

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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Due to potential contract issues raised by the Davis v. Fresno matter, staff and district counsel conducted a review of the District's Lease/Leaseback contracts. In review, staff noted the single Lease-Leaseback Contract approved, but not issued to Gilbane in May 2015, for the San Dieguito High School Academy Math and Science Building. As a result, the contract was not formally executed, and on July 7, 2015, staff moved to conduct a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for construction management (CM) services district wide to deliver projects, including the Math and Science Building, via a CM multiprime or CM At Risk model to the existing pool of builders. Of the four responses received on August 3, 2015, the top two firms were selected to participate in the related Request for Proposals (RFP) and interview process on August 14, 2015. The most responsive and lowest proposer was determined to be Erickson-Hall Construction Co.

The past performance and ongoing services performed by Erickson-Hall Construction Co. continues to be outstanding, and therefore, it is staff's recommendation that Erickson-Hall provide construction services to the District under a Construction Management Multi-Prime contractual arrangement for the construction of the San Dieguito High School Academy Math & Science Building Project.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Board approve the agreement for Erickson-Hall Construction Co., to provide construction management services for the San Dieguito High School Academy Math & Science Building Project, during the period September 4, 2015 through completion, in the amount of \$1,320,142.00, plus construction management fee

of 2.94% of trade package value and authorize Christina M. Bennett, Eric R. Dill, or Rick Schmitt to execute the agreement.

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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Education Code §60119 requires that the district hold a public hearing and determine through a Board resolution whether each pupil in the district has sufficient textbooks and/or instructional materials. In addition to determining sufficiency of books/materials for the core academic courses of mathematics, science, history/social science and English, school Boards are also asked to determine the sufficiency of instructional materials for foreign language and health courses, and the availability of science laboratory equipment in grades 9-12.

There is expected to be no funding from the State for 2015-16 for instructional materials. The district continues to be responsible, however, even without State funding, for ensuring that adequate instructional materials are available. All students will continue to be provided with e-book access / textbooks for math, science, history/social science and English/language arts instructional materials, all of which are aligned with the California State content standards. In 2004, all students enrolled in foreign language courses were provided with newly adopted textbooks and instructional materials. In 2005, all Health textbooks were replaced. In 2006, new history/social science textbooks were adopted. In 2007, science textbooks were adopted, and in 2008, all math books were replaced. With the absence of funding, the State has allowed school districts to postpone their English / Language Arts books and materials adoption for several years. The district purchased novels for each grade level in 2011-12 and will continue to replace lost, stolen and damaged textbooks with e-book access as needed.

The district last received state funds specifically for science equipment in the 2000-01 school year. Since that time, parent donations, district contributions and site budgets have been used to purchase, upgrade, and maintain science equipment.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Board 1) hold a public hearing, asking for public comments, and 2) adopt the Resolution, Sufficiency of Instructional Materials, 2015-16, declaring that sufficient science laboratory equipment, up-to-date textbooks, and instructional materials are present in our district classrooms for use by district staff and students, as shown in the attached supplement.

# CONTRACT FOR EMPLOYMENT OF SUPERINTENDENT BETWEEN THE SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT AND RICK SCHMITT

THIS AGREEMENT is hereby made and entered into this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of September, 2015, by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION ("Board") of SAN DIEGUITO UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT ("District") and Rick Schmitt ("Superintendent" or "Rick Schmitt").

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. <u>Superintendent, Chief Executive Officer, and Secretary for the Board:</u> Rick Schmitt is hereby employed as the District's Superintendent. Rick Schmitt also shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the District and shall serve as Secretary to the Board. By accepting this employment, Rick Schmitt agrees to devote his full time, best efforts and abilities to performing the duties and responsibilities as provided herein or as assigned to the Superintendent from time to time by the Board.

## 2. Terms of Employment:

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 20142015, through June 30, 20172018.

## 3. General Terms and Conditions of Employment:

This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws of the State of California, and the rules and regulations of the California State Board of Education and the District. Said laws, rules and regulations are hereby made a part of the terms and conditions of this Agreement as though herein set forth.

## 4. <u>Powers and Duties:</u>

The Superintendent shall perform all of the powers and duties of a Superintendent of Schools in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations set forth above. All powers and duties legally delegated to the Superintendent are to be executed in accordance with the policies and regulations adopted by the Board. Acts which require ratification by the Board shall be referred to the Board at the earliest opportunity.

The Superintendent's duties and functions shall include the following:

- A. The Superintendent shall be delegated all powers and duties necessary for efficient management and administration of the District to the full extend permitted by law. The Superintendent shall have the authority to organize and arrange the administrative and supervisory staff, including instruction, business, and operational affairs, which in his best judgment best serves the District. The responsibility for selection, placement, and transfer of existing personnel shall be vested in the Superintendent. Employment of new personnel will be recommended by the Superintendent subject to approval by the Board. In the event the Board does not approve the Superintendent's personnel recommendations, the Superintendent shall submit an alternative recommendation.
- B. Working generally with the Board, District personnel, parents and the public, assist in the effort to develop short- and long-range District goals with criteria for determining effective achievement and evaluating outcomes, which may be incorporated into the goals and objectives of the District's strategic plan.
- C. Represent the interests of the Board and the District in day-to-day contact with parents, other citizens, community and governmental agencies.

- D. Provide leadership, guidelines and direction to ensure that policies related to curriculum, instruction, pupil personnel services, personnel, budget and business affairs are carried out.
- E. Report regularly to the Board information regarding student learning and an analysis of student achievement and test scores.
- F. Review all policies adopted by the Board and make appropriate recommendations to the Board for additions, deletions or modifications.
- G. Evaluate employees directly accountable to the Superintendent and oversee the evaluation of other employees as defined by California law and Board policy.
  - H. Provide leadership and direction in planning and financing school facilities.
- I. Advise the Board and make recommendations regarding possible sources of funds which may be available to implement present or contemplated District programs.
- J. Endeavor to maintain and improve the Superintendent's professional competency including reading appropriate periodicals and joining and/or participating in appropriate professional associations and their activities.
- K. Establish and maintain an effective community relations program including effective relationships with the media.
- L. Communicate openly, systematically and in a timely manner to the Board, staff and the community, and promptly inform the Board of critical issues or incidents.
  - M. Provide educational leadership to ensure quality teaching and learning.
- N. In addition, the Superintendent shall perform all other duties and functions as assigned or required by the Board.
- O. Serve as liaison to the Board with respect to all matters of employer-employee relations and make recommendations to the Board concerning those matters.
- P. Unless unavoidably detained, or otherwise directed by the Board, attend all regular, special and executive session meetings of the Board.

