



Mira Costa College Articulated Coursework FAQ's

What is an articulated high school course?

A high school course that offers the option of early college credit for high school students because it includes an agreement with a local college to ensure the course content is aligned.

How do students ensure that they receive both high school and college credit for an articulated course?

Students in articulated courses work with their high school teacher to complete the following enrollment requirements:

- Students must earn an A or B grade in high school articulated course
- Students must earn an A or B in articulated course final project or exam (This is the grade that will be transcribed on the Mira Costa College transcript).
- Students must complete the Mira Costa College Spring application and register in the CATEMA program.
- High School articulation teachers must recommend students for credit. Digital Art & Design and Advanced Digital Art & Design courses require Mira Costa College faculty recommendation for credit.

How are the course grade(s) posted on the transcript?

The student's final grade in the high school course is posted on the high school transcript. The student's final exam or project grade in the high school class is considered the credit by exam grade and is posted on the Mira Costa College transcript.

How do students request a transcript from Mira Costa College that shows my completed college level coursework?

SDUHSD students should contact [Mira Costa College Admissions and Records Office](#) to request an official transcript. Please note, students must request a transcript within 3 years of completing the course, otherwise the coursework credits will not be valid.

How do I report the community college credit on my college applications?

Please refer to the specific college application instructions. The [UC](#) and [CSU](#) (page 22) systems have specific guidance on how to report college courses taken in high school. Out of state and private schools may have different practices. Contact your high school counselor with specific questions.

How do I know which 4 year institutions the college credit will transfer to?
