EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The attached report summarizes two (2) agreements:

An agreement with Pardee Homes to reimburse the District for costs associated with improvements to Pacific Trails Middle School and Canyon Crest Academy as a result of development of the Pacific Highlands Ranch Community Park.

As you will recall, on June 22, 2017, the Board approved a Right of Entry Permit authorizing Pardee Homes' contractor, T.B. Penick & Sons, Inc., a right of entry to Pacific Trails Middle School and Canyon Crest Academy, for the purpose of improving the District's property and for construction of the community park on behalf of the City of San Diego. The improvements include stairs, ramp and sidewalk continuation providing access to the park.

These improvements require inspection by a Division of State Architect (DSA) Inspector of Record, as well as a Special Inspector. Because the District is responsible for inspection of work of improvements to its property, these costs, and any similarly required costs, will be borne by the District and reimbursed by Pardee Homes.

The next agreement is with United Site Services, to provide temporary fencing to safeoff the relocatable classroom buildings at Oak Crest Middle School, during construction of the Science Classroom Quad and Site Improvements Project.

It is recommended that the Board approve and/or ratify the professional services contracts and authorize Douglas B. Gilbert, Tina Douglas, or Eric R. Dill to execute the agreements, as noted in the attached supplement.

ESTABLISHING SPECIAL TAXES FOR

2017-2018 FISCAL YEAR

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Board of Trustees has adopted ordinances authorizing the levy of a special tax within CFD 94-2, CFD 94-3, CFD 95-2, CFD 99-1, CFD 99-2, CFD 99-3, and CFD 03-1. These ordinances were adopted pursuant to the Rate and Method of Apportionment of Special Taxes approved in the elections. The Rate and Method of Apportionment of Special Taxes also require the Board to determine the amount for the alternate prepayment to be collected each year. The Lee Saylor Material/Cost of Construction Index can increase this rate for all CFD's except for CFD 99-2 and CFD 99-3 for which the Engineering News-Record Building Cost Index is used.

The 2017-2018 prepayment amounts have been established as follows:

- CFD 94-2 \$4,955.00 for a single family home and \$1,350.00 for a multi-family home.
- CFD 94-3 \$10,409.94 for a single family home and \$2,836.21 for a multifamily home.
- CFD 95-2 \$10,056.08 for a single family home and \$2,739.80 for a multifamily home.

WHEREAS, the Ordinance authorized the Board of Trustees to provide, by resolution, for the levy of the special tax in accordance with the Rate and Method; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Rate and Method, at or prior to the issuance of a building permit for an Assessor's Parcel of Residential Property, the owner of such property may elect to exempt his property from the Annual Special Tax by paying the

One-Time Special Tax then applicable to such Assessor's Parcel and upon payment of such One-Time Special Tax, such Assessor's Parcel of Residential Property shall thereafter be treated as Exempt Property. If an owner of an Assessor's Parcel of Residential Property does not elect to pay the One-Time Special Tax, then that Assessor's Parcel of Residential Property shall be subject to Annual Special Taxes and shall not be subject to the One-Time Special Tax.

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 2. The One-Time Special Tax with respect to any Assessor's Parcel shall be collected by the District at or prior to the issuance of a building permit of such Assessor's Parcel in accordance with Section C of the Rate and Method and Section C of the Ordinance.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Board of Trustees hereby ratifies any action taken prior to adoption of this resolution to collect the One-Time Special Tax with respect to Developed Property for the 2017-18 fiscal year.

<u>Section 4</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately on the date of final passage.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Board of Trustees has adopted ordinances authorizing the levy of a special tax within Community Facilities District (CFD) 94-1, CFD 94-2, CFD 94-3, CFD 95-1, CFD 95-2, CFD 99-1, CFD 99-2, CFD 99-3, and CFD 03-1. These ordinances authorized the Board of Trustees to provide, by resolution, for the levy of the special tax in accordance with the Rate and Method established. The special tax will appear on each property owner's tax bill and is to be collected by the County Assessor's Office, per arrangement.

The special tax collected by the County Assessor's Office provides for ongoing debt service payments of the San Dieguito Public Facilities Authority Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2006, CFD administrative costs, and funding of a Reserve Fund Facility for the 2006 bonds. It should be noted that without a levy these obligations would go unpaid resulting in default.

The 2016/17 year saw continued growth, though restrained, in residential housing development of 3.04% compared to 2014/15 of 5.67% and 2013/14 of 2.65%. Staff processed a total of 312 permits across 312 parcels in five of the nine CFDS. The permits represented approval to construct 312 single family residential units, of which 276 units were located in Pacific Highlands Ranch, CFD 03-1.

The year saw a transition from multi-family dwelling (MFD) development permitting to wholly single family development (SFD), as many of the previous year MFDs are still under construction. The majority of the SFD was located in in the Pacific Highlands Ranch area of CFD 99-1 and CFD 03-1.

The three most active community facilities districts for 2016/17 were:

CFD 03-1 Pacific Highlands Ranch (Alta Del Mar, Portofino, Sterling, Casabella, Artesana, Olvera, and Almeria) – 276 SFD (up from 74 SFD units the year prior) \$235,552.50,

CFD 99-1 The Elms and The Ivy, and Meadows Del Mar – 28 SFD \$23,940.00.