## 5. Board-Superintendent Relations:

The Superintendent shall work with the Board in developing and maintaining a spirit of cooperation and teamwork. The Board shall be responsible for formulating and adopting policy and for taking action on matters which, by law, require Board action. Administrative responsibility and commensurate authority for administering the school system will be delegated by the Board as the board deems appropriate to the Superintendent. The Board shall provide the Superintendent with periodic opportunities to discuss Board-Superintendent relationships as they relate to the Board's productivity and the effectiveness of the Superintendent's leadership. It is agreed that the Board, individually and collectively, generally will refer promptly to the Superintendent for study and recommendation, criticism, complaints and suggestions brought to the attention of the Board or any member thereof.

The Board recognizes that it is a collective body and each Board member recognizes that his/her power as a Board member is derived from the collective deliberation and action of the Board as a whole in a duly constituted meeting. Individual Board members will not give direction to the Superintendent or any staff member regarding the management of the District or the solution of specific

problems. It is agreed that the Board, individually and collectively, will refer promptly to the Superintendent for study and recommendation, criticism, complaints and suggestions brought to the attention of the Board or any member thereof.

The Board shall hold the Superintendent accountable to manage the District consistent with Board-approved policies, which establish the Board's expectations. It is through Board Policy and official Board action that the Board gives direction to the Superintendent.

The Superintendent will be held responsible for establishing programs and services (after Board review) and for managing the District to meet the Board's expected outcomes, including the provision of data from which the Board can evaluate the District's achievements. Thus, the Board by exercising its governance and policy-making role can be assured that it determines what it is the District should accomplish and whether, in fact, the District is accomplishing it.

## 6. <u>Evaluations:</u>

- A. The Board and the Superintendent shall agree upon a written evaluation format which shall be used during the Term.
- B. On or before November 1 of each year, the Superintendent shall submit to the Board an analysis of District needs and recommendations for priority goals and tasks to be addressed by the Superintendent. These priority goals and tasks shall be reduced to writing and will be among the criteria by which the Superintendent is evaluated pursuant to this Article. The Board and Superintendent shall confer regarding these priority goals and tasks and agree upon the criteria and procedures to be used for the Superintendent's formal evaluation. Either or both parties may seek and retain the aid of a qualified impartial facilitator agreeable to both parties to endeavor to reach agreement upon the criteria to be used for the formal evaluation.
- C. The Superintendent shall provide the Board with a mid-year progress report summarizing his progress toward meeting the goals and tasks developed pursuant to this Article. The Board shall conduct an informal progress assessment of the Superintendent on or before December 31 each year.
- D. The Board shall conduct a formal written evaluation of the Superintendent, which shall be completed by June 30 of each year, unless another date is mutually agreed upon by the Board and the Superintendent. A copy of the written evaluation shall be delivered to the Superintendent within twenty (20) days of its completion. The Superintendent shall have the right to make a written response to the evaluation. Within 30 days of the Board's delivery of the written evaluation, the Board and the Superintendent shall meet to discuss the formal evaluation. The Board shall also devote a portion of, or all, of one meeting at least annually to a discussion of the working relationship between the Superintendent and the Board.
- E. If the Board concludes that the Superintendent's performance is unsatisfactory, the Board shall identify in writing specific areas where improvement is required, provide written recommendations for improvement, and notify the Superintendent that another evaluation will be conducted within six months. Such written recommendations and specifications for improvement shall be provided within 30 days of the date of the evaluation.
- F. An evaluation shall be deemed to be "satisfactory" if a majority of Board members have rated the Superintendent's performance as satisfactory in individual evaluations prepared by such Board members.
- G. At least once a year, the parties shall meet to discuss possible modification to this Article.

## 7. Compensation:

A. Effective July 1, 20142015, the Superintendent shall receive annual salary (\$220,000) and longevity benefits in accordance with the Management Salary Schedule, set forth in Attachment A to Board Policy 4341.1, which is incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein. The Superintendent shall be paid in twelve (12) approximately equal monthly installments. Any adjustments in salary during the term of this Agreement must be mutually agreed to in writing, shall take the form of a written amendment hereto, and shall not operate as a termination or increase the term of this Agreement.

## 8. <u>Professional Schedule, Fringe Benefits and Sick Leave:</u>

- A. The Superintendent is a full-time management employee and shall have a two hundred twenty-three (223) day positive work year each school year during the term of this Agreement. All other days are considered non-work days. When the Superintendent determines to be absent for five (5) or more consecutive days off of work, he shall give notice in advance to the Board President. The Superintendent shall also be entitled to take all paid holidays provided other District management employees.
- B. The Superintendent shall be entitled to receive all fringe benefits, including group health and welfare benefits, which are provided to the District's certificated management employees. If the Superintendent retires from the District into STRS, he shall be entitled to receive individual coverage under a District health plan at the expense of the District as follows: (1) one year of postretirement health and welfare benefits for each year served as District Superintendent or (2) until Medicare benefits become available to the retired Superintendent, whichever period is shorter. This benefit will not be available during any period of time in which the Superintendent is employed and receiving health and welfare benefits pursuant to such employment.
- C. The Superintendent shall be required to render twelve (12) months of full and regular service to the District during each annual period covered by this Agreement and shall be entitled to 24 days of vacation, which shall accrue at a rate of two days per month of service. Each school year, the Superintendent may use his current year's vacation entitlement in advance of its actual accrual; however, should the Superintendent's employment terminate for any reason before that used vacation has accrued, the compensation previously paid to him on account of the use of unaccrued vacation will be deducted from his final paycheck. The Board prefers that the Superintendent take his allotted annual vacation days; however, it is recognized that there may be unforeseen circumstances that may inhibit the Superintendent from taking all vacation days during the school year. Therefore, for the duration of this Agreement, unused and unpaid vacation days may be allowed to accrue up to a maximum of forty-eight (48) days. Once the maximum of forty-eight (48) accrued vacation days has accrued, then further accrual of vacation days will cease until accumulated vacation is used so as to reduce the number of unused accumulated days below forty-eight (48). At that time, vacation accrual will recommence, until a maximum accrual of forty-eight (48) days is again reached.
- D. The Superintendent shall be credited annually with twelve (12) days of earned sick leave. Sick leave shall be accrued and accumulated as provided by the Education Code and Board rules and regulations.
- E. The Superintendent shall report to the Board, in writing on an annual basis, his use of sick leave and vacation days.
- F. The Superintendent will pay his (employee) share of STRS and the District will pay its (employer) share of STRS.

