

ESTABLISHING SPECIAL TAXES FOR

2005-2006 FISCAL YEAR

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Board of Trustees has adopted ordinances authorizing the levy of a special tax within Community Facilities District 94-2, Community Facilities District 94-3, Community Facilities District 99-1, Community Facilities District 99-2, Community Facilities District 99-3, and Community Facilities District 03-1. These ordinances were adopted pursuant to the Rate and Method of Apportionment of Special Taxes approved in the elections. The Rate and Method of Apportionment of Special Taxes also require the Board to determine the amount for the alternate prepayment to be collected each year. The Lee Saylor Cost of Construction Index can increase this rate for all CFD's except for CFD 99-2 and CFD 99-3 for which the Engineering News-Record Building Cost Index is used.

The 2005-2006 prepayment amounts have been established as follows:

- CFD 94-2 \$4,955.00 for a single family home and \$1,350.00 for a multifamily home.
- CFD 94-3 \$7,245.99 for a single family home and \$1,974.18 for a multifamily home.
- CFD 95-2 \$6,999.68 for a single family home and \$1,907.08 for a multifamily home.

- CFD 99-1 \$7,207.95 for a single family home and \$1,946.90 for a multifamily home.
- CFD 99-2 One-Time Special Tax of \$.90 per square foot of assessable space for residential homes and \$.20 per square foot of assessable space for commercial buildings located in the Encinitas School District and \$.12 per square foot of assessable space for commercial buildings located in the Rancho Santa Fe School District.
- CFD 99-3 One-Time Special Tax of \$.90 per square foot of assessable space for residential homes and \$.20 per square foot of assessable space for commercial buildings.
- CFD 03-1 \$8,548.66 for a Tax Class A single family home, \$2,309.73 for a Tax Class A multi-family home, \$7,207.95 for a Tax Class B single family home, and \$1,946.90 for a Tax Class B multi-family home.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolutions establishing Special Taxes Within Community Facilities District No.'s 94-2, 94-3, 95-2, 99-1, 99-2, 99-3, and 03-1, which increases the Alternate Prepayment Tax for single family, multi-family units, and commercial buildings per Lee Saylor Cost of Construction Index or Engineering News-Record Building Cost Index.

WHEREAS, the Resolution authorized the levy of a special tax on property lying within the District, authorized the issuance of bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$50,000,000 and called an election;

WHEREAS, on November 3, 1994, an election (the "Election") was held within the District in which the eligible electors approved by more than two-thirds of the votes cast the propositions of levying a special tax on property within the District, incurring indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$50,000,000 and establishing an appropriations limit;

WHEREAS, on December 5, 1994, the Board of Trustees adopted an ordinance entitled, "Ordinance of the Board of Trustees of the San Dieguito Union High School District Authorizing the Levy of a Special Tax Within Community Facilities District No. 94-2" (the "Ordinance") authorizing the levy of a special tax within the District pursuant to the rate and method of apportionment of special taxes approved in the Election (the "Rate and Method") which is set forth in Exhibit A attached to the Ordinance (terms used but not defined herein have the meaning provided in the Rate and Method);

WHEREAS, the Ordinance authorized the Board of Trustees to provide, by resolution, for the levy of the special tax in accordance with the Rate and Method;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Rate and Method, within five (5) business days from the time of issuance of the initial building permit with respect to any Assessor's Parcel, the owner of such Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property may elect to prepay fifty percent of the aggregate Maximum Special Tax obligation attributable to the Assessor's Parcel:

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> In accordance with the Rate and Method, the Board of Trustees hereby establishes \$4,955.00 as the Alternate Prepayment Tax for Single-Family units and \$1,350.00 for Multi-Family units with respect to Developed Property for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

Section 2. The Alternate Prepayment Tax with respect to any Assessor's Parcel shall be collected by the District within five (5) business days from the time of issuance of the initial building permit of such Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property in accordance with Section VII of the Rate and Method and Section 5 of the Ordinance.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Board of Trustees hereby ratifies any action taken prior to adoption of this resolution to collect the Alternate Prepayment Taxes with respect to Developed Property for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution shall take effect immediately on the date of final passage.

