EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Three more of the various summer projects, Miscellaneous Site Improvements at Torrey Pines High School, Front Entry Site Improvements at Earl Warren Middle School, and Sunset High School Offsite Improvements, are now finished. All three were completed on schedule and without any major additional costs or issues. The project at Torrey Pines High School completed with a deduction in the contract amount due to the allowance not being fully utilized. The project at Earl Warren Middle School needed some additional concrete paving, an unforeseen footing demolition, and some unforeseen water and sewer line repairs, which resulted in an increase to the contract amount. However, some of the cost was off-set by the built-in allowance used for such miscellaneous unforeseen conditions. During the project at Sunset High School, the City of Encinitas required the contractor to provide a class 2 base under the concrete sidewalks – an addition not originally requested by the City during bidding time. The cost of this request was off-set by the built-in allowance, but the total cost did exceed the allowance amount.

In addition to the changes in the contract amounts, for administrative purposes, the completion date needs to be extended on all of the contracts to coincide with the Board's acceptance date.

- 2. <u>Compensation</u>. Within 45 days of the date Grantee commences construction within the Easement Area (the "Compensation Commencement Date"), Grantee agrees to pay to Grantor a one time payment of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) (the "Compensation").
- 3. No Permanent Structures. Grantor hereby covenants for and on behalf of itself, its heirs, successors or assigns, that neither it, nor any of them, shall construct or permit to be constructed, any building or any other permanent structure within the Easement Area, or make any permanent excavation, or permit any permanent excavation to be made within the Easement Area.
- 4. <u>Term.</u> The easement, rights, and privileges herein granted shall be for a term coinciding with the term of the Lease, including any renewals thereof, and shall, without any further action on the part of Grantor or Grantee, terminate immediately upon the termination of said Lease. Upon termination of this Easement for any reason, at Grantor's request Grantee shall execute with acknowledgement and deliver a notice of termination in form suitable for recording in the official records of the County.

- 7. Insurance. Grantee will carry, at its own cost and expense, the following insurance: (i) commercial general liability insurance with a minimum limit of liability of \$1,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury or death/property damage arising out of any one occurrence; and (ii) Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by law. Grantee will name the Grantor as an additional insured under its commercial general liability policy. Notwithstanding anything in this Easement, with respect to all loss, damage, or destruction to a party's property (including rental value and business interruption) occurring during the term of this Easement, Grantor and Grantee hereby release and waive all claims (except for

willful misconduct) against the other party and its employees, agents, officers, and directors. With respect to property damage, each party hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the other party, but only to the extent that collectible commercial insurance is available for said damage.

