1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m.

INFORMATION ITEMS

2. ENROLLMENT POLICY & ALTERNATIVES

After a general overview and debriefing by Dr. Lynch about the topics at hand, Mr. Ma and Mr. Addleman gave a detailed presentation regarding the need for consideration to be given to priority attendance, allocations for priority seating, explanations of the options available, their pros and cons, and other considerations. This is the result of using Mello-Roos funds to construct and modernize school facilities. Three options were discussed:

- Option One is the current practice of no priority given to Mello-Roos students because special taxes were spent at all high schools and capacity has not been an issue.
- Option Two suggests that Mello-Roos students be given priority at those schools financed by Mello-Roos funds.
- 3) Option Three suggests that Mello-Roos students be given priority to those schools financed by Mello-Roos funds in proportion to the amounts contributed by each Community Facilities District (CFD) to acquire and construct a school.

After a question and answer session, the Board recommended Option Two as a possible solution. The Board directed staff to look at a multi-year implementation of Option 2. They also suggested working with district counsel to obtain an attorney general's opinion on the implementation of priority attendance.

A second Special Board Workshop will take place on January 18, 2007, to finalize the details of this recommendation.

3. HIGH SCHOOLS OF CHOICE

AND

4. ENHANCEMENTS TO EARL WARREN MS PROGRAMS Mr. Schmitt addressed the Board to discuss these two topics. He presented a list of challenges and recommendations to resolve those challenges and provided the Board with some questions to consider. Some key recommendations were:

- To give students a choice of selecting 6, 7 or 8 classes, in order to improve the balance between high schools and academies, and to move registration deadlines up to Feb 28, 2007 (vs. June).
- 2) To provide registration and possibly course selection on-line when determining high school and academy eligibility and limit the application allowance to one high school.
- 3) To do more personal contact, offer special tours and regional programs, and expand the English Learner program to balance enrollment of underrepresented groups at the academies.
- To offer school tours, access local press, guidance counselors and web contact to improve communication and public relations.
- 5) To allow outreach efforts for Del Mar and Solana Beach school districts, provide shuttle routes, and offer flex start/end times at Carmel Valley and Earl Warren Middle Schools.
- 5. TRANSPORTATION REPORT

Mr. Thornton presented an update to the Board on the department's accomplishments and an overview on home-to-school transportation, which included an explanation of district revenues and expenses. He also outlined some key challenges and asked for the Board's direction in assessing priorities. Among the challenges are:

- 1) Meeting the needs of Instruction
- 2) Meeting the community's needs
- 3) Managing limited resources
- 4) Evaluating the Cooperative as an Operating Entity

A request to either buy or lease additional buses was presented and is being considered. The department also plans to re-evaluate the Cooperative Agreement that currently exists with Carlsbad Unified School District, to determine the most efficient way to transport and then inform the Board about the findings.

A second Special Board Workshop will take place on January 18, 2007, to finalize the details of the 07/08 Transportation Plan.

6. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 5:20 p.m.

The San Dieguito Adult School is in need of a permanent office space and classroom facility. Considering the physical space and funding available, Staff has determined that the San Dieguito Adult School purchase three relocatable classrooms to be located at San Dieguito High School Academy and be used as general office space and classrooms. The facility will include one large classroom, one smaller classroom, two offices, office space, a workroom, a storage area, and a restroom.

In order to receive these buildings in a timely fashion, cooperative bids entered into with other school districts were researched for optimum price and delivery. The contract entered into between Nuview Union School District and Modular Structures International, Inc. (MSI, Inc.) best fit the needs of the District. District staff is working with MSI, Inc. to examine the inclusions stated in MSI, Inc.'s proposal for this project with cost reduction in mind.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Government Code Section 66006 provide that all school districts shall make available to the public certain information and adopt described findings relative to statutory school fees collected, pursuant to Government Code Sections 53080 <u>et seq.</u> and 65995 <u>et seq.</u>, and Mitigation Payments collectively. WHEREAS, San Dieguito Union High School District ("District") has received and expended Reportable Fees in connection with school facilities ("School Facilities") of the District for new development and these funds have been deposited in a capital facilities account as provided by Section 66006 (a) of the Government Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 66006 (b)(2) of the Government Code requires the Board of Trustees ("Board") to review the information made available to the public at a regularly scheduled public meeting and any other relevant information including, but not limited to, that certain Reportable Fees Report prepared for District entitled "SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNUAL AND FIVE YEAR REPORTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2005-2006 IN COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTIONS 66006 AND 66001" ("REPORTABLE FEES REPORT") not less than fifteen (15) days after this Reportable Fees Report is made available to the public; and