Section 1. In accordance with the Rate and Method, the Board of Trustees hereby establishes \$0.90 per square foot of assessable space for parcels of residential property and \$0.12 per square foot of chargeable covered and enclosed space for assessor's parcels of commercial property located within the boundaries of Rancho Santa Fe USD, or \$0.20 per square foot of chargeable covered and enclosed space for assessor's parcels of commercial property located within the boundaries of Encinitas USD as the One-Time Special Tax for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

Section 2. The One-Time Special Tax with respect to any Assessor's Parcel shall be collected by the District at or prior to the issuance of a building permit of such Assessor's Parcel in accordance with Section C of the Rate and Method and Section C of the Ordinance.

Section 3. The Board of Trustees hereby ratifies any action taken prior to adoption of this resolution to collect the One-Time Special Tax with respect to Developed Property for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

WHEREAS, the Ordinance authorized the Board of Trustees to provide, by resolution, for the levy of the special tax in accordance with the Rate and Method; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Rate and Method, at or prior to the issuance of a building permit for an Assessor's Parcel of Residential Property, the owner of such property may elect to exempt his property from the Annual Special Tax by paying the

One-Time Special Tax then applicable to such Assessor's Parcel and upon payment of such One-Time Special Tax, such Assessor's Parcel of Residential Property shall thereafter be treated as Exempt Property. If an owner of an Assessor's Parcel of Residential Property does not elect to pay the One-Time Special Tax, then that Assessor's Parcel f Residential Property shall be subject to Annual Special Taxes and shall not be subject to the One-Time Special Tax.

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In accordance with the Rate and Method, the Board of Trustees hereby establishes \$0.90 per square foot of Assessable Space for Assessor's Parcels of Residential Property, or \$0.20 per square foot of Chargeable Covered and Enclosed Space for Assessor's Parcels of Commercial Property as the One-Time Special Tax for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

Section 2. The One-Time Special Tax with respect to any Assessor's Parcel shall be collected by the District at or prior to the issuance of a building permit of such Assessor's Parcel in accordance with Section C of the Rate and Method and Section C of the Ordinance.

Section 3. The Board of Trustees hereby ratifies any action taken prior to adoption of this resolution to collect the One-Time Special Tax with respect to Developed Property for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

<u>Section 4</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately on the date of final passage.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT ESTABLISHING SPECIAL TAXES WITHIN COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 03-1 FOR PREPAYMENTS FOR THE 2005-06 FISCAL YEAR

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2003 the Board of Trustees of the San Dieguito Union High School District (the "Board of Trustees") adopted a resolution entitled "Resolution of Formation of the Board of Trustees of the San Dieguito Union High School District Establishing Community Facilities District No. 03-1 of the San Dieguito Union High School District, Authorizing the Levy of a Special Tax, the Incurrence of Bonded Indebtedness not to Exceed \$75,000,000 within Proposed Community Facilities District 03-1 and Calling an Election" (the "Resolution"), which established Community Facilities District No. 03-1 of the San Dieguito Union High School District (the "District") pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, to finance the construction and acquisition of certain school facilities within the District;

WHEREAS, the Resolution authorized the levy of a special tax on property lying within the District, authorized the issuance of bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$75,000,000 and called an election;

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2003, an election (the "Election") was held within the District in which the eligible electors approved by more than two-thirds of the votes cast the propositions of levying a special tax on property within the District, incurring indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$75,000,000 and establishing an appropriations limit;

WHEREAS, on May 15, 2003, the Board of Trustees adopted an ordinance entitled, "Ordinance of the Board of Trustees of the San Dieguito Union High School District Authorizing the Levy of a Special Tax Within Community Facilities District No. 03-1" (the "Ordinance") authorizing the levy of a special tax within the District pursuant to the rate and method of apportionment of special taxes approved in the Election (the "Rate and Method") which is set forth in Exhibit A attached to the Ordinance (terms used but not defined herein have the meaning provided in the Rate and Method);

