Agenda Item 13A - BP 0450 Comprehensive Safety Plan

- 1. The title should be Comprehensive Security and Safety Plan.
 - Safety is to protect against risk.
 - Security is to protect against threats.
- 2. Unless the district starts their comprehensive plan with the following steps, there will not be an appropriate comprehensive plan. Each school is different because they were built at different times. *
 - Walk the campus perimeter and record the locations of walls, fences, gates, and fire hydrants.
 - Look at the areas around each building.
 - Calculate the safe dispersal area for each building.
 - Talk to the fire marshal.
 - Talk to the police department.
- 3. Problems are solved by defining the problems. You cannot define a problem like this unless you look at each school as a different problem. Walking the campuses is the first step.
- 4. An experienced Architect is the only one who can begin the process of a Comprehensive Security and Safety Plan after the bullet points of number 2 are completed.

Examples of types of basic things (not technology) to consider: Lock the doors. Control access to campus. Prioritize which schools need the most help. Prioritize what are the biggest needs at each school.