## 9. Expenses:

- A. The District shall pay the Superintendent for all actual and necessary travel and other District and school business-related expenses incurred by him in the conduct of his duties on behalf of the District.
- B. The District shall pay for the services of a professional career coach for one year, in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000).
- GB. The District encourages the Superintendent to participate in professional and community organizations and activities. The District shall pay the Superintendent's annual professional membership dues in ACSA (Association of California School Administrators), or other similar statewide organization, AASA (American Academy of School Administrators), or other state or national organization. In addition, the District shall pay the Superintendent's annual membership dues in other professional and community service organizations as may be approved by the Board in a total amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750) while he is rendering services under this Agreement.
- DC. The Superintendent is expected to attend appropriate professional meetings at the local, county, state and national levels. Approval of the Board shall be obtained when the Superintendent attends conferences outside the State of California, and all actual and necessary expenses of attendance shall be paid by the District. In case of an emergency attendance requirement, the President of the Board will be notified and the expenses will be submitted for ratification at the next appropriate Board meeting.
- ED. The Superintendent may engage in outside professional activities, including consulting, speaking, writing and participating in professional associations related to education, provided said activities do not interfere with the Superintendent's duties. Days spent on such endeavors shall not be counted as working days by the Superintendent.

## 10. Physical Examination:

The Superintendent agrees to have an annual physical examination as requested by the Board. Any expense beyond that paid by District insurance will be borne by the District. The physician's report of the Superintendent's physical examination shall be filed with the President of the Board, or the President's designee, and be treated as confidential information by the Board. At the discretion of the Board, the Board shall be advised in writing by the examining physician of the current physical fitness of the Superintendent to perform his duties. The Superintendent agrees to execute any necessary documents to release this information to the Board.

## 11. <u>Termination:</u>

A. The Board may elect to terminate the Agreement prior to its expiration without cause upon forty-five (45) days written notice to the Superintendent. In such an event and in acknowledgement of the difficulty or impossibility of calculating damages to the Superintendent as a result of such termination, the parties agree that in the event of the Superintendent's termination other than for cause (as defined in paragraph B below) the liquidated amount of damages owed by the Board shall be the base salary, as set forth in section 7 (A) above, remaining to be paid during the full term of this Agreement, up to a maximum of eighteen (18) months. No additional sick leave shall accumulate after the date of termination. The salary payment of the severance package shall be paid within thirty (30) days from the date of termination. In the event Superintendent agrees to be reassigned to another position in the District upon termination of this Agreement, the above liquidated severance package shall be offset by Superintendent's salary in the new position. The parties agree that this provision, and

subdivision (B), below, meet the requirements governing maximum cash settlements as set forth in Government Code sections 53260, et seq.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, if the Board believes, and subsequently confirms through an independent audit, that the Superintendent has engaged in fraud, misappropriation of funds, or other illegal fiscal practices, then the Board may terminate the Superintendent and the Superintendent shall not be entitled to the cash, salary payments, health benefits or other non-cash settlement as set forth above. This provision, and subdivision (B), below, are intended to implement the requirements of Government Code section 53260(b). The provisions of Government Code section 53260 are incorporated into this Agreement by this reference.

- B. In the event of a termination without cause, the Superintendent shall continue to receive health and welfare benefits (medical only) for the full remaining term of this Agreement, up to a maximum of twelve (12) months. No other fringe benefits, including but not limited to travel or mileage reimbursement (Section 9.A) and the professional membership dues (section 9.B) shall be earned, accrued, or paid after the date of termination.
- C. The Governing Board may elect to terminate the Superintendent's Agreement for cause at anytime. For the purposes of this Agreement, "cause" shall exist if Superintendent: (1) acts in bad faith to the detriment of the District; (2) refuses or fails to act in accordance with a specific provision of this Agreement or direction or order of a majority of the Board; (3) exhibits misconduct or dishonesty in regard to his employment; (4) is convicted of a crime involving dishonesty, breach of trust, or physical or emotional harm to any person; (5) is unable to perform any of the essential functions of his position; or (6) fails to receive a satisfactory or better rating in any annual formal Board evaluation. The existence of such cause shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement and shall extinguish all rights and duties hereunder. In the event such cause exists, the Governing Board shall give the Superintendent (a) written notice of the proposed action and the reasons therefor; (b) a reasonably detailed account of the charges and the materials upon which the proposed action is based; (c) notice of the right to respond orally or in writing to the Board; and (d) the right to a meeting with the Board. Any request for a meeting shall be filed by the Superintendent with the presiding officer of the Board within ten (10) days after service of the notice of proposed action. The meeting, if requested, shall be held in closed session at the next regular or special Board meeting, and in no event more than thirtyfive (35) days after service of the notice of proposed action. The Superintendent and the Board shall each have the right to be represented by counsel at their own expense. The Superintendent shall have a reasonable opportunity to respond to all matters raised in the charges. The meeting shall be conducted by the Board and shall not be an evidentiary hearing and neither party shall have the opportunity to call witnesses. After the meeting, the Board shall issue a decision in the form of a resolution either rescinding or confirming the charges and specifying the action to be taken. The Superintendent shall be notified in writing within five (5) days of the decision. The decision of the Board The Superintendent's meeting with the Board shall be deemed to satisfy the Superintendent's entitlement to due process of law and shall be the Superintendent's exclusive right to any conference or hearing otherwise required by law. The Superintendent waives any other rights that may be applicable to this termination for cause proceeding with the understanding that completion of this hearing exhausts the Superintendent's administrative remedies.
- D. District and Superintendent agree that the payment provided under Section 11.A of this Agreement shall constitute the exclusive and sole remedy of any kind for any termination of his employment and the Superintendent agrees and covenants not to assert or pursue any other remedies of any kind, whether they be administrative, at law or in equity, with respect to any termination of his employment. Specifically, upon acceptance of payment under 11.A the Superintendent agrees to waive and release the District from any claims and/or causes of action against the District or Board in any way related to his employment by the Board, including but not limited to claims or actions under this Agreement.