CFD 95-2 One Oak and 1 Channel Island – 4 SFD \$3,200.00

The additional activity will increase the total developed parcels to 9,610 parcels, and will increase the annual levy of special taxes by \$260,072.50 from \$7,817,757.50 to \$8,077,030.00 for 2016-2017.

The detail parcel information, Attachment A, to the attached resolutions is available for inspection in the Facilities Planning and Construction Department and will be filed as part of the minutes of this meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolutions levying Special Taxes within Community Facilities District No.'s 94-1, 94-2, 94-3, 95-1, 95-2, 99-1, 99-2, 99-3, and 03-1, and authorize the Auditor of San Diego County to levy taxes on all non-exempt property within each Community Facilities District.

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code Section 22037 requires the Board to advertise for bids for public projects by publishing a notice calling for bids in a newspaper of general circulation published within the District at least 14 calendar days prior to opening of bids; and,

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 35161 authorizes the Board to delegate to any officer or employee of the District any power or duty delegated to the District or the Board by law, although the Board retains responsibility over the performance of the powers or duties so delegated; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to delegate to District staff certain authority in regard to competitive bidding of and contracting and thereby create an efficient process for achieving and implementing construction of public projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board does hereby determine, resolve, and order as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Section 3.</u> The Board hereby delegates the authority and discretion to the Superintendent and the Associate Superintendent of Business Services for the District, or to their designee, to review and, as appropriate, approve change orders for construction of any public projects; subject to no such change order approved pursuant to this Section exceeding \$100,000.00 and

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code Section 20112 requires the Board to advertise for bids for public projects by publishing a notice calling for bids at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published within the District; and

WHEREAS, from time to time emergencies arise necessitating awarding of a contract without competitive bidding to permit the continuance of existing school classes or to avoid danger to life or property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22050 et. seq., (hereinafter, Emergency Contracting Procedures), the governing body, by a four-fifths vote, may delegate, by resolution or ordinance, to the appropriate county administrative officer, city manager, chief engineer, or other nonelected agency officer, the authority to order any action to repair or replace a public facility, take any directly related and immediate action required by that emergency, and procure the necessary equipment, services, and supplies for those purposes, without giving notice for bids to let contracts provided that the designee complies with the conditions set forth in the code; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to delegate to District staff certain authority in regard to contracting for emergency public works projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board does hereby determine, resolve, and order as follows:

- **Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
- <u>Section 2</u>. The Board hereby delegates the authority and discretion to the Superintendent and/or the Associate Superintendent of Business Services to award emergency contracts for public works without competitive bidding.
- <u>Section 3</u>. If the Superintendent or Associate Superintendent of Business Services orders an action pursuant to the Emergency Contracting Procedures, they shall report to the Board, at its next meeting, the reasons justifying why the emergency will not permit a delay resulting from a competitive solicitation for bids and why the action is necessary to respond to the emergency.
- <u>Section 4.</u> The Board shall initially review the emergency action not later than seven days after the action, or at its next regularly scheduled meeting if that meeting will occur not later than 14 days after the action, and at least at every regularly scheduled meeting thereafter until the action is terminated, to determine, by a four-fifths vote, that there is a need to continue the action, unless the Superintendent or Associate Superintendent of Business Services has terminated that action prior to the Board reviewing the emergency action. If the Board meets weekly, it may, after the initial review, review the emergency action in accordance with this paragraph every 14 days.

ITEM 18B

<u>Section 5</u>. When the Board reviews the emergency action, it shall terminate the action at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant so that the remainder of the emergency action may be completed by giving notice for bids to let contracts.

Establishing mutually agreed-upon goals between the Board of Trustees and Superintendent is an essential function in the governance of the District. AGREEMENT FOR GOVERNANCE CONSULTING SERVICES

THIS Agreement made and entered into by and between the CALIFORNIA SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION, a nonprofit California corporation, hereinafter referred to as "CSBA" and San Dieguito Union High School District hereinafter referred to as "District."

- 4.4 Should District default in the performance of this Agreement or materially breach any of its provisions, CSBA may terminate this Agreement by giving written notification to District.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In response to the elimination of the District Library/Media Coordinator position, the Personnel Commission established the classification of Learning Commons Technician II at its meeting on June 13, 2017. The certificated responsibilities of the District Library/Media Coordinator will now be provided through a contract with the San Diego County Office of Education; however, several administrative support functions have been identified by the District which will be divided between two Learning Commons Technician positions. The Personnel Commission has recommended a salary allocation of Range 42 on the Classified Salary Schedule for the new classification. The salary allocation is recommended based on a 5% differential for the additional duties incumbents in this classification will perform as compared to the established Learning Commons Technician (Range 40) classification as well as an internal comparison of the pay rate for other classified positions in the District performing duties similar to those that will be added to two Learning Commons Technicians' responsibilities. In addition to the establishment of the classification of Learning Commons Technician II, the Personnel Commission took action to retitle the existing Learning Commons Technician classification to Learning Commons Technician I to differentiate the two roles.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the revised Board Policy #4231 Attachment A, "Classified Salary Schedule," as shown in the attached supplement.

