EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Starting in 2008/09, the District is required to disclose funded status of Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB) liability in its annual financial report. The OPEB liability represents the cost of future payments made to retired employees for medical benefits. What is reported is the "unfunded actuarial accrued liability" (UAAL) and "net OPEB obligation" as calculated by an independent actuarial valuation. The updated actuarial report indicates a UAAL of \$13 million and a net OPEB obligation of \$1.2 million. The net OPEB obligation will grow significantly every year if the District continues the practice of the "pay as you go" funding.

The District can begin to address this liability by participating in an irrevocable trust with the administration and investment strategy provided by others. Staff is recommending the District join CalPERS' California Employers Retiree Benefit Trust (CERBT) as an investment vehicle to grow and manage District funds allocated to OPEB. CERBT was formed in 2007 and now has over \$1 billion in the trust and manages funds for 104 public agencies including 64 cities, 10 counties and 17 school districts.

In the current budgetary climate, the District will be hard pressed to pre-fund the liability at the suggested "annual required contribution" of \$1.9 million. However, there is nothing that would preclude the District from joining CERBT while still funding only the "pay as you go" amount of approximately \$500,000 annually. In the future, as economic conditions improve, the District can begin to pre-fund its OPEB liability as a means of ensuring funding for future retirees and using the investment expertise of CalPERS.

- (4) The Board shall institute such procedures and processes as it deems necessary to administer the Prefunding Plan, to carry out the purposes of this Agreement, and to maintain the tax exempt status of the Prefunding Plan. Employer agrees to follow such procedures and processes.

- C. Actuarial Valuation and Employer Contributions
- (1) Employer shall provide to the Board an actuarial valuation report on the basis of the actuarial assumptions and methods prescribed by the Board. Such report shall be for the Board's use in financial reporting, shall be prepared at least as often as the minimum frequency required by GASB Statement No. 43, and shall be:
 - (a) prepared and signed by a Fellow or Associate of the Society of Actuaries who is also a Member of the American Academy of Actuaries or a person with equivalent qualifications acceptable to the Board;
 - (b) prepared in accordance with generally accepted actuarial practice and GASB Statement Nos. 43 and 45; and,
 - (c) provided to the Board prior to the Board's acceptance of contributions for the valuation period or as otherwise required by the Board.
- (2) The Board may reject any actuarial valuation report submitted to it, but shall not unreasonably do so. In the event that the Board determines, in its sole discretion, that the actuarial valuation report is not suitable for use in the Board's financial statements or if Employer fails to provide a required actuarial valuation, the Board may obtain, at Employer's expense, an actuarial valuation that meets the Board's financial reporting needs. The Board may recover from Employer the cost of obtaining such actuarial valuation by billing and collecting from Employer or by deducting the amount from Employer's account in the Prefunding Plan.
- (3) Employer shall notify the Board of the amount and time of contributions which contributions shall be made in the manner established by the Board.
- (4) Employer contributions to the Prefunding Plan may be limited to the amount necessary to fully fund Employer's actuarial present value of total projected benefits, as supported by the actuarial valuation acceptable to the Board. As used throughout this document, the meaning of the term "actuarial present value of total projected benefits" is as defined in GASB Statement No. 45. If Employer's contribution causes its assets in the Prefunding Plan to exceed the amount required to fully fund the actuarial present value of total projected benefits, the Board may refuse to accept the contribution.
- (5) The minimum Employer contribution will be at least \$5000 or be equal to Employer's Annual Required Contribution, whichever is less, as that term is defined in GASB Statement No. 45. Contributions can be made at any time following the seventh day after the effective date of the Agreement provided that Employer has first complied with the requirements of Paragraph C.