WHEREAS, the Ordinance authorized the Board of Trustees to provide, by resolution, for the levy of the special tax in accordance with the Rate and Method;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Rate and Method, within five (5) business days from the time of issuance of the initial building permit with respect to any Assessor's Parcel, the owner of such Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property may elect to prepay fifty percent of the aggregate Maximum Special Tax obligation attributable to the Assessor's Parcel;

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> In accordance with the Rate and Method, the Board of Trustees hereby establishes \$8,548.66 as the Alternate Prepayment Tax for Tax Class A Single-Family units, \$2,309.73 for Tax Class A Multi-Family units, \$7,207.95 for Tax Class B Single-Family units, and \$1,946.90 for Tax Class B Multi-Family units with respect to Developed Property for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

Section 2. The Alternate Prepayment Tax with respect to any Assessor's Parcel shall be collected by the District within five (5) business days from the time of issuance of the initial building permit of such Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property in accordance with Section VI of the Rate and Method and Section 5 of the Ordinance.

Section 3. The Board of Trustees hereby ratifies any action taken prior to adoption of this resolution to collect the Alternate Prepayment Taxes with respect to Developed Property for the 2005-06 fiscal year.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution shall take effect immediately on the date of final passage.







SUBJECT: Layoff of Classified Positions

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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The state budget crisis has adversely impacted the District's ability to maintain the current level of support for all programs. Although administration has reduced expenditures significantly with conservative staffing and the reduction of positions through attrition, it will need to continue to make reductions in order to weather the state's fiscal crisis.

Administration has evaluated all areas of operations to determine where the current level of service can be reduced. The identified lack of work will result in a reduced number of positions in several program areas. The attached list of 15 <u>vacant</u> positions (Resolution A) is recommended to be eliminated due to this lack of work. Where feasible, the District has transferred staff so that this elimination of positions would not affect current employees, with one exception (Resolution B).

The District has discussed this with CSEA.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The administration is proposing additions, revisions, and deletions related to transportation for Board Policies 3540/AR-1, "Transportation"; 3541, "Transportation Routes and Schedules"; 3541.2/AR-1, "Transportation for Students with Disabilities or Handicaps"; 3542/AR-1, "Roles and Duties of Employees"; 3543/AR-1, "Transportation Safety and Emergencies"; and 3543.1 AR-1, "School Bus Conduct/Student Safety". The policies have been revised to more accurately reflect the language suggested in the CSBA sample documentation and new laws regulating school bus transportation.

These policies are being submitted as a 1st reading and will be returned at the next regularly scheduled board meeting for adoption.

#### TRANSPORTATION

No student shall be required to be transported for any reason without the written permission of the student's parent/guardian, except in emergency situations involving illness or injury to the student.

#### Means of Transportation

To provide transportation services, the Governing Board may purchase, rent or lease vehicles; contract with a common carrier or municipally owned transit system; contract with responsible private parties including the parent/guardian of the student being transported; and/or contract with the County Superintendent of Schools.

In contracting for transportation services, the district shall comply with all applicable laws related to bids and contracts.

In lieu of providing transportation in whole or in part, the district may pay the parents/guardians of special education students who have been identified in individual educational programs (IEP) as needing transportation, either their actual and necessary expenses in transporting the student or the cost of the student's food and lodging at a place convenient to the school. In either case, the amount of the payment shall not exceed the cost that would be incurred by the district to provide for the transportation of the student to and from school.

#### TRANSPORTATION ROUTES AND SCHEDULES

Junior high Middle school students living beyond two and three quarter miles of the junior high middle schools will be eligible for school bus transportation to or from school. Home to school transportation to district senior high schools will be limited to special ed students whose I.E.P. calls for transportation. An exception may be made for a "shuttle service" to link a high school with another high school or a public bus route that does not service the school site serving the area.

Bus stops will be so spaced that those students qualified to ride school buses will walk no farther from their home to the bus stops than the limits provided above for those students who do not qualify for bus transportation. Exceptions may be permitted in either case to ensure the safety of district students.

