#### Budget Message Talking Points SDUHSD, Business Services March 13, 2012

- We are entering another volatile year for school funding
- Economy is showing signs of improving, but recovery is very slow
- The proposed budget released by the Governor relies on new taxes approved by the voters and a majority of legislators approving a radical restructuring of the way schools are funded
- The impact of the Governor's proposal:
  - o No funded COLA for any school district
  - o No restoration of funding cuts
  - Flat funding
  - o \$8-10 billion in deferrals
  - More threats of mid-year cuts--up to \$370/ADA
- The Governor's budget relies on his tax initiative making the ballot and the people supporting it
  - If the tax initiative fails or does not make the ballot, automatic trigger cuts would be imposed
  - o Schools once again take a disproportionate hit
  - If the tax initiative is successful, the new taxes are spread out across the entire state general fund, if the initiative fails, then 90% of the state's trigger cuts will be to K-14 education.
- The one thing we do know is that total spending per student in California trails the rest of the nation with no turnaround in sight

#### **Basic Aid**

- We became a Basic Aid district only due to the cuts to state education funding
- While Basic Aid has provided a bit of a safety net, we are not immune to the state's problems
- We have lost most of our categorical funding
- Basic Aid districts pay back to the state a "fair share contribution" that recognizes the amount of state aid lost by revenue limit districts
- When state aid is cut (as is proposed in the mid-year trigger cuts), the Fair Share Contribution is increased
- As our property tax grows, so does our Fair Share Contribution, so we earn a dollar then we pay a dollar to the state.
- This is holding back any gains we make as our property tax revenue recovers

#### Weighted Student Formula

- A major component of the Governor's proposed budget is a radical restructuring of how schools are funded.
- The current revenue limit and categorical funding model is phased out over six years

- A new model is phased in
  - o Each school district is entitled to a base grant of \$4,920 per student
  - A supplemental grant of \$1,820 is awarded based on a district's enrollment of English Learners and students participating in Free & Reduced Lunch.
- While some districts with high EL and FRL enrollment will see increases in funding as this model is phased in, this district will not
- San Dieguito would be ineligible for any state funding because the Base Grant +
  Supplemental Grant entitlement will only be \$5,150 per ADA in 2017-18. This is far less
  than the combined Property Tax + remaining Categorical Funding of \$7,019 per ADA we
  have now. (2011/12 prop tax per ada is \$6,466)
- The idea of a weighted student formula is a good one--but only if it is phased in with additional funding and no district loses.
  - This proposal is a redistribution of existing funds which creates winners and losers across the state.
  - o Instead of first determining an adequate level of base funding for students and adding to it a supplemental amount for disadvantaged students, then calculating how much new money would be needed, the administration's proposal "rolled out in precisely the reverse order" [Rob Blattner].
    - First it determined the available funding, then it deducted the supplemental funding needed for targeted students.
    - What was left was a base funding amount far less than any reasonable estimation of what a base funding amount should be.
  - The proposal is one-size-fits-all and does not account for the cost differences in educating high school students vs elementary
- Redistribution of an already low funding level will not bring the desired results of improving student achievement across the state

#### **Transportation**

- The future of home-to-school transportation funding is uncertain
- Half the funding was cut as part of the 2011-12 trigger cuts that were implemented this year when state revenue fell short of projections
- The funding was then restored for this year
- The Governor then proposed eliminating all state transportation funding
- Transportation funding was then restored in a budget bill for 2012-13 only, and the funding was made flexible for any purpose; after 2012-13, transportation funding is eliminated and rolled into the Weighted Student Formula funding (which we won't get)
- While we hope the state will continue to provide dedicated funding for home-to-school transportation, we must prepare for the possibility that the funding will be eliminated either next year or the year after

#### Tax Initiatives

- As mentioned earlier, the Governor's budget proposal rests on the hope that his
  proposed temporary increases in income tax on the wealthiest Californians and sales tax
  for all residents will make the ballot in November and pass
- The Governor and the California Federation of Teachers have now joined forces to modify their competing initiatives. There are now only two potential tax measures heading for the ballot.