- D. Administration of Accounts, Investments, Allocation of Income
- (1) The Board has established the Prefunding Plan as an agent plan consisting of an aggregation of single-employer plans, with pooled administrative and investment functions, under the terms of which separate accounts will be maintained for each employer so that Employer's assets will provide benefits only under employer's plan.
- (2) All Employer contributions and assets attributable to Employer contributions shall be separately accounted for in the Prefunding Plan (Employer's Prefunding Account).
- (3) Employer's Prefunding Account assets may be aggregated with prefunding account assets of other employers and may be co-invested by the Board in any asset classes appropriate for a Section 115 Trust.
- (4) The Board may deduct the costs of administration of the Prefunding Plan from the investment income or Employer's Prefunding Account in a manner determined by the Board.
- (5) Investment income shall be allocated among employers and posted to Employer's Prefunding Account as determined by the Board but no less frequently than annually.
- (6) If Employer's assets in the Prefunding Plan exceed the amount required to fully fund the actuarial present value of total projected benefits, the Board, in compliance with applicable accounting and legal requirements, may return such excess to Employer.

E. Reports and Statements

- (1) Employer shall submit with each contribution a contribution report in the form and containing the information prescribed by the Board.
- (2) The Board shall prepare and provide a statement of Employer's Prefunding Account at least annually reflecting the balance in Employer's Prefunding Account, contributions made during the period and income allocated during the period, and such other information as the Board determines.

F. Disbursements

- (1) Employer may receive disbursements not to exceed the annual premium and other costs of post employment healthcare benefits and other post employment benefits as defined in GASB 43.
- (2) Employer shall notify CalPERS in writing in the manner specified by CalPERS of the persons authorized to request disbursements from the Prefunding Plan on behalf of Employer.

- (3) Employer's request for disbursement shall be in writing signed by Employer's authorized representative, in accordance with procedures established by the Board. The Board may require that Employer certify or otherwise establish that the monies will be used for the purposes of the Prefunding Plan.
- (4) Requests for disbursements that satisfy the requirements of paragraphs (2) and (3) that are received on or after the first of a month will be processed by the 15th of the following month. (For example, a disbursement request received on or between March 1st and March 31st will be processed by April 15th; and a disbursement request received on or between April 1st and April 30th will be processed by May 15th.)
- (5) CalPERS shall not be liable for amounts disbursed in error if it has acted upon the written instruction of an individual authorized by Employer to request disbursements. In the event of any other erroneous disbursement, the extent of CalPERS' liability shall be the actual dollar amount of the disbursement, plus interest at the actual earnings rate but not less than zero.
- (6) No disbursement shall be made from the Prefunding Plan which exceeds the balance in Employer's Prefunding Account.
- G. Costs of Administration

Employer shall pay its share of the costs of administration of the Prefunding Plan, as determined by the Board.

- H. Termination of Employer Participation in Prefunding Plan
- (1) The Board may terminate Employer's participation in the Prefunding Plan if:
 - (a) Employer gives written notice to the Board of its election to terminate;
 - (b) The Board finds that Employer fails to satisfy the terms and conditions of this Agreement or of the Board's rules or regulations.
- (2) If Employer's participation in the Prefunding Plan terminates for any of the foregoing reasons, all assets in Employer's Prefunding Account shall remain in the Prefunding Plan, except as otherwise provided below, and shall continue to be invested and accrue income as provided in Paragraph D.
- (3) After Employer's participation in the Prefunding Plan terminates, Employer may not make contributions to the Prefunding Plan.