E. Upon written evaluation by a licensed physician designated by the Board indicating the inability of the Superintendent to perform any of the essential functions of the position, with or without reasonable accommodation, this Agreement may be terminated by the Board upon written notice to the Superintendent and after providing a reasonable opportunity to respond. The Board may, in its sole discretion, allow the Superintendent to continue in employment until expiration of current and accumulated sick leave and differential leave, but upon receipt of the written evaluation specified above, may immediately assign another employee the duties of Superintendent.

## 12. Notice of Finalist in Search:

In all cases the Superintendent immediately shall notify the Board of Education should he become a finalist in the selection process for Superintendent with any other District.

## 13. Waiver:

No waiver of any breach of any term or provision of this Agreement shall be construed to be, nor shall it be, a waiver of any other breach of this Agreement. No waiver shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the party waiving the breach.

## 14. Modification:

This Agreement may not be amended or modified other than by a written agreement executed by the Superintendent and approved and signed by the Board.

#### 15. Complete Agreement:

This instrument constitutes and contains the entire agreement and understanding between the parties concerning the Superintendent's employment with the District. This instrument supersedes and replaces all prior negotiations and all agreements proposed or otherwise, whether written or oral, concerning the subject matter hereof. This is an integrated document.

## 16. Governing Law:

This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws of the State of California, to the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education, and to the lawful rules and regulations of the San Dieguito Union High School District Board of Education. By this reference the laws, rules, regulations, and policies are hereby made a part of this Agreement as though set forth in full at this point. In the event of a conflict of provisions, the laws of the State of California and the terms of this Agreement take precedence over any inconsistent provisions found in the policies and regulations of the Board of the District.

## 17. Construction:

Each party has cooperated in the drafting and preparation of this Agreement. Hence, in any construction to be made of this Agreement, the same shall not be construed against any party on the basis that the party was the drafter. The captions of this Agreement are not part of the provisions hereof and shall have no force or effect.

## 18. Communications:

All notices, requests, demands and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered or if mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepared, addressed to the Superintendent and/or Board of Education at 710 Encinitas Blvd., Encinitas, CA 92024. Either party may change the address at which notice shall be given by written notice given in the above manner.

## 19. Execution:

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Photographic copies of such signed counterparts may be used in lieu of the originals for any purpose.

#### 20. Legal Counsel:

The Superintendent and the Board each recognize that in entering into this Agreement, the parties have relied upon the advice of their own attorneys, who are attorneys of their own choice, and that the terms of this Agreement have been completely read and explained to them by their attorneys, and that those terms are fully understood and voluntarily accepted by them.

## 21. Savings Clause:

If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications and the provisions of this agreement are declared to be severable.

#### **EDUCATION FOR ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS**

The Governing Board intends to provide English language learners with challenging curriculum and instruction that develops proficiency in English as effectively and efficiently as possible in order to assist students in accessing the full educational program and achieving the district's academic standards. The district's program shall be based on sound educational theory and shall be adequately supported so that English language learners can achieve results at the same academic level as their English-proficient peers in the regular course of study.

The district shall identify in its local control and accountability plan (LCAP) specific actions and services to enhance student engagement, academic achievement, and other outcomes for English learners.

The Board encourages staff to exchange information with other districts and the County Office of Education about programs, options, and strategies for English language learners that succeed under various demographic conditions.

English learners shall be provided English language development instruction targeted to their English proficiency level and aligned with the state content standards and curriculum framework. The district's program shall be based on sound instructional theory, use standards-aligned instructional materials, and assist students in accessing the full educational program.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all staff employed to teach English learners possess the appropriate authorization from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide to teachers, administrators, and other school staff research-based professional development that is designed to improve the instruction and assessment of English learners and enhance staff's ability to understand and use curricula, assessment, and instructional strategies for English learners.

#### **Identification and Assessment**

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures which provide for the accurate identification of English learners and an assessment of their proficiency and needs in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English. Once identified as an English learner, a student shall be annually assessed for language proficiency until he/she is reclassified based on criteria specified in the accompanying administrative regulation.

English learners' academic achievement in English language arts, mathematics, science, and any additional subject required by law shall be assessed using the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress. As necessary, the test shall be administered with allowable testing variations in accordance with 5 CCR 853.5 and 853.7. English learners who are in their first 12 months of attending a school in the United States shall be exempted from taking the English language arts assessment to the extent allowed by federal law.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures which provide for the identification, assessment and placement of English language learners and for their re-designation based on criteria adopted by the Board and specified in administrative regulations.

# INSTRUCTION

To evaluate program effectiveness, the Superintendent or designee shall regularly examine program results, including reports of the English language learners' academic achievement, their progress towards proficiency in English and the progress of students who have been re-designated as fluent English proficient as delineated in the San Dieguito Union High School District Master Plan for English Learners. The Superintendent or designee shall annually report these findings to the Board and shall also provide the Board with regular reports from any district or school wide English learner advisory committees.

#### **TYPE OF INSTRUCTION**

Students who are English language learners shall be educated through "sheltered English Immersion" not normally intended to exceed one year. "Nearly all" of the classroom instruction in the district's sheltered English immersion program shall be in English, but with curriculum and presentation designed for students who are learning the language (Education Code 305, 306)

The district has defined the term "nearly all" as follows:

"Nearly all" as it pertains to the use of English in the sheltered immersion program is a minimum of seventy percent of the instructional day must be in English.

When an English language learner has acquired a reasonable level of English proficiency as measured by the California English Language Development Test (CELDT) he/she shall be transferred from a structured English immersion classroom to an English language mainstream classroom in accordance with the district master plan for English language learners. Instruction in the English language mainstream program is "overwhelmingly" in English. (Education Code 305; 5 CCR 11301)

An English language learner has acquired a "reasonable level of English proficiency" when he/she has achieved the following:

"Reasonable level of English proficiency" as it pertains to English language learners in the San Dieguito Union High School District is a California English Language Development Test (CELDT) overall proficiency

level of Early Advanced and no lower than Intermediate in any one CELDT sub-test.