- The revised initiative would increase the state sales tax rate by 0.25%, rather than the original 0.5% proposed by Brown.
- The personal income tax increases in the Governor's proposal would be retained, though the two highest brackets would see an additional 1% increase.
- The sales tax increase expires in 2016, the personal income tax increase would expire in 2019.
- The new Brown/CFT measure must go through the qualifying process and then collect more than a million signatures by May.
- The proponents of each of the two measures are jockeying for position and making the case that their proposal has the best chance of winning and provide the best outcome for schools
- Molly Munger, the backer of the other remaining tax initiative, and the Governor have
  not shown any indication they will back down if more than one initiative qualifies for the
  ballot; polling has been mixed; we don't know what the political landscape will look like in
  November and how more than one tax increase on the ballot will be received by voters

#### Conclusion

- We recognized this economic crisis early and have taken a deliberate, measured approach to preserve programs and maintain performance:
  - o Cutting expenses where we can
  - Spending down our reserves
  - Use of stimulus funding--now depleted
- With an outlook of flat funding, dwindling reserves and increased costs due to step & column movement and benefits cost increases, we must still look to cut costs wherever we can
- The potential loss of state transportation funding would have a major effect on our middle school busing operation
- We are committed to providing a world-class education, but we can only do that if we remain fiscally solvent

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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Education Code 39802 requires that whenever an expenditure for transportation services is to exceed \$10,000.00 that the district secure bids pursuant to sections 20111 and 20112 of Public Contract Code. Education Code 39802 specifies that a governing board may let the contract for the service to other than the lowest bidder. In anticipation of the need for a special education transportation services contract when the district is not able to provide such transportation through its own resources, staff issued request for proposals Special Education Transportation Services B2012-12 on March 6, 2012. On March 20, 2012 staff received and reviewed two proposals. One proposal, Care-A-Van, was not compliant with the district specifications. The second proposal was reviewed by District staff for compliance and was determined to be responsive and responsible. A bid recap is attached.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Award a contract for Special Education Transportation Services B2012-12 when the district is not able to provide such transportation through its own resources to Sol Transportation, Inc., during the period April 13, 2012 through April 12, 2013, with options to renew four additional one year periods, at the unit prices listed in the attachment, and authorize Christina M. Bennett or Eric R. Dill to execute all pertinent documents.

SUBJECT: REJECTION OF PROPOSALS

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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

On June 30, 2011 Governor Jerry Brown signed trailer bill legislation that changes code sections which previously gave Department of Mental Health responsibility for providing services to special education students. These code sections were rendered inoperable on July 1, 2011 and repealed on January 1, 2012. The effect of repealing these codes is that school districts are now required to implement the provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Act 2004. As a result, on February 14, 2012 staff issued request for proposals for Mental Health Services B2012-10. On March 6, 2012 two proposals were received. Staff have reviewed the two proposals and determined that there was inadequate information provided to truly differentiate the quality of services and the likely programs. Furthermore, the San Diego County Office of Education and the North Coastal Consortium for Special Education have advised the district that we may solicit a greater selection and negotiate directly with providers, which should provide the district with a wider range of services and lower overall costs.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Reject all proposals received for Mental Health Services B2012-10 due to inadequate information to truly differentiate the quality of services and the likely programs, as well as to solicit a greater selection and lower overall cost, and authorize staff to enter into direct negotiations, as recommended by the San Diego County Office of Education and North Coastal Consortium for Special Education, with the providers of said services.

Due to the current State budget crisis, the District is forced to make budget reductions for 2012-2013. In addition to the budget reductions in certificated and management staffing, further reductions will now be required in classified services. The attached resolution lists the positions to be eliminated, as well as the positions with reduced work hours/months.

The District has informed the California School Employees Association, (CSEA), of this situation and is in the process of negotiating impacts and effects of the resulting layoff.

The purpose of this recommended Board action is to initiate the process of deleting and/or reducing the hours/months of the identified positions and ensuring implementation of all layoff rights for the affected incumbents.

























#### CONFLICT OF INTEREST

#### **INCOMPATIBLE ACTIVITIES**

The Governing Board desires to maintain the highest ethical standards and help ensure that decisions are made in the best interest of the district and the public. In accordance with law, Board members and designated employees shall disclose any conflict of interest and, as necessary, shall abstain from participating in the decision. The Board shall adopt a bylaw that specifies the terms of the Governing Board members shall not engage in any employment or activity which is inconsistent with, incompatible with, in conflict with or inimical to the Board member's duties as an officer of the District. (Government Code 1126)

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE**

The District's conflict of interest code, shall be comprised of the terms of California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730 and any amendments to it adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, together with a District attachment specifying designated positions, and the specific types of disclosure statements categories required for each position.