Bus stops shall be scheduled, so far as possible, to avoid having students cross major highways and thoroughfares except at traffic signals or marked crosswalks.

Buses will be provided for co-curricular activities which are interscholastic and are a part of the educational program, subject to the availability of equipment. Students will be charged to help offset the costs of providing the service.

Buses may be used by Board approved campus organizations for extra curricular orco-curricular activities which interscholastic or which cannot be construed as part of the educational program. The costs of the use of the transportation for such activities will be paid for by the users.

The superintendent is authorized to develop school bus routes and schedules to implement the Board's policy and to approve the use of district transportation for out of county trips.

Bus schedules will be coordinated among the school districts of the Cooperative in order to transport students as cost effectively as possible.

#### TRANSPORTATION FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES OR HANDICAPS

IEP teams or Section 504 committees shall authorize appropriate special transportation to and from school for students who have:

- 1. An orthopedic or other physical disability or handicap that significantly impairs mobility.
- 2. A severe sensory impairment, such as full or partial blindness or deafness, which puts their safety and well-being at risk.
- 3. A significant delay in social, emotional or cognitive development, as documented by appropriate assessment data, which puts their safety and well-being at risk.

Students eligible for special transportation for one of the above reasons may receive such transportation to and/or from a child care provider located within the district.

The district shall provide special transportation to and from alternative sites or clinics where the student is scheduled to receive a related service included in the student's IEP.

Special education students who do not meet any of the above criteria may use regular home-to-school transportation. A student who would otherwise not be eligible for special transportation may receive such transportation if assigned to a site other than his/her neighborhood school for the purpose of receiving special education.

Students admitted to a special education program in the district on an interdistrict transfer agreement must, as a condition of attendance, arrange for the district or SELPA of residence to provide any necessary transportation.

Guide dogs, signal dogs and service dogs trained to provide assistance to disabled persons may be transported in a school bus when accompanied by disabled students, disabled teachers or persons training the dogs.

#### ROLES AND DUTIES OF EMPLOYEES

#### Authority of School Bus Drivers

Students transported in a school bus shall be under the authority of, and responsible directly to, the driver of the bus. The driver shall be held responsible for the orderly conduct of the students while they are on the bus or being escorted across a street, highway, or road.

A bus driver shall have the authority to discontinue the operation of a school bus whenever he/she determines that it is unsafe to continue.

Administrative regulations related to bus driver authority shall be made available to parents/guardians, students, teachers and other interested parties.

#### School Bus Driver Qualifications and Training

- A. All school bus drivers employed by the district for the transportation of students shall possess, at a minimum:
  - 1. A valid license for the appropriate class of vehicle, issued by the State Department of Motor Vehicles.
  - 2. A current Red Cross First Aid Certificate or certified completion of the first aid test given by the California Highway Patrol.
  - 3. A current medical certificate as required by law.
  - A California special driver certificate valid for driving a school bus.
- B. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that school bus drivers receive training, which includes:
  - The proper actions to be taken in the event that a school bus is hijacked.
  - 2. The proper installation of mobile seating devices in the bus securement systems.

All bus drivers shall receive training as mandated by la also shall be familiar with and adhere to district poli regulations relating to student transportation.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify the Department of Motor Vehicles within five days whenever any school bus driver is dismissed for a cause related to student transportation safety, or whenever a driver so dismissed has been reinstated.

School bus drivers shall be subject to drug and alcohol testing in accordance with Governing Board policy and the requirements of federal law.

The Superintendent or designee may use an electronic fingerprinting system, managed by the California Department of Justice, to fingerprint an applicant for an original certificate to drive a school bus or student activity bus.

#### School Bus Driver Duties

School bus drivers shall report all school bus accidents immediately to the California Highway Patrol and the district.

Drivers shall not require any student to leave the bus en route between home and school or other destinations.

The school bus driver's major responsibility is to safely transport students to and from school and school activities. He/she shall follow procedures contained in the district's transportation safety plan.