WHEREAS, the District has complied with all of the foregoing provisions.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The District entered into an agreement for the annual audit of all funds with Wilkinson & Hadley, LLP – Certified Public Accountants. The audit has been completed in accordance with state law. Wilkinson & Hadley present the audit report for your review and acceptance. Copies have been forwarded to the County Superintendent and the State within the mandatory time schedule.

Findings and recommendations are noted on pages 57 through 62 of the audit report. Each exception requires a response from the district (LEA's response) and is included in the audit report as the last paragraph of each exception.

The following exceptions were noted:

Page 58, Item B, Finding 2006-1 (30000)

The auditors note that student body invoices are not properly defaced with a "paid" stamp at Canyon Crest Academy and Oak Crest Middle School. Ticket sales reconciliation has not occurred at Oak Crest MS. This finding will be reviewed with appropriate school site staff.

Page 58, Finding 2006-2 (30000)

Some year end accruals were miscalculated causing an audit adjustment to the 2005-06 ending/2006-07 beginning balance in the General Fund. A review of accruals will be conducted prior to the books being closed at year end.

Cont'd.

Page 59, Finding 2006-3 (30000)

The district does not have sufficient procedures in place to ensure that capital equipment purchases are recorded in the capital asset inventory. In addition, reconciliation needs to occur between the financial statements, capital outlay, and additions to the inventory. Coordination between Purchasing Department and Finance Department is underway to remedy this finding.

Page 59, Finding 2006-04 (30000)

One component of the financial statements for the district include long-term debt. Long-term debt is comprised of unpaid vacation liability, lease purchases, and bonds. When the debt schedule was prepared, one lease was omitted causing the total debt to be understated. Staff is currently determining the best way to ensure the accuracy of the debt schedule.

Page 60, Finding 2006-5 (30000)

Because Mello-Roos funds are not part of the district financial statements until year end, there is no reconciliation between Mello-Roos and the General fund. District staff is reviewing this process and will develop a procedure to ensure adequate cross reference between the two sets of books.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board accept the 2005-06 annual audit of the San Dieguito Union High School District, as prepared by Wilkinson & Hadley, LLP.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The District's collective bargaining agreement with the California School Employees Association Chapter 241, for three years with an extension, ended June 30, 2006. On December 14, 2006, the District concluded negotiations and reached a tentative agreement for a new three-year contract with CSEA. This agreement was ratified by the CSEA membership on December 20, 2006.

In addition to the yearly increase in Flexible Spending Accounts, the compensation package includes the following:

- Year 1 (2006/07) 5.92% increase to the salary schedule
- Year 3 (2008/09) 2.84% increase to the salary schedule
- Post-retirement health benefits increased from five to ten years for employees who retire before July 1, 2013.

There are no reopeners for the duration of the contract; however, there is a provision for increases equal to other bargaining unit increases in 2007/08 and 2008/09.

The proposed new classified salary schedule includes the 5.92% increase for 2006/07.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the three-year agreement with the California School Employees Association, Chapter 241, effective July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2009 and the attached salary schedule.

hour of absence, including being tardy more than 15 minutes counting as the 9^{th} hour.

- 2. Tardiness is not acceptable. Any student arriving late will be marked tardy. Any student arrival more than 15 minutes late will be counted as absent for that hour and will be charged one hour towards the maximum 8 hours. Less than 15 minutes is a tardy. Four (4) tardies result in one hour of absence accumulating to the maximum of 8 hours.
- 3. Any accumulation of more than 8 hours of absence, including tardies of more than 15 minutes accumulated towards the hourly total, will result in a drop upon the 9th hour.
- 4. Sites for summer school programs may be rotated in an effort to make summer school programs more accessible to all students, regardless of residence or regular attendance area, and to equalize long-term facility and maintenance needs.

INTRADISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT

The Board of Trustees desires to provide enrollment options that meet the diverse needs and interests of district students and shall annually review these options.

Students who reside within district boundaries may apply for enrollment in any district school. The Superintendent or designee shall determine the capacity of each district school and establish a random, unbiased selection process for the admission of students from outside a school's attendance area. In accordance with law, no student currently residing within a school's attendance area shall be displaced by another student.

The Board retains the authority to maintain appropriate racial and ethnic balances among district schools.

Enrollment Priorities

Schools receiving requests for admission shall give priority for attendance to siblings of children already in attendance in that school.

A student may be given priority for attendance outside his/her current attendance area when special circumstances exist that may be harmful or dangerous to that particular student. Harmful or dangerous special circumstances shall be identified pursuant to law and administrative regulations.

Schools or specialized programs that have a waiting list shall give students on the waiting list priority over students transferring from outside the attendance area.

Once enrolled as an intra-district transfer, a student shall declare on an annual basis his/her intent to either remain at the high school of choice or return to the high school of residence. Once enrolled, a student shall not have to apply for readmission. However, the student may be subject to displacement due to excessive enrollment.

The Superintendent or designee shall inform parents/guardians when certain schools or grade levels within a school are currently, or are likely to be, at capacity and therefore unable to accommodate any new students.



INTRADISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT

It is the policy of the Governing Board to provide options and meet the diverse needs, potential and interests of district students through an intra-district open enrollment policy on a space available basis limited only by the district's need to maintain appropriate racial and ethnic balances among district schools.

Enrollment Priorities

- 1. No student currently residing within a school's attendance area shall be displaced by another student as a result of the intra-district open enrollment transfer process.
- 2. The Governing Board retains the authority to maintain appropriate racial and ethnic balances among district schools. This authority takes precedence over the individual parent/guardian school choice if the two objectives are in conflict.
- 3. The Governing Board believes that all students are entitled to equity and access to educational support services. Administrative exceptions may be considered by local site staff to address the special instructional needs of individual students. These may include, but are not limited to, English as a Second Language/Bilingual Programs, or specialized programs requiring site facilities.
- 4. Requests for entrance to the specialized high school programs at Sunset Continuation High School or North Coast Alternative High School will be honored by employing existing criteria and the comprehensive high school administrative recommendations.
- 5. Once enrolled as an inter-district transfer, a student shall declare on an annual basis his/her intent to either remain at the high school of choice or return to the high school of residence. Once enrolled as an intra-district transfer, a student shall not have to apply for annual readmission. However, the student may be subject to displacement due to excessive enrollment.
- 6. Students who transfer from one school to another within the district shall be eligible for all athletic competition except varsity level competition in sports in which the student has SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT

competed in any level of interscholastic competition during the twelve calendar months preceding the date of such transfer.

7. With the exception of athletic eligibility, students approved to attend a school on an intra-district open enrollment transfer shall be entitled to the identical student rights, responsibilities, and expectations as applied to all students living within that school's attendance boundaries. This includes student behavior expectations and equal discipline consequences, positive attendance and academic progress.

Selection Procedures

The submitted application/declaration for the 2007-2008 school year is final after the March 11, 2007 deadline. Students may not switch school choices after the application deadline. Late applicants (filing after the March 11, 2007 deadline) shall not be added to the waiting list for the schools of choice (CCA and SDA).