Upon direction by the code reviewing body, the Board shall review the District's conflict of interest code in even numbered years. If no change in the code is required, the District shall submit any changes by October 1 a written statement to that effect to the code reviewing body. If a change in the code is necessitated by changed circumstances, the District shall submit an amended code to the code reviewing body. (Government Code 87306.5)

When a change in the District's conflict of interest code is necessitated due to by changed circumstances such as the creation of new designated positions, changes to the duties assigned to existing positions, amendments, or revisions, the amended code shall be submitted to the code reviewing body within 90 days. (Government Code 87306)

When reviewing and preparing the District's conflict of interest codes, the Superintendent or designee District shall provide officers, employees, consultants and members of the community adequate notice and a fair opportunity to present their views. (Government Code 87311)

Board members and designated employees shall annually file a Statement of Economic Interest/Form 700 in accordance with the disclosure categories specified in the district's conflict of interest code. A If a Board member who leaves office or a designated employee who leaves district employment shall, within 30 days, file a revised statement covering the period of time between the closing date of the last statement and the date of leaving office or district employment. (Government Code 87302, 87500)determines that he/she has a financial interest in a decision, as described in Government Code 87103, this determination shall be disclosed. The member shall be disqualified from voting unless his/her participation is legally required. (2 CCR 18700)

Statements of economic interests submitted to the District by designated employees in accordance with the conflict of interest code shall be available for public inspection and reproduction. (Government Code 81008)

#### FINANCIAL INTEREST CONFLICT OF INTEREST UNDER GOVERNMENT CODE 1090

Board members, employees, or district consultants and designated employees shall not be financially interested in any contract made by the Board on behalf of the district, including in the development,

preliminary discussions, negotiations, compromises, planning, reasoning, and specifications and solicitations for bids. If a Board member has such a financial interest, the district is barred from entering into the or in any contract. (Government Code 1090; Klistoff v. Superior Court, (2007) 157 Cal. App. 4th 469) they make in their capacity as Board members or designated employees. (Government Code 1090)

A Board member shall not be considered to be financially interested in a contract if his/her interest is a "noninterest" as defined in Government Code 1091.5. One such noninterest is when a Board member's spouse/registered domestic partner has been a district employee for at least one year prior to the Board member's election or appointment. (Government Code 1091.5)

includes, but is not limited to, any of the following:

#### (Government Code 1091.5)

- 1. That of an officer who is being reimbursed for his/her actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of an official duty.
- 2. That of a recipient of public services generally provided by the public body or board of which he/she is a member, on the same terms and conditions as if he or she were not a member of the Board.
- 3. That of a landlord or tenant of the contracting party if such contracting party is the federal government or any federal department or agency, this state or an adjoining state, any department or agency of this state or an adjoining state, any county or city of this state or an adjoining state, or any public corporation or special, judicial or other public district of this state or an adjoining state unless the subject matter of such contract is the property in which such officer or employee has such interest as landlord or tenant in which even his/her interest shall be deemed a remote interest within the meaning of, and subject to, the provisions of Government Code 1091.
- 4. That of a spouse of an officer or employee of the District if his/her spouse's employment or office holding has existed for at least one year prior to his/her election or appointment.
- 5. That of a non-salaried member of a nonprofit corporation, provided that such interest is disclosed to the Board at the time of the first consideration of the contract, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records.
- 6. That of a non-compensated officer of a nonprofit, tax exempt corporation which, as one of its primary purposes, supports the functions of the nonprofit board or to which the school board has legal obligation to give particular consideration, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records.
- 7. That of a person receiving salary, per diem, or reimbursement for expenses from a governmental entity, unless the contract directly involves the department of the government entity that employs the officer or employee, provided that such interest is disclosed to the Board at the time of consideration of the contract, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records.
- 8. That of an attorney of the contracting party or that of an owner, officer, employee or agent of a firm which renders, or has rendered, service to the contracting party in the capacity of stockbroker, insurance agent, insurance broker, real estate agent, or real estate broker, if these individuals have not received and will not receive remuneration, consideration, or a commission as a result of the contract and if these individuals have an ownership interest of less than 10 percent in the law practice or firm, stock brokerage firm, insurance firm or real estate firm.

In addition, a Board member or employee shall not be deemed to be interested in a contract made pursuant to competitive bidding under a procedure established by law if his/her sole interest is that of

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an officer, director, or employee of a bank or savings and loan association with which a party to the contract has the relationship of borrower or depositor, debtor or creditor. (Government Code 1091.5)

A Board member shall not be deemed considered to be financially interested in a contract if he/she has only a "remote interest" in the contract as specified in Government Code 1091 and if the remote interest is disclosed during a Board meeting and noted in the official Board minutes. The affected Board member shall not vote or debate on the matter or attempt to influence any other Board member to enter into the contract. (Government Code 1091) Remote interests are specified in Government Code 1091(b); they include, but are not limited to, the interest of a parent in the earnings of his/her minor child. (Government Code 1091)

A Board member may be able to enter into a contract if the rule of necessity or legally required participation applies as defined in Government Code 87101. Legal counsel should be consulted, however, in such situations.

