REGULAR MEETING / OPEN SESSION

Administrators Present

Peggy Lynch, Ed.D., Superintendent Terry King, Associate Superintendent, Human Resources Steve Ma, Associate Superintendent, Business Rick Schmitt, Associate Superintendent, Educational Services Steve Levy, Director, Pupil Services Marilyn Pugh, Principal, Diegueño Middle School Becky Banning, Executive Assistant / Recording Secretary

Ms. Hergesheimer reported on the recent Special Board Meeting of October 16, 2007, where search firms presented proposals to the Board for consideration as the selected advisory service to conduct a superintendent candidate search. She also attended a Foundation Fundraiser for Torrey Pines High School.

Ms. Friedman attended a forum at La Costa Canyon where a representative from the READI organization (*Recovery Education Alcohol Drug Instruction*) addressed a large group of about 50-60 parents. Ms. Friedman stated that it was well-received and commended district counselor, Mr. Joe Olesky, for his role in the forum. She also encouraged Mr. Olesky (who was present at this meeting) to make this an annual event. Ms. Friedman also attended a NCWJPA meeting earlier this month; attended an Achievement Gap Task Force press conference at the County Office of Education; a CSBA training; and the Torrey Pines Foundation fundraiser.

Ms. Dalessandro attended a public event in Solana Beach at Loma Santa Fe where City Mayor Heebner and State Governor Schwarzenegger announced that improvements to the local stretch of Interstate 5 are underway. She stated that the event was well attended and there was every kind of media coverage represented.

Ms. Rich also attended the Achievement Gap Task Force press conference, the Torrey Pines Foundation fundraiser and the parent forum at La Costa Canyon.

Dr. Lynch also gave calendar updates on pending events and reminded the Board of upcoming activities.

10. Department / School Updates (2).....(Agenda Item 10)

A. Diegueño Middle School Update Marilyn Pugh, Principal

Ms. Pugh gave an update on the recent events happening at Diegueño Middle School. She addressed topics of Academic Excellence and gave examples of programs such as "Academic Center for Excellence" (ACE), a lunchtime program that offers academic assistance to students. Ms. Pugh also addressed Student Connection efforts at the school stating that programs such as Encuentros and Adelante Mujer, programs aimed at encouraging continued education and good career choices among Latino students and their parents, have proven to be highly successful. Reflections, a program where students demonstrate creativity in art, music, writing, and photography, and Power in Pairs, a peer tutoring group that meets twice a week, have also been successful. Ms. Pugh spoke about the school's focus on character and staff development and showed a sample of a "Character Counts" statement t-shirt, which she proudly wore. She also updated the Board on the continued progress of Integrated Technology and Communication efforts at their site.

Pupil Services Director Mr. Steve Levy introduced Joe Olesky and Tiffany Findell, who oversee the READI program, a program that assists students struggling with substance abuse. They gave a detailed overview of the program and spoke about its successes as well as its challenges. They presented statistics dealing with how many students are currently in their program and spoke about how the program also gets the parents involved and educated, including providing all materials, both in English and Spanish, running peer recovery support groups for both, students and their families, providing a free sample drug test kit per family, followed by more at low cost, and monitoring strict ongoing programs. Upon concluding, Ms. Friedman asked that the Board come together to find a way to provide financial assistance for families of lower socioeconomic status with the cost of drug testing kits.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At the October 4, 2007 Board meeting, the Board adopted a "Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory to the San Dieguito Union High School District Community Facilities District No. 95-2, Authorizing the Levy of a Special Tax and Calling an Election" in order to annex the Barratt American property, Quail Pointe, into the Community Facilities District and call a special election for December 4, 2007. The Quail Pointe subdivision is located in the Oak Crest MS/La Costa Canyon HS attendance area. At this Board meeting, it is necessary to hold a public hearing allowing comments from the public regarding the annexation, and adopt the attached Resolution which determines that the prior proceedings were valid, that protests were not filed, fewer than twelve registered voters are registered to vote and request the Election be conducted by the Election Official.