Canyon Crest Academy

- A. The capacity of Canyon Crest Academy shall be determined by the Board of Trustees. All 9-12 (9th, 10th & 11th grades for the 2006-07 school year) students who reside within district boundaries are eligible to apply for admission to the Canyon Crest Academy. (As grade levels are added, students from that grade level throughout the district will be eligible to apply for enrollment at CCA.) Completed applications are to be submitted mailed or delivered directly to the school district prior to the designated deadline. If applications for admission exceed the program capacity of the school, a random, unbiased process will be followed to select those applicants eligible to enroll. Those not selected to enroll initially will be placed on a waiting list by grade level in the priority order in which they were selected. A waiting list will remain in force for one full year.
- B. San Diequito High School Academy

The capacity of San Dieguito High School Academy shall be determined by the Board of Trustees. All 9-12 students who reside within district boundaries are eligible to apply for admission to the San Dieguito High School Academy. Completed applications are to be **submitted** mailed or delivered to the

school **district** prior to the designated deadline. If applications for admission exceed the program capacity of the school, a random, unbiased process will be followed to select those applicants eligible to enroll. Those not selected to enroll initially will be placed on a waiting list by grade level in the priority order in which they were selected. A waiting list will remain in force for one full year.

C. All Other Schools

- 1. On or before January February 15 each year, the Superintendent or designee shall identify those schools within the district that have available capacity for intra-district transfers for the following school year under the district's open enrollment policy. A list of these schools and open enrollment applications shall be available at all school offices.
- 2. All students who submit applications to the district by March ± 11, 2007 shall be eligible for admission to their school of choice the following school year under the district's open enrollment policy if the requested school has not reached capacity and if the district's racial and ethnic balance is maintained. Applications received after the deadline may be considered if further openings exist.
- 3. Students with siblings currently attending the school of choice may be given priority for attendance.
- 4. Enrollment in a school of choice shall be determined by lot from the eligible applicant pool, and a waiting list shall be established to indicate the order in which students may be accepted as openings occur. Late applications shall not may be added to the waiting list. in the order in which they apply.
- 5. If open enrollment requests exceed capacity, students must attend their high school of residence.may select second and third choice options. Students with approved transfer requests are expected to attend the selected school of choice for the duration of the normal academic school year.
- 6. Students residing in residential dwelling units that are

subject to the district's Mello-Roos tax may be given priority for attendance for those schools whose construction was financed by the Mello-Roos tax.

- 6. The Superintendent or designee shall inform applicants by mail as to whether their applications have been approved, denied, or placed on a waiting list. If the application is denied, the reasons for denial shall be stated.
- 7. Applicants who receive approval must confirm their enrollment within two weeks.

The student whose request for intra-district open enrollment transfer has been denied may appeal the decision. All appeals shall be in writing and directed to the **Executive** Director of Pupil Personnel Services or designee. A response to the appeal shall be in writing outlining the conditions or factors related to the final disposition of the transfer appeal request.



INTRADISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT

It is the policy of the Governing Board to provide options and meet the diverse needs, potential and interests of district students through an intra-district open enrollment policy on a space available basis limited only by the district's need to maintain appropriate racial and ethnic balances among district schools.

Enrollment Priorities

- 1. No student currently residing within a school's attendance area shall be displaced by another student as a result of the intra-district open enrollment transfer process.
- 2. The Governing Board retains the authority to maintain appropriate racial and ethnic balances among district schools. This authority takes precedence over the individual parent/guardian school choice if the two objectives are in conflict.
- The Governing Board believes that all students are entitled to equity and access to educational support services. Administrative exceptions may be considered by local site staff to address the special instructional needs of individual students. These may include, but are not limited to, English as a Second Language/Bilingual Programs, or specialized programs requiring site facilities.
- 4. Requests for entrance to the specialized high school programs at Sunset Continuation High School or North Coast Alternative High School will be honored by employing existing criteria and the comprehensive high school administrative recommendations.
- 5. Once enrolled as an intra-district transfer, a student shall not have to apply for annual readmission. However, the student may be subject to displacement due to excessive enrollment.
- 6. Students who transfer from one school to another within the district shall be eligible for all athletic competition except varsity level competition in sports in which the student has competed in any level of interscholastic competition during the twelve calendar months preceding the date of such transfer.
- 7. With the exception of athletic eligibility, students approved to attend a school on an intra-district open enrollment SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT

transfer shall be entitled to the identical student rights, responsibilities, and expectations as applied to all students living within that school's attendance boundaries. This includes student behavior expectations and equal discipline consequences, positive attendance and academic progress.