OVERALL JOB PURPOSE STATEMENT

Under the combined direction of an Associate Superintendent and a site administrator, the Learning Commons Technician II coordinates the work at a site Learning Commons, performs a variety of complex technical and clerical services and duties in support of the acquisition, processing, cataloging, use, maintenance, circulation and record-keeping associated with print and digital materials in the Learning Commons; assists with the operation and support of electronic media and devices, maintains library and media collections including processing and cataloging acquisitions; provides guidance and direction to assist students and teachers in utilizing learning commons resources; serves as a point of contact and liaison for information and communication between Learning Commons Technician I's, District and County Office of Education personnel and outside vendors; and performs administrative support duties to monitor usage of collections and equipment, secure orders, ensure appropriate quantity and quality of supplies and collections, and ensure accessibility to online accounts.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

This job is distinguished from similar jobs by the following characteristics: the Learning Commons Technician series is responsible for the processing of new items, and searching for appropriate resource materials to locate relevant and current information, directly assisting and guiding students and staff, and monitoring and maintaining electronic devices. Incumbents must be knowledgeable about - available resources, and appropriate materials to support educational activities such as the Internet, online databases, eBook access, various software and applications, and electronic media in order to assist students and teachers to identify and locate appropriate materials to support educational learning activities. Positions in this series function with great independence and have full responsibility for work coordination, and oversight of program functions and leadership in ensuring students and staff understand and use the collection and databases effectively to undertake research.

A Learning Commons Technician II has additional responsibilities related to serving as a primary point of contact for a group of learning commons and overseeing and performing a number of administrative support functions for those learning commons. These functions include: budget and payment monitoring and reporting; contract review and follow up including warranties; review and organization of inventories; and coordination of communication between Learning Commons Technicians and other staff members and vendors. In addition, the Learning Commons Technician II may serve as a resource to Learning Commons Technician I's for troubleshooting or best practices.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Coordinates and organizes the functions and tasks of a site Learning Commons in support of the site's overall educational program as directed by a site administrator or with guidance from other certificated personnel.
- Serves as a point of contact and liaison for information and communication between Learning Commons Technician I's and District personnel and outside vendors including: providing updates to and from vendors; working with vendors and companies to resolve problems related to a product or service; communicating technology related problems to IT staff for student accounts and contracts and subsequent solutions to Learning Commons Technicians; establishing and maintaining relationships with public library and other community agency staff; and identifying, researching and presenting potential topics for staff meetings or trainings.

- Performs administrative support duties to facilitate the operations of multiple Learning Commons including: reviewing orders and collections and monitoring the usage of collections and equipment.
- Coordinates with site administrators, department chairs and other certificated personnel to requisition educational materials designated for addition to the site's collection.
- Communicates with District personnel to exchange information, to coordinate activities, and to resolve issues or concerns related to learning commons activities, purchase orders, instructional support materials, and equipment usage.
- Supports activities which raise student and staff awareness, engagement and use of the Learning Commons resources, such as maintaining and updating the website, promoting learning opportunity programs (i.e., tutoring, student academic partnerships, etc.) and other engagement initiatives.
- Identifies/corrects minor technical problems and user operation errors to provide continuity of use.
- Provides guidance and direction to students and staff regarding available resource materials, how
 to source materials, and how to operate various equipment and electronic devices.
- Demonstrates media systems and equipment (e.g. classification system, on-line catalogs, subjectspecific web sites on the internet, care of materials, etc.) to students to educate them on the proper use of the learning commons resources.
- Directs activities of student aides and parent volunteers to orient them and monitor their adherence to learning commons procedures and tasks. Distributes various resources and materials to provide requested classroom reference materials.
- Inventories equipment and materials in learning commons collection and monitors levels to document losses and maintain availability of materials and adequate quantities for optimal operations.
- Monitors student behavior and usage of digital devices in the learning to enforce standards that contribute to the use of the facility in accordance with policies and practices.
- Performs circulation activities (e.g., item check-in and check-out, prepare circulation count, lists of overdue items) to control the use, location and availability of items in the collection.
- Prepares and maintains files, lists and records as needed.
- Assists administration or other appropriate staff with preparing reports by providing statistical and operational information.
- Assists students with assigned projects by researching availability of materials and media and providing suggestions for appropriate resources.
- Coordinates and participates in cataloging and processing library materials using appropriate software to integrate new materials into the collection. In collaboration with appropriate certificated staff, ensures that materials ordered are age appropriate, conducting research as needed.
- Ensures accuracy and currency of collection catalogs and resources to provide maximum benefit to students.
- Schedules and distributes electronic and media-related equipment and materials to ensure the
 effectiveness of media programs and services.
- Ensures repair or replacement of damaged materials and/or equipment to maintain operational readiness of the learning commons. Calculates and collects fees for lost or damaged items.

- Attends meetings and workshops and engages in other forms of professional development to increase knowledge of the field and to keep current with the evolving delivery systems that provide access to information and the resources available to students and staff.
- Performs other job-related duties as assigned.