- (4) After Employer's participation in the Prefunding Plan terminates, disbursements from Employer's Prefunding Account may continue upon Employer's instruction or otherwise in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- (5) After thirty-six (36) months have elapsed from the effective date of this Agreement or at such earlier date as may be approved by the Board in its sole discretion:
 - (a) Employer may request a trustee to trustee transfer of the assets in Employer's Prefunding Account. Upon satisfactory showing to the Board that the transfer will satisfy applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and the Board's fiduciary duties, then the Board shall effect the transfer within one hundred twenty (120) days. The amount to be transferred shall be the amount in the Employer's Prefunding Account as of the disbursement date and shall include investment earnings up to the investment earnings allocation date immediately preceding the disbursement date. In no event shall the investment earnings allocation date precede the transfer by more than 120 days.
 - (b) Employer may request a disbursement of the assets in Employer's Prefunding Account. Upon satisfactory showing to the Board that all of Employer's obligations for payment of post employment health care benefits and other post employment benefits and reasonable administrative costs of the Board have been satisfied, then the Board shall effect the disbursement within one hundred twenty (120) days. The amount to be disbursed shall be the amount in the Employer's Prefunding Account as of the disbursement date and shall include investment earnings up to the investment earnings allocation date immediately preceding the disbursement date. In no event shall the investment earnings allocation date precede the disbursement by more than 120 days.
- (6) After Employer's participation in the Prefunding Plan terminates and at such time that no assets remain in Employer's Prefunding Account, this Agreement shall terminate.
- (7) If, for any reason, the Board terminates the Prefunding Plan, the assets in Employer's Prefunding Account shall be paid to Employer after retention of (i) amounts sufficient to pay post employment health care benefits and other post employment benefits to annuitants for current and future annuitants described by the employer's current substantive plan (as defined in GASB 43), and (ii) amounts sufficient to pay reasonable administrative costs of the Board.
- (8) If Employer ceases to exist but Employer's Prefunding Plan continues to exist and if no provision has been made by Employer for ongoing payments to pay post employment health care benefits and other post employment benefits to annuitants for current and future annuitants, the Board is authorized to and shall appoint a third party

administrator to carry out Employer's Prefunding Plan. Any and all costs associated with such appointment shall be paid from the assets attributable to contributions by Employer.

(9) If Employer should breach the representation and warranty set forth in Paragraph A., the Board shall take whatever action it deems necessary to preserve the tax-exempt status of the Prefunding Plan.

I. General Provisions

(1) Books and Records.

Employer shall keep accurate books and records connected with the performance of this Agreement. Employer shall ensure that books and records of subcontractors, suppliers, and other providers shall also be accurately maintained. Such books and records shall be kept in a secure location at the Employer's office(s) and shall be available for inspection and copying by CalPERS and its representatives.

(2) Audit.

- (a) During and for three years after the term of this Agreement, Employer shall permit the Bureau of State Audits, CalPERS, and its authorized representatives, and such consultants and specialists as needed, at all reasonable times during normal business hours to inspect and copy, at the expense of CalPERS, books and records of Employer relating to its performance of this Agreement.
- (b) Employer shall be subject to examination and audit by the Bureau of State Audits, CalPERS, and its authorized representatives, and such consultants and specialists as needed, during the term of this Agreement and for three years after final payment under this Agreement. Any examination or audit shall be confined to those matters connected with the performance of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the costs of administering this Agreement. Employer shall cooperate fully with the Bureau of State Audits, CalPERS, and its authorized representatives, and such consultants and specialists as needed, in connection with any examination or audit. All adjustments, payments, and/or reimbursements determined to be necessary by any examination or audit shall be made promptly by the appropriate party.

(3) Notice.

(a) Any notice, approval, or other communication required or permitted under this Agreement will be given in the English language and will be deemed received as follows:

- 1. Personal delivery. When personally delivered to the recipient. Notice is effective on delivery.
- 2. First Class Mail. When mailed first class to the last address of the recipient known to the party giving notice. Notice is effective three delivery days after deposit in a United States Postal Service office or mailbox.
- Certified mail. When mailed certified mail, return receipt requested. Notice is effective on receipt, if delivery is confirmed by a return receipt.
- 4. Overnight Delivery. When delivered by an overnight delivery service, charges prepaid or charged to the sender's account, Notice is effective on delivery, if delivery is confirmed by the delivery service.
- 5. Telex or Facsimile Transmission. When sent by telex or fax to the last telex or fax number of the recipient known to the party giving notice. Notice is effective on receipt, provided that (i) a duplicate copy of the notice is promptly given by first-class or certified mail or by overnight delivery, or (ii) the receiving party delivers a written confirmation of receipt. Any notice given by telex or fax shall be deemed received on the next business day if it is received after 5:00 p.m. (recipient's time) or on a nonbusiness day.
- 6. E-mail transmission. When sent by e-mail using software that provides unmodifiable proof (i) that the message was sent, (ii) that the message was delivered to the recipient's information processing system, and (iii) of the time and date the message was delivered to the recipient along with a verifiable electronic record of the exact content of the message sent.