Drivers shall stop to load or unload students only at a school bus stop designated by the Superintendent or designee, or authorized by the Superintendent of designee for school activity trips. (Vehicle Code 22112)

When loading or unloading, drivers shall escort all students in grades prekindergarten through eight 7 through 12 across the street, except at locations controlled by a traffic control signal.

The driver will may hold an 18 inch, octagonal stop sign while escorting students across the street. The driver shall first ensure that it is safe to cross. Students shall cross in front of the bus, between the bus and the driver. The driver shall make sure all students have crossed safely before setting the bus in motion.

School bus drivers shall report to the Director of Transportation or designee on the following:

1. Recurring and serious student misbehavior.

- 2. Parental and student complaints.
- 3. All accidents involving students or school vehicles.
- 4. All traffic violations, which endanger students.
- 5. Consistently late school dismissals, which cause transportation delays. (Such occurrences must also be brought to the attention of the school principal.)
- 6. Overloads
- 7. Mechanical or other problems with buses and equipment.

When the bus is stopped on a highway or private road to load or unload students and traffic is not controlled by a traffic officer or official traffic control system, the driver shall activate the flashing amber light warning system, if the bus is so equipped, beginning 200 feet before any bus stop where students are loading or unloading. They shall operate the flashing red signal lights and stop signal arm at all times when the bus is stopped to load or unload students. The flashing amber warning lights, flashing red signal lights and stop signal arm shall not be operated at any other time, or at any place where traffic is controlled by a traffic officer.

#### Drivers must:

- 1. Escort all students in grades 7 through 12 who need to cross the highway or private road, using an approved hand-held 18-inch octagonal "STOP" sign while doing so.
- 2. Require all students to walk in front of the bus as they cross the road or highway.
- 3. Ensure that all students who need to cross the road or highway have crossed safely and that all other unloaded students and pedestrians are a safe distance from the bus before setting the bus in motion.

Exceptions when loading or unloading students at a location where students must cross a highway or private road upon which the bus is stopped, the flashing red signal lights and stop signal arm requirements do not apply at any of the following locations:

 School bus loading zones on or adjacent to school grounds or during an activity trip, if the school bus is lawfully parked

- 2. Where the school bus is disabled due to mechanical breakdown
- 3. Where students require assistance to board of leave the school bus
- 4. Where the roadway surface on which the bus is stopped is partially or completely covered by snow or ice and requiring traffic to stop would pose a safety hazard
- 5. On a state highway with a posted speed limit of 55 miles per hour or higher where the school bus is completely off the main traveled portion of the highway
- 6. Any location determined by the Superintendent or designee, with the approval of the California Highway Patrol, to prevent a traffic or safety hazard

State regulation limits bus idling. School buses and commercial motor vehicles are required to turn off the engine upon arriving at a school and restart no more than thirty seconds before departing. If a bus is beyond 100 feet from a school the bus may not idle for more than 5 minutes. These locations are described as school bus stops or school activity destinations. (CCR Section 2480)

#### TRANSPORTATION SAFETY AND EMERGENCIES

#### Transportation Safety Plan

The Superintendent or designee shall develop a transportation safety plan to address student safety, which includes all of the following:

- Procedures for determining if students in grades 7 through 12 1. require escort to cross a private road or highway at a bus stop pursuant to Vehicle Code 22112
- Procedures for all students in grades 7 through 12 to follow 2. as they board and exit the bus at their bus stops.
- Procedures for boarding and exiting a school bus at a school 3. or other trip destination.

A copy of the plan shall be kept at each school site and made available upon request to the California Highway Patrol.

#### Safe Bus Operations

School buses and school student activity buses shall also not be operated whenever the number of passengers exceeds bus-seating capacity, except when necessary in emergency situations, which require that students be moved immediately to ensure their safety.

School bus drivers have the discretionary authority to discontinue home-to-school, or any activity trips, if conditions become unsafe when visibility is reduced to 200-feet or less. If, in the opinion of the bus driver, conditions are so hazardous that the safe operation of the bus is not possible, the driver shall pull off the roadway and, if possible, onto the shoulder of the road.