Even if there is not a prohibited or remoteconflict of interest, a Board member shall abstain from voting on personnel matters that uniquely affect his/her a-relatives. However, a of the Board member. A Board member may vote, however, on collective bargaining agreements and personnel matters that affect a class of employees to which his/her the relative belongs. "Relative" means an adult who is related to the person Board member by blood or affinity within the third degree, as determined by the common law, or an individual in an adoptive relationship within the third degree. (Education Code 35107)

A relationship within the third degree includes thean individual's parents, grandparents, and greatgrandparents, children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, brothers, sisters, aunts, and uncles, nieces, and nephews, and the similar family of the individual's spouse/registered domestic partner unless the individual is widowed or divorced.

#### COMMON LAW DOCTRICT AGAINST CONFLICT OF INTEREST

A Board member shall abstain from any official action in which his/her private or personal interest may conflict with his/her official duties.

#### **RULE OF NECESSITY OR LEGALLY REQUIRED PARTICIPATION**

On a case-by-case basis and upon advice of legal counsel, a Board member with a financial interest in a contract may participate in the making of the contract if the rule of necessity or legally required participation applies pursuant to Government Code 87101 and 2 CCR 18708.

#### **INCOMPATIBLE OFFICES AND ACTIVITIES**

Board members shall not engage in any employment or activity or hold any office which is inconsistent with, incompatible with, in conflict with, or inimical to the Board member's duties as an officer of the district. (Government Code 1099, 1126)

#### **GIFTS**

Board members and designated employees may accept gifts only under the conditions and limitations specified in Government Code 89503 and 2 CCR 18730.

The limitations on gifts does not apply to wedding gifts and gifts exchanged between individuals on birthdays, holidays and other similar occasions, provided that the gifts exchanged are not substantially

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disproportionate in value. (Government Code 89503)

Gifts of travel and related lodging and subsistence shall be subject to the prevailing current gift limitation except as described in Government Code 89506.

A gift of travel does not include travel provided by the district for Board members and designated employees. (Government Code 89506)

#### **HONORARIA**

Board members and designated employees shall not accept any honorarium, which is defined as any payment made in consideration for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private gathering, in accordance with law. (Government Codes 89501, 89502)

The term honorarium does not include:

(Government Code 89501)

- 1. Earned income for personal services customarily provided in connection with a bona fide business, trade or profession unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade or profession is making speeches.
- 2. Any honorarium which is not used and, within 30 days after receipt, is either returned to the donor or delivered to the district for donation into the general fund without being claimed as a deduction from income for tax purposes.

Designated persons in this category must report:

- a. Interests in real property located entirely or partly within District boundaries, or within two miles of District boundaries or of any land owned or used by the District. Such interests include any leasehold, beneficial or ownership interest or option to acquire such interest in real property.
- b. Investments or business positions in or income from sources which:
  - (1) Are engaged in the acquisition or disposal of real property within the District,
  - (2) Are contractors or subcontractors which are or have been within the past two years engaged in work or services of the type used by the District, or
  - (3) Manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery or equipment of the type used by the District.
- 2. Persons occupying the following positions are designated employees in Category 2:

Director

Principal

**Assistant Principal** 

**Program Coordinator** 

**Project Specialist** 

Supervisor

Designated persons in this category must report investments or business positions in or income from sources which:

a. Are contractors or subcontractors engaged in work or services of the type used by the department which the designated person manages or directs, or

- b. Manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery or equipment of the type used by the department which the designated person manages or directs. For the purposes of this category, a principal's department is his/her entire school. Consultants are designated employees who must disclose financial interests as determined on a case-by-case basis by the Superintendent or designee. The Superintendent or designee's written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements based upon that description. All such determinations are public records and shall be retained for public inspection along with this conflict of interest code.
- 3. A consultant is an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the District, makes a governmental decision whether to:

(2 CCR 18701)

- a. Approve a rate, rule or regulation.
- b. Adopt or enforce a law.
- c. Issue, deny, suspend or revoke a permit, license, application, certificate, approval, order or similar authorization or entitlement.
- d. Authorize the District to enter into, modify or renew a contract that requires District approval.
- e. Grant District approval to a contract or contract specifications which require District approval and in which the District is a party.
- f. Grant District approval to a plan, design, report, study or similar item.
- g. Adopt or grant District approval of District policies, standards or guidelines.

A consultant is also an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the District, serves in a staff capacity with the District and in that capacity participates in making a governmental decision as defined in 2 CCR 18702.2, or performs the same or substantially all the same duties for the District that would otherwise be performed by an individual holding a position specified in the District's Conflict of Interest Code. (2 CCR 18701)