RESOLUTION OF ANNEXATION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 95-2

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of San Dieguito Union High School District Community Facilities District No. 95-2 (the "District") pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, consisting of Sections 53311, et seq., of the California Government Code (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Board, acting as the legislative body of the District, adopted a Resolution of Intention to Annex Territory to the San Dieguito Union High School District Community Facilities District No. 95-2, Authorizing the Levy of a Special Tax and Calling an Election stating its intention to annex certain territory into the District (the "Annexed Territory No. 13") and calling a special election for December 4, 2007 (the "Election"); and

WHEREAS, the Board held a public hearing as required by law relative to the annexation of the proposed territory into the District on November 8, 2007 (the "Hearing"); and

WHEREAS, at the Hearing all persons desiring to be heard on all matters pertaining to the annexation of the proposed territory into the District, the levy of the special tax, the proposed bond issue and the types of facilities to be financed by the District were heard and a full and fair hearing was held; and

WHEREAS, at the Hearing evidence was presented to the Board on the matters before it.

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board finds and determines that all prior proceedings in connection with the annexation of the Annexed Territory No. 13 into the District were valid and in conformity with the Act. This determination shall be final and conclusive upon all persons.

Section 2. Written protests against the proposed annexation of the Annexed Territory No. 13 into the District have not been filed by either (i) 50 percent or more of the registered voters, or six registered voters, whichever is more, residing within the territory of the District or within the Annexed Territory No. 13, or (ii) the owners of one-half or more of the land within the District or within the Annexed Territory No. 13.

Section 3. The Board hereby finds and determines that there are fewer than twelve registered voters registered to vote within the territory of the Annexed Territory No. 13.

Section 4. The Election Official conducting the Election (the "Election Official") is hereby requested to continue to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the Election consistent with the Resolution of Intention.

Section 5. The Secretary of the Board is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Election Official no later than three days from the date thereof.

Section 6. The members of the Board and their authorized representatives are, and each of them acting alone is, hereby authorized to execute any and all documents and agreements and do perform any and all acts and things, from time to time, consistent with this Resolution and necessary or appropriate to carry the same into effect and to carry out its purposes.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

With the dissolution of the Transportation Coop, the transportation department is reviewing operational efficiencies and financial structure. From time to time, the transportation department will bid outside work (i.e. Del Mar Fair). Staff is recommending that revenue generated from outside contract work be deposited to a separate fund after the payment of direct expenses.

Education Code Section 41852(b) authorizes school districts to establish a Pupil Transportation Equipment Fund. Funds deposited in this fund shall be used exclusively for acquisition, rehabilitation and replacement of pupil transportation equipment (buses).

Α. REGULATIONS GOVERNING INITIAL PLACEMENT ON THE SALARY SCHEDULE

- No unit member shall be located beyond the xxxxx line, except 1. those unit members who were beyond the xxxxx line as of October 1, 1970.
- 2. Credits or units used to advance beyond Class I must be upper division or graduate credits earned after the date the bachelor's degree is granted as recorded on the transcript or diploma. Other official university documents equivalent to an official transcript may be accepted at the discretion of the District.
- 3. New unit members will be placed on Class I, Step I until all official documentation is received by the District at which time Class and Step placement shall be made retroactive to the unit member's starting date. New unit members have until November 1 of the year of hire or 60 days after the date of hire (whichever is later) to provide official transcripts and other salary placement documentation. If documents are not received by that date, placement will be made based on The Associate Superintendent/Human documents received. Resources may waive this date requirement under extenuating circumstances.
- 4. All new and current unit members who qualify for advancement in step with two (2) or more years of verifiable public school teaching experience, shall be placed at Step 3 of appropriate class on the Certificated Salary Schedule. unit members with less than two (2) years verifiable experience, shall be placed on the appropriate Step (1 or 2).
- 5. A master's degree or doctorate from a W.A.S.C. or equivalent accredited institution shall be required to enter Class V and VI for all unit members placed on the Certificated Salary Schedule after October 1, 1976.
- 6. Holders of a master's degree from a W.A.S.C. or equivalent institution in Classes III, IV, V, VI shall receive an additional 1,863\$1,900 per year. Holders of a doctorate from a W.A.S.C. or equivalent accredited institution shall receive an additional $\frac{1,863}{1,900}$ per year. Holders of an Ed. (Education Specialist) degree shall receive an additional per

year. Holders of a doctorate from a W.A.S.C. or equivalent accredited institution, who have not received a stipend for a master's

degree, are eligible to receive an additional $\$\frac{3,726}{3}\$3,800$ per year. Holders of both a doctorate and Education Specialist degrees will receive only the additional doctoral stipend.

7. A unit member shall receive as salary only an amount that bears the same ratio to the established annual salary as the time he/she serves bears to the required days of service.