Addresses for the purpose of giving notice are as shown in Paragraph B.(1) of this Agreement.

- (b) Any correctly addressed notice that is refused, unclaimed, or undeliverable because of an act or omission of the party to be notified shall be deemed effective as of the first date that said notice was refused, unclaimed, or deemed undeliverable by the postal authorities, messenger or overnight delivery service.
- (c) Any party may change its address, telex, fax number, or e-mail address by giving the other party notice of the change in any manner permitted by this Agreement.

ITEM 15C

(d) All notices, requests, demands, amendments, modifications or other communications under this Agreement shall be in writing. Notice shall be sufficient for all such purposes if personally delivered, sent by first class, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, delivery by courier with receipt of delivery, facsimile transmission with written confirmation of receipt by recipient, or e-mail delivery with verifiable and unmodifiable proof of content and time and date of sending by sender and delivery to recipient. Notice is effective on confirmed receipt by recipient or 3 business days after sending, whichever is sooner.

(4) Modification

This Agreement may be supplemented, amended, or modified only by the mutual agreement of the parties. No supplement, amendment, or modification of this Agreement shall be binding unless it is in writing and signed by the party to be charged.

(5) Survival

All representations, warranties, and covenants contained in this Agreement, or in any instrument, certificate, exhibit, or other writing intended by the parties to be a part of their Agreement shall survive the termination of this Agreement until such time as all amounts in Employer's Prefunding Account have been disbursed.

(6) Waiver

No waiver of a breach, failure of any condition, or any right or remedy contained in or granted by the provisions of this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing and signed by the party waiving the breach, failure, right, or remedy. No waiver of any breach, failure, right, or remedy shall be deemed a waiver of any other breach, failure, right, or remedy, whether or not similar, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver unless the writing so specifies.

(7) Necessary Acts, Further Assurances

The parties shall at their own cost and expense execute and deliver such further documents and instruments and shall take such other actions as may be reasonably required or appropriate to evidence or carry out the intent and purposes of this Agreement.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 1987, the District granted an easement to U.S. Cellular West to construct a cellular tower at Torrey Pines High School. In exchange for the easement, the District received a one-time payment of \$108,000 to construct four tennis courts. Crown Castle, the successor in interest to U.S. Cellular, has recently received a conditional use permit from the City of San Diego to rebuild the tower to add capacity. For the past three years, staff has been working with Crown Castle on this revised plan. Crown Castle has agreed to pay the District a one-time payment of \$84,000 to amend the easement agreement. The easement will be increased in size to accommodate the larger equipment proposed at the base of the tower.

Staff is recommending the use of the \$84,000 to re-landscape the front of Torrey Pines High School and/or Carmel Valley Middle School in response to concerns brought up by community members and the Carmel Valley Planning Board. If this work is done, staff believes it will create an opportunity to re-open dialogue with the city on the annual Maintenance Assessment District (MAD) fees (\$34,000) paid by District.

The granting of a revised easement is a multi-step process which will include a public hearing and time sensitive noticing. The Resolution of Intention is the first step in this process.

- A. Grantor is the owner of certain real property located in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California, as more particularly described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Grantor's Property").
- B. Grantor has granted an easement to Grantee, as successor-in-interest to US West Cellular of California, Inc., a Texas corporation, over certain portions of Grantor's Property pursuant to the terms and conditions of that certain Grant of Easement, dated February 17, 1987, and recorded on April 17, 1987, as Document No. 87-10118, in the Official Records of San Diego County, California, and that certain Easement Agreement, dated February 17, 1987, and recorded on April 17, 1987, as Document No. 87-10119, in the Official Records of San Diego County, California (collectively, the "Easement").

