The City of Encinitas and the State Storm Water Pollution Control Agency has suggested installation of a retaining wall to prevent sediment from a natural soil bank from washing into the storm drain in the bus yard. At the same time, we have been contemplating moving the existing Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fueling station from its present site to an area located along the same bank. By relocating the compressors and installing "K" rail for the gas line, we would provide a barrier for the sediment and meet the requirements of the City of Encinitas and the State Storm Water Pollution Agency.

The Air Pollution Control District (APCD) has offered us \$40,000.00 to relocate our CNG fueling station. The Agency originally funded the construction and the installation. The school district has agreed to match the funds to complete the job. Construction will begin as soon as possible and be completed by June 30, 2007. The site will be reviewed by the APCD for the next five years under the grant requirements.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is a housekeeping item to update the management salary schedule to reflect Board approved changes as discussed below. Since this is reaffirming previous Board direction, the policy is being recommended for adoption without a first reading.

At the request of the District in 2005, the Personnel Commission conducted a review of classified management positions. The study as approved by the Personnel Commission and the Board of Trustees included the recommendation to reallocate the salary range placement of the Director of Transportation to the same range as several other management positions at the turnover in the Transportation position.

The current Director of Transportation will be retiring at the beginning of April 2007. It is anticipated that a replacement will be selected to start in March 2007. This is the first turnover in the position since the Board approved the study in 2005. The recommended motion makes the necessary revision to Board Policy to implement the approved change.

That the Board adopt the revised Policy 4341.1.