B. RECLASSIFICATION OF THE SALARY SCHEDULE

1. For the purpose of class advancement on the salary schedule, written verification of credits which will appear on an official transcript must be submitted to the District Office on a grade card, or a letter from the registrar or course instructor, prior to the first teaching day of any school year. Final transcripts or other official documentation acceptable to the District, verifying the credits must be submitted prior to November 1, otherwise, class advancement will be denied and salary increases provided for class advancement will be relinquished and previously paid increases will be paid back to the District. Unit members planning class changes in the succeeding year must notify the District of their intention PRIOR TO MAY 15; otherwise, class advancement may be denied. Credits for class advancement shall be limited to upper division or graduate work from a W.A.S.C. or equivalent accredited institution. However, a unit member may submit a "Petition for Exception" to the Associate Superintendent/ Human Resources for courses or workshops which directly pertain to the individual's assignment. Such petition shall be reviewed by a committee composed of two Association representatives and two District representatives. The decision of the majority of the committee shall be final. The "Petition" must be received by the District Office at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the first day of the course or workshop. Salary schedule credit shall not be made retroactive for courses or workshops completed prior to June 30, 1993. A master's degree is required to enter Class V and VI for all unit members placed on the Certificated Salary Schedule after October 1, 1976. changes will be limited to not more than two per year.

- a. Certificated unit members working part-time contracts will begin accruing credit with the 1990-91 school year. Service earned prior to August 29, 1990, shall not be counted for the purpose of salary reclassification.
- b. Salary reclassification shall occur at the beginning of the school year.
- c. Unit members in a paid status less than 75% of a school year will be allocated part-time step credits as per the following formula:

- d. Such part-time credit will accumulate year to year. When a unit member's credits equal or exceed .75, 1.75, 2.75, etc., the employee will advance on the salary schedule.
- e. Unpaid leave days do not count in the formula used to determine service credit.
- f. The District shall provide to the Association by May 15th, a listing of those part-time unit members entitled to salary reclassification the beginning of the next school year.
- 2. No unit member holding an emergency credential shall be advanced beyond Class I on the salary schedule.
- 3. Effective July 1, 20062007, an additional increment of \$2,461\$2,510 will be granted during the ensuing year to unit members upon completion of the 13th, 17th, 21st, 25th, and 29th year of employment within the District. Part-time unit members shall accumulate longevity in proportion to the time taught per day. This additional increment will be granted with the beginning of the school year nearest the anniversary date.
- 4. Advanced degrees and longevity bonuses shall be considered as part of the salary when computing salary for part-time assignments.



CITIZEN ADVISORY COMMITTEES

The Board of Trustees recognizes that citizen advisory committees enable both citizens and educators to better understand the beliefs, attitudes and opinions held by school and community members.

As the need arises, the Board may establish citizen advisory committees or when required by law, to strengthen the effectiveness of district and school operations, enhance student learning and to consider district problems, needs and issues. The purpose of any such committees shall be clearly defined and aligned to the district's vision, mission and goals.

With Board approval, the superintendent or designee may establish advisory committees which shall report to him/her in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulations. Advisory committees shall serve in a strictly advisory capacity; they may make recommendations, but their actions shall not be binding on the Board or Superintendent. and shall not act as policy making bodies.—The Board shall have the sole power to dissolve any of its advisory committees not required by law when the committee has fulfilled its duties and may exercise this power at any time the Board deems it necessary.

Committee members shall represent a cross section of qualified people throughout the district and represent a diversity of viewpoints, except in those cases where a committee is established to address the needs of a particular segment of the school community. With Board approval, the Superintendent or designee make appoint committee members.

Citizen advisory committees created by Board action shall provide public notice of their meetings and conduct these meetings in accordance with the Brown Act. The Superintendent or designee may create citizen advisory committees to advise the administration; such committees do not report to the Board and are not subject to open meeting laws.

Within budget allocations, the Superintendent or designee may approve requests for committee travel and may reimburse committee members for expenses at the same rates and under the same conditions as those provided for district employees.

When committees are appointed, committee members shall receive a written statement including, but not be limited to:

- 1. The committee members' names.
- 2. The procedure to be used in the selection of the committee chairperson and other committee officers.
- 3. The name(s) and contact information of staff member(s) assigned to support the work of the committee.
- 4. The goals and specific charge(s) of the committee, including its topic(s) for study or well-defined area(s) of activity.
- 35. The specific period of time that the committee is expected to serve.
- 46. The Llegal requirements regarding meeting conduct and public notifications.
- 57. Resources available to help the committee complete its tasks.
- 68. Time—lines for progress reports and/or final report.
- 79. Relevant Board policies and administrative regulations.
 - 8. The procedure to be used in the selection of the committee chairperson and other committee officers.