Grantor and Grantee desire to modify the Easement subject to and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein in order to facilitate the construction of a new communications tower, as well as the installation and collocation of equipment on and/or near such tower, and to grant additional land to Grantee to accommodate such construction, installation and collocation.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Grantor and Grantee do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Amendment to Easement</u>. Grantor acknowledges and agrees that the purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the construction of a new communications tower, as well as the installation and collocation of equipment on and/or near such tower, and to grant additional land to Grantee to accommodate such construction, installation and collocation. Accordingly, concurrently with the full execution of this Agreement, Grantor hereby agrees to execute and deliver to Grantee an Amendment to Easement in the form and substance of Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference ("Amendment to Easement"). Grantee agrees to cause the Amendment to Easement to be recorded in the Official Records of the San Diego County within thirty (30) days after the receipt of the executed counterpart from Grantor.
- 2. <u>Consideration for Amendment</u>. As consideration for Grantor's execution and delivery of the Amendment to Easement described in Section 1 above, on or before the seventh (7th) business day following the date upon which all of the Conditions Precedent (as hereafter defined) have been satisfied, Grantee shall pay to Grantor the sum of Eighty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$84,000.00) in cash or other immediately available funds ("**Lump Sum Payment**").
- 3. <u>Conditions Precedent.</u> Grantor acknowledges and agrees that the purpose of this Agreement is to accommodate the construction of a new communications tower and the installation of additional equipment and collocation on and/or near such tower. Accordingly, the covenants and obligations of Grantee set forth in this Agreement (including, without limitation, the obligation to pay the Lump Sum Payment to Grantor) are expressly subject to the satisfaction (or waiver by Grantee, in its sole and absolute discretion) of the following conditions precedent (collectively, the "Conditions Precedent"):

- (a) Grantee has received all necessary permits, approvals and entitlements from all applicable governmental and/or quasi-governmental entities for the construction of the new tower and installation and collocation of equipment on and/or near such tower; and
- (b) Construction of the new tower and installation of the additional equipment and collocation on and/or near such tower has been completed.

In the event the Conditions Precedent are not satisfied on or before December 31, 2010, and Grantee does not notify Grantor in writing by such date of Grantee's waiver of the Conditions Precedent (which waiver may be made in Grantee's sole and absolute discretion), then this Agreement will be deemed terminated, and thereafter, neither Grantor nor Grantee shall have any further obligations to the other party under this Agreement.

- 4. <u>Further Assurances</u>. Each party shall execute and deliver such further instruments and shall take such other action as the other party may reasonably request from time to time in order to carry out the intent of this Agreement.
- 5. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. Each and all of the obligations, covenants, conditions and restrictions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon and enforceable against, as the case may require, the successors and assigns of Grantor and Grantee.
- 6. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted under the laws of the State of California.
- 7. <u>Attorney's Fees.</u> If either party hereto shall commence any legal action or proceeding against the other to enforce this Agreement (including an action for declaratory relief), the party prevailing shall be entitled to recover from the non-prevailing party all court costs and actual attorneys' fees and disbursements reasonably incurred by the prevailing party.
- 8. <u>Amendments</u>. Any amendment or supplement to, or waiver of, any provision of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by the party whose obligations are purported to be affected thereby.
- 9. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.





EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The San Dieguito Union High School District faces a gap between actual revenues and estimated expenditures of approximately \$7.5 million per year for each of the next three years. This gap exists not because expenditures are increasing dramatically, but rather is the result of a precipitous decline in revenues. Resources are insufficient to support this deficit spending over time.

For budget planning and preparation purposes, it will be necessary to reduce expenditures for 2010-11 by approximately \$3.5 million and for 2011-13 by approximately \$1 million for each of those two successive years. Should the district see an increase in revenue, then the target amounts for reduction could be reduced.

The attached documents provide a three year analysis of the impact of these reduction targets and provides detail of where reductions for 2010-11 need to occur.