Selection Procedures

Canyon Crest Academy

A. The capacity of Canyon Crest Academy shall be determined by the Board of Trustees. All 9-12 (9th, 10th & 11th grades for the 2006-07 school year) students who reside within district boundaries are eligible to apply for admission to the Canyon Crest Academy. (As grade levels are added, students from that grade level throughout the district will be eligible to apply for enrollment at CCA.) Completed applications are to be mailed or delivered directly to the school prior to the designated deadline. If applications for admission exceed the program capacity of the school, a random, unbiased process will be followed to select those applicants eligible to enroll. Those not selected to enroll initially will be placed on a waiting list by grade level in the priority order in which they were selected. A waiting list will remain in force for one full year.

B. San Dieguito High School Academy

The capacity of San Dieguito High School Academy shall be determined by the Board of Trustees. All 9-12 students who reside within district boundaries are eligible to apply for admission to the San Dieguito High School Academy. Completed applications are to be mailed or delivered to the school prior to the designated deadline. If applications for admission exceed the program capacity of the school, a random, unbiased process will be followed to select those applicants eligible to enroll. Those not selected to enroll initially will be placed on a waiting list by grade level in the priority order in which they were selected. A waiting list will remain in force for one full year.

C. All Other Schools

1. On or before January 15 each year, the Superintendent or designee shall identify those schools within the district that have available capacity for intra-district transfers for the following school year under the district's open

enrollment policy. A list of these schools and open enrollment applications shall be available at all school offices.

- 2. All students who submit applications to the district by March 1 shall be eligible for admission to their school of choice the following school year under the district's open enrollment policy if the requested school has not reached capacity and if the district's racial and ethnic balance is maintained. Applications received after the deadline may be considered if further openings exist.
- 3. Students with siblings currently attending the school of choice may be given priority for attendance.
- 4. Enrollment in a school of choice shall be determined by lot from the eligible applicant pool, and a waiting list shall be established to indicate the order in which students may be accepted as openings occur. Late applications may be added to the waiting list in the order in which they apply.
- 5. If open enrollment requests exceed capacity, students may select second and third choice options. Students with approved transfer requests are expected to attend the selected school of choice for the duration of the normal academic school year.
- 6. The Superintendent or designee shall inform applicants by mail as to whether their applications have been approved, denied, or placed on a waiting list. If the application is denied, the reasons for denial shall be stated.
- 7. Applicants who receive approval must confirm their enrollment within two weeks.

The student whose request for intra-district open enrollment transfer has been denied may appeal the decision. All appeals shall be in writing and directed to the Director of Pupil Personnel Services. A response to the appeal shall be in writing outlining the conditions or factors related to the final disposition of the transfer appeal request.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Staff has completed the update of school site capacity. Capacity estimates for the high schools has increased because of the elimination of class size reduction. The capacity at Diegueno Middle School also increased by 115 because site administration has reclassified a number of rooms currently being used as coaches' offices to being available for regular classroom use.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board review the proposed policy revision: Policy 7100/AR-1, *Student Housing Capacity*, being presented as an information item. This policy will be brought back to the next Board meeting for approval.

IV. Exceeding Capacity

It is possible to exceed projected capacity at both the high school or middle school level by such procedures as:

- 1. <u>Schedule modification</u> extending the school day to permit more students to take advantage of specialized facilities such as shops and laboratories.
- 2. <u>Facility modification</u> utilization of space not specifically designed for instruction purposes; i.e., faculty lounges, storage areas, etc.

While both procedures have been utilized to increase plant capacity, they do not provide an optimum learning environment for students.

V. Policy on Mitigating the Impact of New Residential and Commercial Development

The district will work with city and county planning agencies, property owners and developers to anticipate new development and to develop school facility financing plans designed to mitigate the impact of new residential and commercial development on the district based on student generation rates established by district studies.

This will enable the district to plan and construct permanent

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facilities district-wide to accommodate growth and student enrollment.