Advisory committee members are not vicariously liable for injuries caused by the act or omission of the district or a committee and are not liable for injuries caused by an act or omission of a committee member acting within the scope of his/her role as a member of the committee. However, a member may be liable for injury caused by his/her own wrongful conduct. (Government Code 815.2, 820.9)

The following committees shall comply with the Brown Act requirements pertaining to open meetings, notices, and public participation, pursuant to Government Code 54950-54963:

- 1. Advisory committees established pursuant to Education Code 56190-56194 related to special education.
- 2. Advisory committees established pursuant to Education Code 8070 related to career technical education.

<u>Administrative Regulation Adopted:</u> June 22, 1995 1/3 Draft: October 10, 2007

- 3. Committees established to assist in development of a student wellness policy pursuant to 42 USC 1751 Note.
- 4. Committees established pursuant to Education Code 17387-17391 related to the use of disposition of excess real property.
- 5. Citizens' oversight committees established to examine the expenditures of general obligation bond or schools facilities improvement bond revenues passed with a 55 percent majority of the voters pursuant to Education Code 15278 and 15359.3.
- 6. Other committees created by formal Board action.

The following committees are exempt from the Brown Act but must conform to procedural meeting requirements established in Education Code 35147:

- 1. School site councils established pursuant to Education Code 41507, 41572, or 52852 related to student retention, school or library improvement, or school-based program coordination.
- 2. District or school advisory committees established pursuant to Education Code 52176 related to programs for students of limited English proficiency.
- 3. District or school advisory committees established pursuant to Education Code 54425(b) related to compensatory education.
- 4. Any district advisory committee established pursuant to Education Code 54444.2 related to migrant education programs.
- 5. School site councils established pursuant to Education Code 2002.5 related to economic impact aid and bilingual education.
- 6. School committees established pursuant to Education Code 11503 related to parent involvement.

Meetings of the above councils or committees shall be open to the public. Any member of the public shall have the opportunity to address the council or committee during the meeting on any item within its jurisdiction. Notice of the meeting shall be posted at the school site or the appropriate accessible location at least 72 hours before the meeting, specifying the date, time, and location of the meeting and containing an agenda that describes each item of business to be discussed or acted upon.

The above councils or committees shall not take action on any item not listed on the agenda unless all members present unanimously find that there is a need to take immediate action and that this need came to the council's or committee's attention after the agenda was posted. In addition to addressing items on the agenda, members of the council, Administrative Regulation Adopted: June 22, 1995 2/3

committee, or public may ask questions or make brief statements that do not have a significant effect on district students or employees or that can be resolved solely by providing information.

Councils or committees violating the above procedural requirements must, at the demand of any person, reconsider the item at the next meeting, first allowing for public input on the item.

Any materials provided to a school site council shall be made available to any member of the public upon request pursuant to the California Public Records Act.

Committees created by the Superintendent or designee to advise the administration and which do not report to the Board are not subject to the requirements of the Brown Act or Education Code 35147.

REQUIREMENTS

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As a result of recent University and Ed. Code changes, Board Policy 6200, High School Graduation Requirements, has been revised. The recommended changes are described below:

- Algebra I has been determined to be an 8th grade course, and will consequently be listed as a middle school course.
- The semester of Health requirement (I.B.8.) has been eliminated; the California Health curriculum will be integrated into the 9th grade P.E. course, beginning in the Fall of 2008 with the graduating class of 2012.
- California college entrance requirements will require freshmen, in the fall of 2012, to have taken a one-year Career Technical Education (CTE) course. The District Practical Art requirement/CTE (I.B.10.), beginning with the SDUHSD graduating classes of 2012, will be changed from one semester to one year of a Practical Art/ CTE course, to accommodate the new UC/CSU requirement.
- With the elimination of Algebra as a high school level course, "Geometry" and "Algebra II" have replaced "Algebra" in paragraph 1 of the section, "Middle School Students Taking High School Level Courses", (6200 AR.1,page 2 of 2)

RECOMMENDATION:

These policy changes are being submitted for a first read and will be resubmitted for action at the December 13, 2007 meeting.

INSTRUCTION

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Because graduation from high school provides students with opportunities for postsecondary education and/or employment, the Governing Board desires to prepare each student to obtain a diploma of high school graduation.