Driver instructors will be responsible to help driver's recognize the 200-foot limit.

If the driver is unsure that there is adequate visibility to drive the bus safely, the driver will:

- Reduce speed 1.
- 2. Increase following distance
- Call dispatch to inform them of the concern and 3. school that the route or trip will be delayed.

If a driver must stop the bus, the driver will look for a location approximately ten feet off of the roadway. With headlights off and hazard lights on, the driver shall erect the warning reflectors and place them on the roadway in the appropriate fashion for added visibility. The driver will turn off the hazard lights and the clearance lights. Lights are turned off to prevent other drivers from being attracted and following those lights.

When the driver has notified dispatch of the poor visibility conditions, dispatch will send, if available, an instructor or supervisor to further assist the driver and other drivers at the location of the poor visibility.

In poor visibility conditions, the students shall remain on the bus under the direction and supervision of the driver.

When a school bus or student activity bus is equipped with a passenger restraint system, all passengers shall be required to be properly restrained by that system while the bus is in motion.

Bus drivers shall be informed of procedures to be followed to reasonably ensure that all passengers are so restrained.

The Superintendent or designee may place a notice at bus entrances that warns against unauthorized entry. The driver or another school official may order any person to disembark if that person enters a bus without prior authorization and has intent to commit a crime.

Each school bus shall be equipped with at least one fire extinguisher located in the driver's compartment, which meets the standards specified in law.

The Superintendent or designee shall review all investigations of bus incidents and accidents to develop preventative measures.

#### Student Instruction

All students who are transported in a school bus or student activity bus shall receive instruction in school bus emergency procedures and passenger safety which shall include the following:

1. Each school year, the Superintendent or designee shall provide appropriate instruction in safe riding practices and emergency evacuation drills. Each student who receives home-to-school transportation in a school bus shall be required to receive this instruction. (5 CCR 14102)

2. At least once each year, all students in grades 7 through 12 who receive home-to-school transportation shall receive safety instruction, which includes, but is not limited to:

- a. Proper loading and unloading procedures, including escorting by the driver
- b. How to safely cross the street, highway or private road
- c. The use of passenger restraint systems, including but not limited to the proper fastening and release of the passenger restraint system, acceptable placement of passenger restraint systems on students, times at which the passenger restraint systems should be fastened and released, and acceptable placement of the passenger restraint systems when not in use
- d. Proper passenger conduct
- e. Bus evacuation
- f. Location of emergency equipment.

Practice drills are in the interest of safety for all concerned in the event it becomes necessary to evacuate a bus. A well-planned procedure rather than a disorderly evacuation will reduce panic.

At least one bus evacuation drill shall be conducted each school year at each school site for riders of school buses.

As part of this instruction, students shall evacuate the school bus through emergency exit doors. Instruction also may include responsibilities of passengers seated next to an emergency exit.

Each time the above instruction is given, the following information shall be documented:

- a. District name
- b. School name and location
- c. Date of instruction
- d. Names of supervising adults
- e. Number of students participating

- f. Grade levels of students
- g. Subjects covered in instruction
- h. Amount of time taken for instruction
- i. Bus driver's name
- j. Bus number
- k. Additional remarks

This documentation shall be kept on file at the district office or the school for one year and shall be available for inspection by the California Highway Patrol.

- 3. Before departing on a school activity trip, all students riding on a school bus or student activity bus shall receive safety instruction, which includes, but is not limited to:
  - a. Location of emergency exits
  - b. Location and use of emergency equipment

This instruction also may include responsibilities of passengers seated next to an emergency exit.

#### School Buses/Hazardous Driving Conditions

The California Vehicle Code requires school districts to develop and adopt policies with procedures for the operation of school buses when atmospheric conditions reduce visibility to 200 feet or less.