Upon request of her/his parent/guardian, a student shall be placed in an English language mainstream classroom. (5 CCR 11301)

#### **PARENTAL EXCEPTION WAIVERS**

At any time during the school year, the parent/guardian of an English language learner may have her/his child moved into an English language mainstream program. Parent/guardian requests for waivers from Education Code 305 regarding placement from a sheltered immersion program to placement in an alternative program shall be granted in accordance with the law and administrative regulation.

If the Superintendent or designee denies the waiver request, she/he shall provide a written justification to the parent/guardian describing the reasons for the denial. A parent/guardian may appeal the Superintendent's decision in writing to the Board. The Board may consider the matter at its next regular Board meeting. If the Board hears the appeal, the Superintendent shall send the Board's decision to the parent/guardian within seven working days.

#### **PROGRAM EVALUATION**

To evaluate the effectiveness of the district's educational program for English learners, the Superintendent or designee shall report to the Board, at least annually, regarding:

- 1. Progress of English learners towards proficiency in English
- 2. The number and percentage of English learners reclassified as fluent English proficient
- 3. The number and percentage of English learners who are or are at risk of being classified as long-term English learners in accordance with Education Code 313.1
- 4. The achievement of English learners on standards-based tests in core curricular areas
- 5. Progress toward any other goals for English learners identified in the district's LCAP
- 6. A comparison of current data with data from at least the previous year.

The Superintendent or designee also shall provide the Board with regular reports from any district or schoolwide English learner advisory committees.



#### STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS AND EQUAL ACCESS

Student organizations have an important place in the educational program. When properly organized and operated, they:

- 1. Extend and reinforce the instructional program.
- 2. Give students practice in democratic self-government.
- 3. Build student morale and positive support for the school.
- 4. Honor outstanding student achievement.
- 5. Provide wholesome social and recreational activities.

School-sponsored organizations must be organized at the school, sponsored by school personnel, composed completely of current student body members, hold the majority of their meetings at school and have a democratic plan for the selection of members. Organizational activities shall not conflict with the authority and responsibilities of school officials.

#### LIMITED OPEN FORUM

District high schools (San Dieguito Academy, Torrey Pines, La Costa Canyon and Sunset High Schools) shall maintain a limited open forum during which students may hold meetings or activities not directly related to the school curriculum. The principal shall schedule this forum on non-instructional time so that it in no way interferes with regular school activities.

The Board shall not deny access to any student-initiated group on the basis of religious, political, philosophical or any other content to be addressed at such meetings.

The Superintendent or designee shall insure that meetings held within the limited open forum are voluntary and student-initiated, with no direction, control, or regular attendance by non-school persons.

School staff shall not promote or participate in these meetings, but may be assigned to simply observe them, provided that the meeting does not conflict with the staff member's beliefs.

Meetings held within the limited open forum shall entail no expenditure of public funds beyond the incidental cost of providing the meeting space. Any announcement of meetings shall clearly state that the group is not sponsored by the school or school staff.

Authorization of use under the federal Equal Access Act does not indicate that the Board approves or advocates matters which are discussed at open forum meetings. Furthermore, religious groups granted access pursuant to the Equal Access Act are granted access only pursuant to that Act. Such access does not constitute district sanction of any particular religious belief.

#### STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

The superintendent shall prepare administrative regulations to implement a limited open forum at the district's high schools.

#### **HAZING**

No student shall conspire to engage in hazing, participate in hazing, or commit any act that causes or is likely to cause bodily danger, physical harm, or personal degradation or disgrace resulting in physical or mental harm to any fellow student or other person. The Governing Board believes that all students deserve an education that matches their abilities. The district shall participate in the California Gifted and Talented Pupil Program in order to give gifted and talented students opportunities to acquire skills and understanding at levels commensurate with their potential. By cultivating their exceptional abilities or talents, these students may contribute significantly to our society's progress in diverse fields.

#### STUDENT AND FAMILY PRIVACY RIGHTS

The Governing Board respects the rights of district students and their parents/guardians with regard to the privacy of their personal beliefs and the confidentiality of their personal information. The Superintendent or designee shall develop regulations to ensure compliance with law when the district requests, retains, discloses, or otherwise uses the personal information of its students and their families.

The regulations shall, at a minimum, address the following: (20 USC 1232h)

- 1. Whether the district may collect the personal information of students for marketing or sale
- 2. How the district will administer surveys that may request information about the personal beliefs and practices of students and their families
- 3. The rights of parents/guardians to inspect:
  - a. Survey instruments requesting information about their personal beliefs and practices or those of their children
  - b. Instructional materials used as part of their children's educational curriculum
- 4. Whether the district may administer any nonemergency invasive physical examination or screening
- 5. Notifications that the district will provide to students and parents/guardians with respect to their privacy rights

The Superintendent or designee shall consult with parents/guardians regarding the development of the procedures. (20 USC 1232h).

### STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS AND EQUAL ACCESS

Student organizations have an important place in the educational program. When properly organized and operated, they:

- 1. Extend and reinforce the instructional program.
- 2. Give students practice in democratic self-government.
- 3. Build student morale and positive support for the school.
- 4. Honor outstanding student achievement.
- 5. Provide wholesome social and recreational activities.

School sponsored organizations must be organized at the school, sponsored by school personnel, composed completely of current student body members, hold the majority of their meetings at school and have a democratic plan for the selection of members. Organizational activities shall not conflict with the authority and responsibilities of school officials.

#### **LIMITED OPEN FORUM**

District schools shall maintain a limited open forum during which students may hold meetings or activities not directly related to the school curriculum. The principal shall schedule this forum on non-instructional time so that it in no way interferes with regular school activities. The meetings shall not materially and substantially interfere with the orderly conduct of educational activities within the school.

The Board shall not deny access to any student initiated group on the basis of religious, political, philosophical or any other content to be addressed at such meetings.

The Superintendent or designee shall insure that meetings held within the limited open forum are voluntary and student initiated, with no direction, control, or regular attendance by non-school persons.

There shall be no sponsorship of limited open forum meetings by the school or staff. The term sponsorship means that school staff are promoting, leading, or participating in a meeting. The assignment of a teacher, administrator, or other school employee to a meeting for custodial purposes shall not constitute sponsorship of the meeting. Employees of the school shall be present at religious meetings only in a nonparticipatory capacity.