I. Course Requirements*

To obtain a diploma of graduation from high school, students shall complete at least the following courses in grades 9 through 12, with each course being one year unless otherwise specified: (Education Code 51225.3)

- A. A total of 230 semester periods of credit earned in grades 9 12.
- B. Included within the 230 credits that students must earn are:

Requirements for graduation and specified alternative means for completing the prescribed course of study shall be made available to students, parents/quardians and the public. (Education Code 51225.3)

California High School Exit Examination for the Classes of 2006 and Later

At the beginning of each school year or at the time a student transfers into the district, the Board shall provide written notification to all students in grades 9 through 12 and to their parents/guardians that, starting in the 2005-06 school year and each year thereafter, each student completing the 12th grade shall be required to successfully pass the state's high school exit examination as a condition of graduation. The notification shall include, at a minimum, the dates of the examination, requirements for passing the examination, and the consequences of not passing the examination. (Education Code 48980, 60850)

When students do not demonstrate sufficient progress toward passing the exit examination, supplemental instruction offered by the district shall be designed to assist students to succeed on the exit examination and shall reflect statewide academic standards to the extent that the district has aligned its curriculum with those standards. (Education Code 60851)

Supplemental instruction shall include summer school instructional programs for students in grades 7 through 12 who do not demonstrate toward passing the exit examination. sufficient progress (Education Code 37252)

All students must pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) to receive a high school diploma including students with disabilities. Students are permitted to take the test with accommodations or modifications specified for the CAHSEE if indicated in the student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) Section 504 Plan. Students who take the CAHSEE with modifications will not receive a valid score. However, at the request of a parent or guardian, a school principal may submit a

request for a waiver to the District Board of Trustees for a student with a disability who took the CAHSEE with modifications and received the equivalent of a passing score on one or both parts of the CAHSEE. The Board may waive the requirement to pass one or both parts of the exam if the student has met the requirements listed in California Education Code Section 60851c.

At the discretion of the Superintendent or designee, a student who has not passed the California High School Exit Exam and has met all other graduation requirements may participate in graduation exercises without receiving his/her diploma. When the California High School Exit Exam requirement has been satisfied, the student will be granted his/her diploma.

Middle School Students Taking High School Level Courses

- 1. Students may enroll in both world language and algebra Geometry and Algebra II as part of their middle school courses. The course of study taken at the middle schools is comparable to those same levels which are taken at the high school level; therefore, middle school world language and/or algebra Geometry and Algebra II classes fulfill the entrance requirement for the University of California and State University systems.
- 2. Students who take world language, as eighth graders are eligible for entry into the next level at the high school if they possess suggested prerequisites.
- 3. No high school credit will be granted for courses taken at the middle school; however, the course(s) may be used for college entrance requirements.
- 4. Students in Grade 8 may take and receive credit for advanced courses at the high school. Enrollment in these courses is on a space-available basis with approval of both the high school and middle school principals.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS PLANNING 2008-09

Practical Arts/Health

The California Department of Education, the California State University and the University of California have changed funding, access and admission policy for Career and Technical Education (formerly Practical Arts and Vocational Education). These recent changes have caused school districts to look at ways to expand Career and Technical Education (CTE) opportunities for students.

In 2008-09 (graduating class of 2012), high school students will be required to take 10 credits of CTE to be eligible for college, similar to the current 10 credit VPA requirement. We are currently increasing CTE courses at all four of our high schools, preparing for the new requirements.

In order to create space in a student's schedule for a 10-credit CTE course, we are using the 2005-07 CCA Integrated Health/P.E. pilot as our model. Integrated Health/P.E. was recently adopted as an official SDUHSD course. The Integrated Health/P.E. course allows for students to complete the California Health requirements as part of their Year One General P.E. program. Students learn the essential Health standards as part of this new Integrated Health/P.E. course. Unlike most classes, the State of California does not have a health graduation requirement. The requirement for health is to cover specific health standards in some course. Some districts do this in Science, some in Social Studies, and some in a P.E. course.

Placing the health standards into the P.E. program allows freshmen to have one more 10-credit elective space, without having to forfeit any other classes. San Dieguito Academy, La Costa Canyon High School, and Torrey Pines High School have built Integrated Health/P.E. sections into their master schedule for 2007-08 in preparation for a full transition into Integrated Health/P.E. for 2008-09.

The recommendation is to make the following two SDUHSD Graduation Requirement policy changes for 2008-09:

- to increase the CTE/Practical Art SDUHSD graduation requirement from five credits to ten credits.
- to eliminate the five-credit SDUHSD Health graduation requirement and place the California Health Standards into the Integrated Health/P.E. course.

