Why do we have district-wide "schools of choice"?

- Two "boundary schools" (LCCHS & TPHS) & two "schools of choice" (SDHSA & CCA)
- History of SDHSA
- Addition of CCA

What are SDUHSD's current policies on high school enrollment?

- Each incoming 9th grade student declares for one of our four high schools
- 10th-12th grade students declare only if they want to change schools
- Lottery conducted if number of students declaring for SDHSA/CCA exceeds capacity of the school
- Lottery is completely random selection only priority is for siblings of continuing students

California Law & School Enrollment

- Ed Code 35160.5 is the relevant code
- Districts must allow transfers among schools
- If demand exceeds capacity, must employ a random, unbiased process in which all applicants have an equal chance (lottery)
- Legally allowable exceptions to random lottery:
 - Special circumstance involving threat of bodily harm
 - Siblings of current students
 - Sons/Daughters of employees of the school
- Law doesn't allow geographic proximity as a priority

Enrollment Options for SDUHSD

- Have a mix of "schools of choice" and "boundary schools" (status quo)
- Make all high schools "boundary schools"
- Make all high schools "schools of choice"

Things to Consider re: Boundary Schools

- Long-term demographics & school capacity
- Ethnic/Racial/Socio-Econ diversity and balance
- Community Facility Districts (CFD's/Mello Roos)
- Middle School boundaries
- Program Implications schedules, duplication of programs & associated costs, etc.
- Free market competition among schools
- Cultural implications for schools

We Face Two Keys Decisions

- 1. Do we want to have district-wide "schools of choice" in our district or do we want to have all of our schools be "boundary schools"?
- 2. If we want all of our schools to be "boundary schools," what are those boundaries?

These questions need to be answered sequentially & with our entire district community.

How Do We Proceed After Tonight?