Meetings held within the limited open forum shall entail no expenditure of public funds beyond the incidental cost of providing the meeting space. All student clubs or groups shall have equal access to the school media to announce meetings, including the public address system, the school newspaper, bulletin boards, and school web site. However, the principal or designee may issue a disclaimer that such activities are not school sponsored

Authorization of use under the federal Equal Access Act does not indicate that the Board approves or advocates matters which are discussed at open forum meetings. Furthermore, religious groups granted access pursuant to the Equal Access Act are granted access only pursuant to that Act. Such access does not constitute district sanction of any particular religious belief.

#### STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

The superintendent shall prepare administrative regulations to implement a limited open forum at the

#### **HAZING**

No student shall conspire to engage in hazing, participate in hazing, or commit any act that causes or is likely to cause bodily danger, physical harm, or personal degradation or disgrace resulting in physical or mental harm to any fellow student or other person. #### PARENTAL NOTIFICATIONS

The Governing Board recognizes that notifications are essential to effective communication between the school and the home. The Superintendent or designee shall send students and parents/guardians all notifications required by law, including notifications about their legal rights, and any other notifications he/she believes will promote parental understanding and involvement.

The notice required pursuant to Education Code 48980 shall be sent at the beginning of each academic year and may be provided either by regular mail, in electronic form when so requested by the parent/guardian, or by any other method normally used to communicate with parents/guardians in writing. (Education Code 48981, 48982)

If any activity specified in Education Code 48980 will be undertaken by any school during the forthcoming school term, the notice shall state that fact and the approximate date on which any such activity will occur. No such activity shall be undertaken with respect to any particular student unless his/her parent/guardian has been informed of such action through the annual notification or other separate special notification. (Education Code 48983-48984)

The annual notification shall include a request that the parent/guardian sign the notice and return it to the school or, if the notice is provided in electronic format, that the parent/guardian submit a signed acknowledgment of receipt of the notice to the school. The parent/guardian's signature is an acknowledgment of receipt of the information but does not indicate that consent to participate in any particular program has been given or withheld. (Education Code 48982)

Notifications to parents/guardians shall be written both in English and in the family's primary language when so required by law. (Education Code 48981, 48985; 20 USC 6311, 6312)

Whenever an employee learns that a student's parent/guardian is, for any reason, unable to understand the district's printed notifications, the principal or designee shall work with the parent/guardian to establish other appropriate means of communication.

#### **TOBACCO**

The Governing Board recognizes the serious health risks presented by tobacco use and desires to ensure that, through adoption of consistent policies, district students are made aware of those risks and, to the extent possible, protected from them. The Superintendent or designee shall establish a coordinated school health system which includes a comprehensive behavioral health education component that teaches students the knowledge, skills, and attitudes they need in order to lead healthy lives and avoid high-risk behaviors, such as tobacco use.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide prevention, intervention, and cessation education, information, activities, and/or referrals to district students and shall ensure consistent enforcement of district policies prohibiting student possession and use of tobacco products.

#### **Prohibition Against Tobacco Use**

Students shall not possess, smoke, or use tobacco or any product containing tobacco or nicotine while on campus, while attending school-sponsored activities, or while under the supervision and control of district employees. Prohibited products include, but are not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew packets, and betel. (Education Code 48900, 48901)

Students' possession or use of electronic cigarettes, electronic hookahs, and other vapor-emitting devices, with or without nicotine content, that mimic the use of tobacco products is also prohibited.

These prohibitions do not apply to a student's possession or use of his/her own prescription products. However, student possession or use of prescription products in school shall be subject to the district's policy and regulation for addressing the administration of medications on campus. (Education Code 48900)

#### **Prevention Instruction**

The district shall provide developmentally appropriate tobacco-use prevention instruction for students at selected grade levels from K-12 pursuant to Education Code 51202. Such instruction shall be aligned with state content standards and the state curriculum framework for health education and with any requirements of state and/or federal grant programs in which the district participates.

#### **Intervention/Cessation Services**

The district may provide or refer students to counseling, intensive education, and other intervention services to assist in the cessation of tobacco use. Such intervention services shall be provided as an alternative to suspension for tobacco possession.

#### **Program Planning**

The district's tobacco-use prevention and intervention program shall be based on an assessment of tobacco-use problems in district schools and the community, an examination of existing services and activities in the community, and a determination of high-risk student populations that are most in need of district services.

**STUDENTS** 5131.62

The Superintendent or designee shall coordinate with the local health department and county office of education in program planning and implementation. He/she may establish an advisory council including students, parents/guardians, district staff, representatives of the local health department and community organizations, law enforcement professionals, and/or others with demonstrated expertise in tobacco prevention and cessation.

The Superintendent or designee also shall coordinate the district's tobacco-use prevention and intervention program with other district efforts to reduce students' use of illegal substances and to promote student wellness.

The Superintendent or designee shall select tobacco-use prevention programs based on the model program designs identified by the California Department of Education (CDE) and may adapt the model to meet district needs. (Health and Safety Code 104420)

The Superintendent or designee shall not accept for distribution any materials or advertisements that promote the use or sale of tobacco products. He/she also shall not accept tobacco-use prevention or intervention funds or materials from the tobacco industry or from any entity which is known to have received funding from the tobacco industry.

#### **Program Evaluation**

To evaluate the effectiveness of the district's program and ensure accountability, the Superintendent or designee shall biennially administer the California Healthy Kids Survey or other appropriate student survey at selected grade levels in order to assess student attitudes toward tobacco and student use of tobacco. The Board prohibits any district employee from harassing or discriminating against any other district employee or job applicant on the basis of the person's actual or perceived race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, veteran status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, or sexual orientation.

Prohibited discrimination consists of any adverse employment action, including termination or denial of promotion, job assignment, or training, based on any of the prohibited categories of discrimination listed above. Harassment consists of any unwelcome verbal, physical, or visual conduct that is based on any of the prohibited categories of discrimination listed above and that is so severe and pervasive that it adversely affects an individual's employment opportunities, has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with the individual's work performance, or creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.

The Board also prohibits retaliation against any district employee or job applicant who complains, testifies, assists, or in any way participates in the district's complaint procedures instituted pursuant to this policy.