The Board will act on both points at the November 8, 2007, and December 13, 2007 Board meetings.

ABOUT THE DELEGATE ASSEMBLY

CSBA's Delegate Assembly is a vital link in the Association's governance structure. The Delegate Assembly sets the general policy direction for the Association. Working with local districts, county offices, the Board of Directors and Executive Committee, Delegates ensure that the Association reflects the interests of school districts and county offices of education throughout the state.

The Delegate Assembly is made up of approximately 270+ Delegates who are elected by local board members in 21 geographic regions throughout the state. Some geographic regions have been further divided into subregions. Exofficio members of the Delegate Assembly with all privileges of membership include members of CSBA's Board of Directors, past presidents of CSBA and the immediate past

president of the California County Boards of Education (CCBE).

Delegates serve two-year terms beginning April 1. They meet twice a year to conduct business, and may also meet with the other Delegates and the Director within their region. Furthermore, they participate in CSBA events and they maintain contact with local boards in their region.

CSBA GOVERNANCE

Delegates and Directors are CSBA's key governance links. They enable the Association to serve California's more than 1,000 school districts and county offices of education and its more than 5,000 locally elected school board members.

Delegate Assembly (270+ Delegates elected by local boards in each CSBA region)





BECOMING A DELEGATE

QUALIFICATIONS

To be eligible to serve on CSBA's Delegate Assembly, a board member must:

- be a trustee of a district or county office of education that is a current member of CSBA; and
- be a trustee of a district or county office of education within the geographic region or subregion which the Delegate will represent.

TERM OF OFFICE

The term of office for each Delegate is two years and begins on April 1. Within each region, approximately half of the Delegates are elected in even-numbered years and half in odd-numbered years.

APPOINTMENTS TO THE DELEGATE ASSEMBLY

Districts with an ADA of 30,000-39,999 may appoint one Delegate. Additional appointments may be made as follows:

40,000-99,999 ADA: two Delegate seats

100,000-299,999 ADA: three Delegate seats

300,000 ADA or higher: seven Delegate seats

These districts also may participate in the nomination and selection of the other Delegates from that region or subregion.

NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

NOMINATIONS

Nominations for Delegate Assembly seats are made each year between the last Friday in October and January 7.

A board member must be formally nominated by a board in the region or subregion and may be nominated by his or her own district or county office. The nomination is an action that is taken in a public board meeting and requires a majority vote. A board may nominate as many individuals as it wishes. Nominees must sign a confirmation that they are willing to serve. It is critical that nominations and biographical sketch forms be delivered to the CSBA office, faxed or postmarked on or before January 7; late nominations and biographical sketch forms will not be accepted.

ELECTIONS

Ballots are mailed by February 1 to each district or county board within the region or subregion which has a vacancy. Ballots must be delivered to the CSBA office or postmarked by March 15 in order to be accepted. Ballots may not be faxed.

Voting for Delegates is an action of the entire board rather than individual board members; therefore, it is done at a public meeting and requires a majority vote. Each board may vote for as many persons as there

are positions to be filled within the region or subregion. The ballot will indicate how many positions are available. For example, if the terms of four Delegates are expiring, each board may vote for up to four persons. County boards vote only for the county seat within the region.

TIMELINE FOR DELEGATE ELECTIONS

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF DELEGATES

Delegates set the general policy direction and fulfill a critical governance role within the Association. They communicate the interests of local boards to CSBA's Board of Directors. Executive Committee and staff. Delegates give policy and legislative direction through the adoption of the Policy Platform every two years and the adoption of other policy statements as needed. They also speak on issues and provide direct advocacy on behalf of the Association.

Delegates play an important communications and support role within their region. They also elect the Association's officers and Board of Directors. The authority and primary duties of Delegates are contained in the CSBA Bylaws.

DELEGATES' ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Primary responsibilities of Delegates include:

- providing a link to other public officials at the local, state and national levels;
- providing a communications link between local board members and the regional Director;
- attending all Delegate Assembly meetings;
- adopting the Policy Platform which guides the Association's policy and political leadership activities:
- as needed, adopting policies and positions to supplement the Platform;
- providing testimony and input on critical issues;
- electing the officers, Board of Directors and Nominating Committee members;
- adopting the Association's Bylaws;
- serving on committees, task forces and focus groups; and
- supporting the Association's activities and events.