School bus drivers have the discretionary authority to discontinue home-to-school, or any activity trips, if conditions become unsafe when visibility is reduced. If, in the opinion of the bus driver, conditions are so hazardous that the safe operation of the bus is not possible, the driver shall pull off the roadway and, if possible, onto the shoulder of the road.

Driver instructors will be responsible to help driver's recognize the 200 foot limit.

If the driver is unsure that there is adequate visibility to drive the bus safely, the driver will:

- 1. Reduce speed
- 2. Increase following distance
- 3. Call dispatch to inform them of the concern and to notify the school that the route or trip will be delayed.

If a driver must stop the bus, the driver will look for a location approximately ten feet off of the roadway. With headlights off and hazard lights on, the driver shall erect the warning reflectors and place them on the roadway in the appropriate fashion for added visibility. The driver will turn off the hazard lights and the clearance lights. Lights are turned off to prevent other drivers from being attracted and following those lights.

When the driver has notified dispatch of the poor visibility conditions, dispatch will send, if available, an instructor or supervisor to further assist the driver and other drivers at the location of the poor visibility.

In poor visibility conditions, the students shall remain on the bus under the direction and supervision of the driver.

#### SCHOOL BUS CONDUCT/STUDENT SAFETY

The San Dieguito Union High School District provides transportation for its students in accordance with the provisions of Education Code 16801. In order to provide this service with maximum safety for all pupils and to insure their bus riding privileges, the following standards for bus conduct are established. meet these standards may result in loss of riding privileges.

- 1. The bus driver is responsible for the safety and well-being of all passengers. The drivers directions must be followed at all times.
- 2. Students are to respect the property at bus stops and conduct themselves in an orderly manner while waiting for the bus and while returning home from the bus stop.
- 3. Students should not arrive at their bus stops more than five minutes before the bus arrives.
- 4. Students are required to use the same bus stop each day, and to return to the same stop. Elementary students are not permitted to ride any other bus to a friend's house, music lesson, scout meeting, etc., without written parent permission. This privilege shall be granted on a space available basis only.
- 5. The person in charge of loading the bus will determine the order of pupil entrance.
- Bus windows are to be operated by the driver only, and are not 6. to be lowered below the second notch (on most bus models this is approximately 6 inches.)
- 7. Unnecessary noise in the bus, such as loud talking, shouting, singing, and other rowdyism may distract the attention of the driver, and therefore is prohibited for the safety of all passengers.
- Transporting animals on the school bus is contrary to State 8. Law and not permitted, except for service animals.
- 9. Eating on the bus is prohibited.
- Any item considered dangerous to the health, safety o 10. of riders may be prohibited by the bus driver.

Automobiles must stop when a school bus is flashing its red lights. Pupils crossing the street must do so in front of the bus, as directed by the driver.

Failure to comply with school bus regulations or acting in any manner that creates an unsafe condition in or around the school bus will result in students' bus riding privilege being suspended or denied in accordance with Section 14263 of Title V of the California Administrative Code.

Noncompliance with bus riders rules will result in the following:

Incidents of misconduct on the bus shall be reported to the building principal for appropriate action. Such action may include, but is not limited to, contact with parents to discuss possible solutions, denial of bus riding privileges or suspension from school.

It shall be the principal's responsibility to communicate, with all parties concerned, the results of his action regarding each referral from a bus driver.

No later than the second referral, the parents will be notified that there is a problem and it is possible that their child's school bus riding privileges may be terminated if the problem is not resolved. On receipt of the third referral, school bus riding privileges shall be denied or suspended for a period of time as may be prescribed by the principal.

Disciplinary action for students will be implemented in the following manner:

- 1. First offense Student counseled, parents notified
- 2. Second offense Three (3) day suspension
- 3. Third offense Two (2) week suspension
- 4. Fourth offense Suspension for entire school year
- 5. Exception Threat of bodily harm or violence or severe unsafe behavior is cause for immediate suspension.

The referral form will indicate the type of misconduct, time, place, bus driver, school and other pertinent information concerning the problem. Disposition of the referral form after the principal's action will be the original sent to the parents, the duplicate for the school file, the triplicate returned to the transportation department.