Any district employee who engages in prohibited discrimination, harassment, or retaliation or who aids, abets, incites, compels, or coerces another to engage or attempt to engage in such behavior in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

Any employee or job applicant who believes that he/she has been or is being discriminated against or harassed in violation of district policy should, as appropriate, immediately contact his/her supervisor, the Coordinator, or the Superintendent who shall advise the employee or applicant about the district's procedures for filing, investigating, and resolving any such complaint.

Complaints regarding employment discrimination or harassment shall immediately be investigated in accordance with AR 4031 Complaints Concerning Discrimination in Employment.

#### NONDISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT

It shall be the policy of the San Dieguito Union High School District to-

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe schoolpositive work environment that allows all students where employees and job applicants are free from harassment and are assured of equal access and opportunities in the district's academic and other educational support programs, services, and activities.accordance with law. The Board prohibits, at any district schoolemployee from harassing or school activity, unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and bullying of discriminating against any student basedother district employee or job applicant on the student'sbasis of the person's—actual —or —perceived —race, —religion,—color,—national—origin,—ancestry, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, age, religion,—age,—marital or parental status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientationmedical condition, genetic information, veteran status, gender, gender identity, or gender expression or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics, sex, or sexual orientation.

This policy shall apply to all acts related to school activity or to school attendance occurring within a district school. (Education Code 234.1)

UnlawfulProhibited discrimination consists of any adverse employment action, including discriminatory harassment, intimidationtermination or denial of promotion, job assignment, or bullying, includes training, based on any of the prohibited categories of discrimination listed above. Harassment consists of any unwelcome verbal, physical, verbal, nonverbal, or writtenvisual conduct that is based on any of the categories listed above. Unlawful discrimination also shall include the creation of a hostile environment when the prohibited conduct attegories of discrimination listed above and that is so severe, persistent, or and pervasive that it affects a student's ability to participate inadversely affects an individual's employment opportunities, has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with the individual's work performance, or benefit from an educational program or activity; creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive educational environment; has the effect of substantially or unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance; or otherwise adversely affects a student's educational opportunities work environment.

Unlawful discrimination also includes disparate treatment of students based on one of the categories above with respect to the provision of opportunities to participate in school programs or activities or the provision or receipt of educational benefits or services.

The Board also prohibits any form of retaliation against any individual district employee or job applicant who files or otherwise complains, testifies, assists, or in any way participates in the filing or investigation of a complaint or report regarding an incident of discrimination. Retaliation complaints shall be investigated and resolved in the same manner as a discrimination complaint district's complaint procedures instituted pursuant to this policy.

Any district employee

<u>The Superintendent or designee shall</u> facilitate students' access to the educational program by publicizing the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures to students, parents/guardians, and

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employees. He/she shall provide training and information on the scope and use of the policy and complaint procedures and take other measures designed to increase the school community's understanding of the requirements of law related to discrimination. The Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the implementation of the district's nondiscrimination policies and practices and, as necessary, shall take action to remove any identified barrier to student access to or participation in the educational program. He/she shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.

Students who engage in unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, in violation of law, Board policy, or administrative regulation shall be subject to appropriate consequence or discipline, which may include suspension or expulsion for behavior that is severe or pervasive as defined in Education Code 48900.4. Any employee who permits or engages in prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, harassment, or retaliation or who aids, abets, incites, compels, or coerces another to engage or attempt to engage in such behavior in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

## STUDENT USE OF TECHNOLOGY

The Board of Trustees intends that technological resources provided by the district be used in a safe and responsible manner in support of the instructional program and for the advancement of student learning. All students using these resources shall receive instruction in their proper and appropriate use.

Teachers, administrators, and/or learning common technicians are expected to review the technological resources and online sites that will be used in the classroom or assigned to students in order to ensure that they are appropriate for the intended purpose and the age of the students.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify students and parents/guardians about authorized uses of district technology, user obligations and responsibilities, and consequences for unauthorized use and/or unlawful activities in accordance with this Board policy and the district's Acceptable Use Agreement.

District technology includes, but is not limited to, computers, the district's computer network including servers and wireless computer networking technology (wi-fi), the Internet, email, USB drives, wireless access points (routers), tablet computers, smartphones and smart devices, telephones, cellular telephones, personal digital assistants, pagers, MP3 players, wearable technology, any wireless communication device including emergency radios, and/or future technological innovations, whether accessed on or off site or through district-owned or personally owned equipment or devices.

Before a student is authorized to use district technology, the student and his/her parent/guardian shall sign and return the Acceptable Use Agreement. In that agreement, the parent/guardian shall agree not to hold the district or any district staff responsible for the failure of any technology protection measures or user mistakes or negligence and shall agree to indemnify and hold harmless the district and district staff for any damages or costs incurred.

Whenever a student is found to have violated Board policy or the district's Acceptable Use Agreement, the principal or designee may cancel or limit a student's user privileges or increase supervision of the student's use of the district's equipment and other technological resources, as appropriate. Inappropriate use also may result in disciplinary action and/or legal action in accordance with law and Board policy.

The Superintendent or designee, with input from students and appropriate staff, shall regularly review and update procedures to enhance the safety and security of students using district technology and to help ensure that the district adapts to changing technologies and circumstances.

## **Internet Safety**

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all district computers with Internet access have a technology protection measure that protects against access to visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography, or harmful to minors and that the operation of such measures is enforced. (20 USC 6777; 47 USC 254; 47 CFR 54.520)

# INSTRUCTION 6163.4

To reinforce these measures, the Superintendent or designee shall implement rules and procedures designed to restrict students' access to harmful or inappropriate matter on the Internet and to ensure that students do not engage in unauthorized or unlawful online activities.