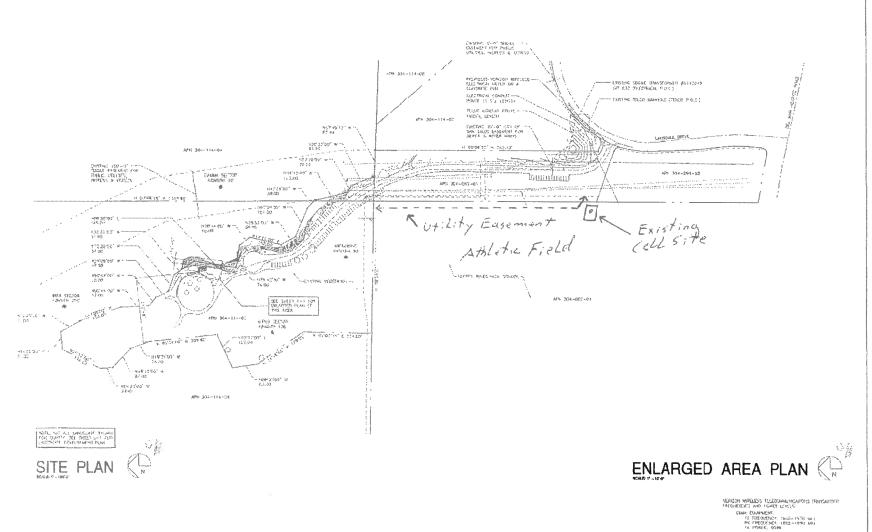

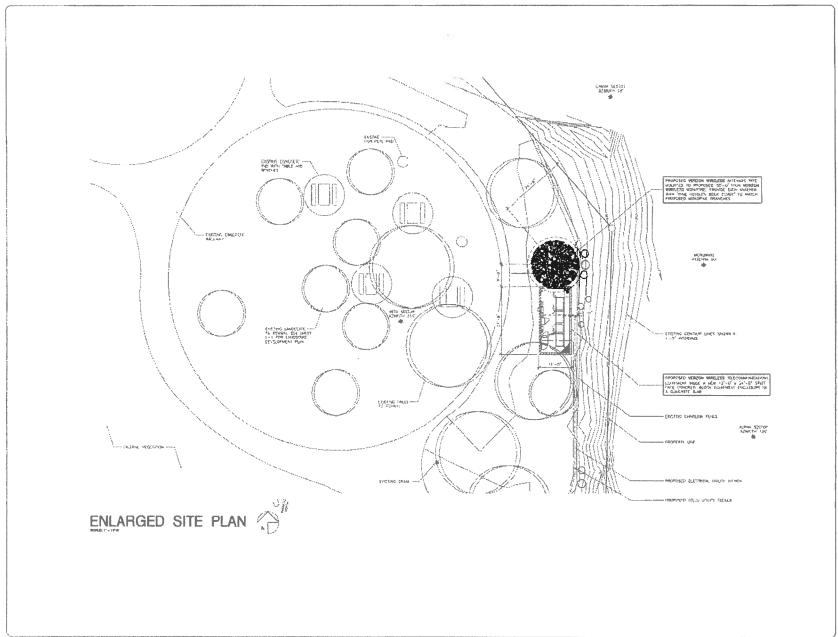

Revision

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Board of Trustees approved the Adopted Budget for 2009-10 on June 30, 2009, before the revised budget for the State of California was approved, and before the books were closed for 2008-09. At that time, certain assumptions were made and reviewed in the executive summary for the Adopted Budget. Since then, some things have changed and the purpose of this budget revision is to incorporate known values as well as update some estimates.

Revisions included in this Fall Budget Revision are:

- The beginning fund balance is changed as a result of closing the books for 2008-09. This is up by about \$1.78M.
- Federal Income is increased due to the receipt of American Reinvestment Recovery Act funds.
- Other State Income is increased due to changes in the Fair Share proposal. At Adoption, it
 was assumed that the District would lose all Tier III categorical funds under the proposal in
 the legislature at the time. Under the enacted State budget revision, the District will receive
 an estimated additional \$2.9M in Tier II & III funds. Home-to-School Transportation shifted
 from Tier I to Tier II in the final revision making it subject to cuts, but program requirements
 remained intact.
- Estimated cost of encroachment is up by \$247K due to increased Special Education costs and to cover the unexpected shortfall in Home-to-School Transportation funding.
- Certificated salaries have increased because of greater enrollment and the conservative estimate of staffing at adoption. There are 3.14 FTE more teachers in Fall Revision from Adopted for a total of 574.31 FTE. Related salaries are up \$117K.
- Classified salaries are down slightly by about \$45K, due to reductions in At-Will Employees.
- Employee benefits are up by about \$123K due to increased staffing and changes in the PERS contribution rate.
- Reserve for Economic Uncertainties has been increased from 4.3% to 6.63%.

The unrestricted ending balance as of June 30, 2010 is now projected to be \$15.2M (unrestricted). While this increase is welcome, the District is still operating with an overall deficit and the additional reserves will be carried over to 2010-11 to sustain programs which will be subject to further reductions in Other State Income under the Fair Share deal.

To illustrate the ongoing budget challenges the District will face in light of the current economic situation, staff has prepared a multi-year projection. This is not a requirement of the Fall Revision, but we are conducting more frequent evaluations as conditions change which might affect our long-term financial outlook. Using the most current assumptions, the District is able to meet its financial obligations and maintain the minimum required reserve in the current and two subsequent fiscal years. The Board will notice, however, that the trend of deficit spending continues which is supported by using reserves in order to sustain programs.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In the history of the San Dieguito Union High School District, supervision of the District's Special Education program has been the responsibility of various administrative positions. In recent years the Coordinator of Special Education has overseen programs that have grown both in number and complexity. The District's Special Education programs include Adult Transition, TAP, SEAS, and a public alternative to private placement, as well as a state-of-the-art Workability program.

As the responsibilities are now commensurate with a Director level, it is recommended that the position of Coordinator of Special Education be changed to Director of Special Education, at the same level as the current Directors of Technology and Student Services.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the change of position from Coordinator of Special Education to Director of Special Education, retroactive to July 1, 2009, as in the attached salary schedule.

Credit for previous management experience will be given consideration toward initial placement on the management salary schedule. Twelve days of sick leave for each year shall be allowed each full-time manager during the period of time under active contract with the district.

All classified managers shall be governed by the Classified Merit System Rules and Regulations.

Longevity Benefits - An increment of \$2,737 for a 12 month, 8 hours per day, full-time employee at the end of 10, 15, 20, 25 and 30 years in the district, shall be added to the employee's annual salary. The longevity increment of those employees employed less than 12 months or less than 8 hours per day will be prorated in accordance with the number of months and/or hours or regular employment.