Harmful matter includes matter, taken as a whole, which to the average person, applying contemporary statewide standards, appeals to the prurient interest and is matter which depicts or describes, in a patently offensive way, sexual conduct and which lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value for minors. (Penal Code 313)

The district's Acceptable Use Agreement shall establish expectations for appropriate student conduct when using the Internet or other forms of electronic communication, including, but not limited to, prohibitions against:

- 1. Accessing, posting, submitting, publishing, or displaying harmful or inappropriate matter that is threatening, obscene, disruptive, or sexually explicit, or that could be construed as harassment or disparagement of others based on their race/ethnicity, national origin, sex, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability, religion, or political beliefs
- 2. Intentionally uploading, downloading, or creating computer viruses and/or maliciously attempting to harm or destroy district equipment or materials or manipulate the data of any other user, including so-called "hacking"
- 3. Distributing personal identification information, including the name, address, telephone number, Social Security number, or other personally identifiable information, of another student, staff member, or other person with the intent to threaten, intimidate, harass, or ridicule that person

The Superintendent or designee shall provide age-appropriate instruction regarding safe and appropriate behavior on social networking sites, chat rooms, and other Internet services. Such instruction shall include, but not be limited to, the dangers of posting one's own personal identification information online, misrepresentation by online predators, how to report inappropriate or offensive content or threats, behaviors that constitute cyberbullying, and how to respond when subjected to cyberbullying.

## SCHOOL BUS CONDUCT / STUDENT SAFETY

## **BULLYING**

#### **Students**

The Governing Board recognizes the harmful effects of bullying on student learning and school attendance and desires to provide safe school environments that protect students from physical and emotional harm. District employees shall establish student safety as a high priority and shall not tolerate bullying of any student.

No individual or group shall, through physical, written, verbal, or other means, harass, sexually harass, threaten, intimidate, retaliate, cyberbully, cause bodily injury to, or commit hate violence against any student or school and personnel.

Cyberbullying includes the creation or transmission of harassing communications, direct threats, or other harmful texts, sounds, or images on the Internet, social media, or other technologies using a telephone, computer, or any wireless communication device. Cyberbullying also includes breaking into another person's electronic account and assuming that person's identity in order to damage that person's reputation.

Strategies for addressing bullying in district schools shall be developed with involvement of key stakeholders, including students, parents/guardians, and staff, and may be incorporated into the comprehensive safety plan, the local control and accountability plan, and other applicable district and school plans.

As appropriate, the Superintendent or designee may collaborate with law enforcement, courts, social services, mental health services, other agencies, and community organizations in the development and implementation of joint strategies to promote safety in schools and the community and to provide services for alleged victims and perpetrators of bullying.

#### **BULLYING PREVENTION**

To the extent possible, district schools shall focus on the prevention of bullying by establishing clear rules for student conduct and implementing strategies to promote a positive, collaborative school climate. Students shall be informed, through student handbooks and other appropriate means, of district and school rules related to bullying, mechanisms available for reporting incidents or threats, and the consequences for engaging in bullying.

As appropriate, the district shall provide students with instruction, in the classroom or other educational settings, that promotes effective communication and conflict resolution skills, social skills, character/values education, respect for cultural and individual differences, self-esteem development, assertiveness skills, and appropriate online behavior.

Staff shall receive related professional development, including information about early warning signs of harassing/intimidating behaviors and effective response.

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Based on an assessment of bullying incidents at school, the Superintendent or designee may increase supervision and security in areas where bullying most often occurs, such as classrooms, playgrounds, hallways, restrooms, and cafeterias.

#### INTERVENTION

Students are encouraged to notify school staffThe driver is held responsible for the orderly conduct of the pupils and others when they are being bullied or suspect that another student is being victimized. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall develop means for students to report threats or incidents confidentially and anonymously.

School staff who witness an act of bullying shall immediately intervene to stop the incident when it is safe to do so. (Education Code 234.1)

#### on District owned vehicles.

When appropriate based on the severity or pervasiveness of the bullying, the Superintendent or designee shall notify the parents/guardians of victims and perpetrators and may contact law enforcement.

The Superintendent, principal, or principal's designee may refer a victim, witness, perpetrator, or other student affected by an act of bullying to a school counselor, school psychologist, social worker, child welfare attendance personnel, school nurse, or other school support service personnel for case management, counseling, and/or participation in a restorative justice program as appropriate. (Education Code 48900.9)

## REPORTING AND FILING OF COMPLAINTS

Any student, parent/guardian, or other individual who believes that a student has been subjected to bullying or who has witnessed bullying may report the incident to a teacher, the principal, assistant principal, a compliance officer, or any other available school employee. Within one business day of receiving such a report, a staff member shall notify the principal of the report, whether or not a uniform complaint is filed. In addition, any school employee who observes an incident of bullying involving a student shall, within one business day, report his/her observation to the principal or a district compliance officer, whether or not the alleged victim files a complaint.

Within two business days of receiving a report of bullying, the principal shall notify the district compliance officer identified in AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures.

When the circumstances involve cyberbullying, individuals with information about the activity shall be encouraged to save and print any electronic or digital messages that they feel constitute cyberbullying and to notify a teacher, the principal, assistant principal, or other employee so that the matter may be investigated. When a student uses a social networking site or service to bully or harass another student, the Superintendent or designee may file a request with the networking site or service to suspend theto insure the safety of all students, and shall include, but not be limited to, denial of riding privileges of the student and to have the material removed.

When a report of bullying is submitted, the principal or a district compliance officer shall inform the student or parent/guardian of the right to file a formal written complaint in accordance with AR 1312.3. The student who is the alleged victim of the bullying shall be given an opportunity to describe the incident,

identify witnesses who may have relevant information, and provide other evidence of bullying.

## INVESTIGATION AND RESOLUTION OF COMPLAINTS

Any complaint of bullying shall be investigated and, if determined to be discriminatory, resolved in accordance with law and the district's uniform complaint procedures specified in AR 1312.3.

If, during the investigation, it is determined that a complaint is about nondiscriminatory bullying, the principal or designee shall inform the complainant and shall take all necessary actions to resolve the complaint.

# **DISCIPLINE**

Corrective actions for a student who commits an act of bullying of any type may include counseling, behavioral intervention and education, and, if the behavior is severe or pervasive as defined in Education Code 48900, may include suspension or expulsion in accordance with district policies and regulations.

Any employee who permits or engages in bullying or retaliation related to bullying shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

Written rules and regulations regarding conduct on District owned vehicles shall be made available to all students, parents of students, and others who use the District's transportation facilities. Students and parents/guardians of students being transported by District owned vehicles will be required to read and sign the bus transportation rules of conduct form. Students will be required to adhere to the rules of conduct.

# SCHOOL BUS CONDUCT / STUDENT SAFETY
